



Temperatures rise in AP, Telangana amid slowdown of monsoon activity

The Telugu states Andhra Pradesh and Telangana are currently experiencing unusual weather conditions, characterised by intense heat and occasional moderate rain. Residents are suffering from heat and heat-related illnesses, as temperatures—having recently dipped due to rain—are on the rise once more. Meteorological officials attribute the increase in temperatures, notably exceeding 40 degrees Celsius in many areas, to a slowdown in the monsoon and the impact of the Rohini Karte phenomenon. The Amaravati Meteorological Centre has warned that temperatures may reach highs of 41 degrees Celsius across several districts on Thursday. It is anticipated that maximum temperatures in Andhra Pradesh could increase by 2 to 3 degrees over the next two days. In particular, districts such as Vizianagaram, Alluri Sitarama Raju, Kakinada, East Godavari, West Godavari, Eluru, and Krishna are expected to experience sweltering conditions, with maximum readings between 40 and 41 degrees Celsius. Meanwhile, light to moderate rainfall is forecast for Bapatla and Palnadu districts. On Wednesday, Jangameswarapur recorded the highest temperature at 41 degrees Celsius, with Narsapur close behind at 40.9 degrees. Other notable readings included Kavali and Nellore at 39.6 degrees, Tuni and Gannavaram at 39.4 degrees, Nandyal at 39 degrees, YSR Kadapa at 38.2 degrees, and Tirupati at 38 degrees each. In Telangana, conditions are similarly warm, as reported by the Hyderabad Meteorological Centre. The state is experiencing rising temperatures due to the slow progression of the southwest monsoon. Light rain with gusty winds up to 30 to 40 kilometres per hour is expected in some districts on Thursday and Friday. The forecast indicates that maximum temperatures could reach 38 degrees Celsius in Nalgonda and Bhadrachalam, while a minimum of 34 degrees is projected for Mahabubnagar.



CM Naidu, Pawan Kalyan launch one crore plantation in a day programme

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan launched 'Vana Mahotsav' to plant one crore saplings across the state on World Environment Day on Thursday. They, along with Municipal Administration Minister P. Narayana, planted the saplings at ADCL Park in the state capital, Amaravati. The leaders visited the stalls arranged by the Pollution Control Board (PCB) on environmental protection. PCB Chairman Krishnaiah explained to the Chief Minister the steps being taken for plastic recycling. The Chief Minister directed officials to formulate a special policy on recycling. He asked them to give him a report on this every 15 days. Earlier, Chandrababu Naidu, in his post on 'X' said that nature is not the property of anyone. "Everyone is responsible for protecting the environment. It is our duty to protect forests and water resources. That is



why the government has taken up a large-scale tree planting programme. On the occasion of World Environment Day, today, we are requesting everyone to participate in the programme of planting one crore trees in one day," CM Naidu said. "This year, the theme of World Environment Day is plastic pollution eradication. Let us do our part to reduce plastic pollution. Let us take a pledge to protect the environment," he added. Pawan Kalyan, who is also the Minister for Forest and Environment, stated that a clean and healthy environment is the greatest

gift we can offer future generations. "Let us act responsibly and take up the duty of environmental protection. Let's plant saplings, prevent water pollution, and work towards the conservation of wildlife," Pawan Kalyan said. Meanwhile, the Forest Department said that Andhra Pradesh currently has 29 per cent land under green (tree) cover. The state government has set a target of increasing this to 50 per cent by 2047 by greening various types of land available with the farmers, the Revenue Department, institutional lands, lands along roadside, railway

lines and canals. Out of the total geographical area of 1,62,923 square kilometres in the state, 48,978 square kilometres has green cover. Green cover is planned over an additional area of 32,483 square kilometres. According to the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, this year World Environment Day is being celebrated with two themes - "Vana Mahotsav" programme and 'End plastic pollution' to achieve the goal of a 'Swachh Andhra Pradesh'. A record one crore seedlings will be planted by various departments and other stakeholders across the state in a single day on Thursday. During the 2025 planting season, the Forest Department, Rural Development, Pollution Control Board, Horticulture Departments and others have set a target of planting 5.58 crore saplings over approximately 1.8 lakh hectares in all districts across the state.

PM Modi launches 'Aravali Green Wall' project by planting sapling under Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam initiative

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday launched the 'Aravali Green Wall' project, a special drive aimed at reforesting the Aravali range, one of the biggest forest covers, spanning four states -- Gujarat, Rajasthan, Haryana and Delhi. To mark World Environment Day, he also planted a sapling at the Bhagwan Mahavir Vanasthali Park in the national capital under the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' initiative. He shared pictures of the special tree plantation drive and wrote, "Today, on World Environment Day, we strengthened the Ek Ped Maa ke Naam initiative with a special tree plantation drive." "This is also a part of our effort to reforest the Aravalli range - the Aravalli Green Wall project," he added. The Aravalli Green Wall Project is an ambitious project aimed at reforesting the 700 kilometres of the Aravalli range. The Aravalli range, stretching across four states, has seen environmental



degradation in the past few decades. The new push under the Aravalli Green Wall Project will create a green zone from Delhi to Gujarat, to act as a "natural barrier against deserti-

fication" and will also aid in groundwater recharge. A "Our focus is to rejuvenate areas linked with this range. We are going to work with the respective local administrations and

going to emphasise things such as improving water systems, curbing dust storms, stopping eastward expansion of the Thar desert and more," PM Modi further said. The project will go beyond conventional methods and encourage new techniques in urban as well as semi-urban areas to address space constraint problems. "Plantation activities will be geo-tagged and monitored on the Meri LiFE portal. I call upon the youth of our nation to take part in this movement and add to our planet's green cover," PM Modi said. As part of the major drive, one thousand permanent nurseries will be set up to revive the country's oldest mountain range. Technologies like satellite mapping will also be deployed to facilitate speed and transparency in the project. Notably, the Aravalli range is home to 22 wildlife sanctuaries and four tiger reserves, namely Ranthambore, Sariska, Ramgarh-Vishdhari, and Mukunda Hills.

Pawan Kalyan Sets Ambitious Goal for Environmental Protection



In a recent address, Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan announced his ambitious goal of planting one crore saplings and ensuring their protection. He underscored the critical role that nature plays in human life and expressed his determination to prevent forest fires and safeguard the environment. During a Vanamahotsavam event held at ADCL Park in Ananthavaram to commemorate World Environment Day, Pawan Kalyan highlighted how historically, trees and plants once served as landmarks in addressing homes—a practice that has diminished over time. He stressed the importance of a Chief Minister who prioritises love for nature. The event was attended by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, along with Pawan Kalyan, ministers, and other public officials. Together, they planted copper and neem saplings in Ananthavaram Park. CM Naidu urged public representatives and officials to join in the initiative to plant one crore saplings, emphasizing the need for collective action towards environmental conservation. On this occasion, all attendees took an oath to commit themselves to protecting the environment.

TTD Announces Divya Darshan Tokens to be Released at Bhudevi Complex

The Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) has announced that the Bhudevi Complex, located near Alipiri, will begin issuing tokens for devotees walking along the Srivari Mettu route. Tokens will be made available from 5 pm on the 6th of this month. Previously, devotees would collect tokens near the first step of the route and scan them at the 1,200th step, which proved to be cumbersome. In response to these challenges, officials have decided to set up permanent counters at Srinivasa

Mangapuram to facilitate the issuance of Divya Darshan tokens. Until those counters are operational, tokens will continue to be issued at the Bhudevi Complex. The complex will feature a total of 10 counters, comprising 4 for Divya Darshan tokens and 6 for timed Sarva Darshan tokens. Devotees will initially be allowed into the sheds at the Balaji Bus Stand premises and will be organised into queue lines to streamline the token collection process.

Town Planning Officials Turn a Blind Eye to Illegal Constructions with the Backing of the Planning Secretary

**Locals Outraged, Urge
Officials to Snap Out of
Their Stupor**

Visakhapatnam... GVMC Zone 5, 44th Ward, Nandagiri Nagar, Akkayapalem has become a hotspot for illegal constructions. Locals lament that the skyrocketing land prices have turned into a curse for the residents of the area. Taking advantage of the situation, GVMC and Town Planning officials are allowing illegal developments to continue unchecked. Unauthorized constructions are rising rapidly, reaching for the skies. Under the pretext of adding extra floors, unscrupulous builders are putting up structures like



a stack of cards. The very officials who are supposed to stop such illegal activity — GVMC and Town Planning authorities — are allegedly watching silently, say frustrated residents. Despite lodging complaints, no action has been taken. Residents openly allege that GVMC and Planning officials are acting as a protective shield for these illegal constructions. In a place that lacks even basic infrastructure, people are questioning how additional multi-storey buildings can be permitted. They express grave concerns, warning that in case of a fire or any other emergency, the loss of human life could be inevitable due to these unregulated constructions.



As the global passenger footfall touches an enormous growth of nine per cent with 10 billion passengers and 100 million aircraft movements in 2024, let us understand its environmental impact. Due to its speed and altitude, aircrafts require more power and energy than other modes of transport. Therefore, the aviation industry faces critical challenge of balancing growth with sustainability. The global aviation industry emitted 882 mmt of CO2 last year. Because of the height at which the emissions are released, the effect of these emissions on environment is high. Aircraft emit not only CO2 but also other emissions-nitrogen oxide and water vapour, which have greater effect. Aviation CO2 emissions should be multiplied by 1.9 times to consider added impact of other gasses. An inter-governmental panel on Climate Change estimated that aviation accounts for three per cent of the total climate impact. Though growth is desirable, high carbon footprint is unacceptable. Towards this, the

Eco-friendly aviation is the order of the day

International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) has set up core sustainability goals among global aircraft manufacturers, airlines, airports, aviation fuel manufacturers and national regulators to ensure eco-friendly aviation. Key initiatives of ICAO: CO2 emissions standard set by ICAO in 2016 applies to all new aircraft designs from 2020 and newly-built existing models from 2023. It emphasised the value of a globally harmonised approach to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and climate change around airports, by-state action plans; sustainable alternative fuels, market-based measures; and global aspirational goals to ensure the long-term sustainability of aviation. The ICAO is actively working towards sustainable aviation through various initiatives: Global coalition for sustainable aviation: This enables development of new ideas, accelerate implementation of innovative solutions and raise awareness about eco-friendly aviation. Global framework for sustainable aviation fuels: This is a collective aspiration for a five per cent reduction in aviation CO2 emissions by 2030. SAF has the greatest potential to reduce CO2 emissions from aviation. Carbon offsetting: CORSIA is a market-based scheme that aims to cap net aviation emissions at 2020 levels through 2035. Operational and technological improvements: ICAO encourages

airlines and manufacturers to adopt technologies that reduce emissions, optimize flight operations, and implement best practices to minimise fuel consumption. Non-CO2 impact mitigation: ICAO addresses non-CO2 impacts of aviation such as noise pollution and the use of other greenhouse gases by developing standards and guidance. Finvest hub: ICAO has established a global platform to facilitate dedicated pathways for funding SAF production, clean energy infrastructure, and other aviation decarbonization initiatives. Long-term global aspirational goal (LTAG): This outlines a long-term aspirational goal for the aviation industry to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2050. Aircraft manufacturers are using cutting edge light-weight materials such as carbon composites to build aircraft and components. Recent technological improvements like wing tip devices increase aerodynamic efficiency and reduce fuel usage. New generation aircraft are 20 per cent more fuel efficient as they produce 80 per cent less CO2 per seat than the first jets in the 1950s. Electric aircraft: The research towards eVTOL (Electric Vertical Take-off and Landing) aircraft is another encouraging factor towards this direction. eVTOL promises quick urban mobility without heavy investment on land and airport terminals. DGCA India has already issued

guidelines in this regard. As battery technology develops, increased energy storage may make electrically-powered commercial flight a reality. Sustainable aviation fuel (SAF): This is a biofuel produced from renewable sources like agricultural waste or used cooking oil and can be used in blends with traditional jet fuel, or in some cases, even one hundred per cent SAF. However, using biofuels in aircraft faces limitations related to production costs, feedstock availability, and compatibility with existing engine infrastructure. While biofuels offer potential for reduced emissions, their higher production costs and the need for significant upgrades to meet jet fuel specifications hinder widespread adoption. Additionally, biofuel production may have environmental drawbacks, including land and water resource requirements, and potential for increased GHG emissions. Hybrid technology: There is also a lot of research into hybrid options — combining the performance of liquid sustainable aviation fuel with the electric propulsion. Conclusion: Aviation has been successful in achieving far lower emissions growth than the industry's growth. While air traffic is increasing at an average of nine per cent annually, the growth of CO2 emissions is now lower at around only three per cent. PM Modi flags off electric buses for clean and green Delhi



Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday flagged off 200 electric buses in the national capital, reinforcing the Centre as well as the city government's focus and resolve on building a cleaner and greener Delhi. PM Modi also took to X to share pictures of giving the green signal to the fleet of electric buses, and captioned it, "Building a clean and green Delhi". In the pictures, the Prime Minister can be seen flanked by Delhi Lieutenant Governor V.K. Saxena and Chief Minister Rekha Gupta. PM Modi further wrote on X, "Flagged off Electric Buses under an initiative of the Delhi Government aimed at boosting sustainable development and clean urban mobility. Additionally, this will also improve 'Ease of Living' for the people of Delhi." The move comes after the newly elected BJP government, under CM Rekha Gupta, is taking steps to severely curtail air pollution in the city and mark a shift towards 100 per cent electrification of the public transport system. The roll-out of 200 more electric buses by the Prime Minister coincides with World Environment Day. Earlier in the day, PM Modi also called upon the citizens to deepen their efforts towards safeguarding the planet from the challenges of the new era. "This World Environment Day, let's deepen our efforts towards protecting our planet and overcoming the challenges we face. I also compliment all those working at the grassroots to make our environment greener and better," he posted on his social media account. He also planted a Sindoor sapling at his official residence at 7, Lok Kalyan Marg. Last month, CM Rekha Gupta flagged off over 400 new Electric buses under the Delhi Electric Vehicle Initiative (DEVI) scheme, spotlighting her government's goal of building a cleaner and sustainable public transport system. Addressing the public after the event, she described it as one of the key priority areas of 'triple engine government' and announced that more than 2000 electric buses would be added to the fleet of the city's e-buses by this year's end.

Chandrababu Naidu Champions Recycling and Green Initiatives on World Environment Day

In a significant move to enhance environmental sustainability, Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has directed top officials to formulate a special policy on recycling. Additionally, he called for the establishment of exhibitions on recycling across three areas, along with awareness campaigns for college students utilizing mobile units. At the event, CM Naidu and Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan explored stalls set up by the Pollution Control Board that high-



lighted various aspects of environmental protection. The occasion was also attended by Minister Narayana and several other ministers and senior officials. In line with these green initiatives, the coalition government is dedicated to developing the Amaravati capital to international standards, aiming for 30 percent of the area to be designated as blue and green spaces. The administration is taking proactive measures to ensure future temperatures are maintained at least 2 to 3 degrees lower, drawing on successful plantation strategies from countries like Singapore and Japan.

"It's very unfortunate that 11 people lost their stadium crowd control This tragedy shouldn't occur. It could have been avoided. It was a celebration in Ahmedabad on a Tuesday night. Why was there a rush having celebrations on the streets of Bengaluru?" Madan Lal said to the news agency PTI.
