



Solar power for all govt offices: Minister

Eluru: Minister for Agriculture Kinjarapu Atchannaaidu said that all government offices in the state will be provided with solar power. He inaugurated a 50-kilowatt solar rooftop system installed at a cost of Rs 35 lakh at the local agricultural market committee yard on Wednesday. Speaking on the occasion, he said that the state government is promoting solar power. He said that solar power is being installed free of cost for scheduled castes and tribes and additional subsidy is being provided to the backward classes. He said that each legislator has set a target to provide solar power to 10,000 houses in



his constituency. The minister said that solar panels will be installed in the offices of agricultural and allied departments, market committees and farmers' markets in a phased manner. He said that Eluru market yard is a big market yard like the Mirchi yard in Guntur and it receives a lemon crop in abundance. He said that the solar power installed at the Eluru market yard at a cost of Rs 35 lakh will save up to Rs 60,000 every month in electricity. Based on this calculation, the investment in solar power will be recovered in 2-3 years, and therefore, the minister appealed to all the people to install

solar power in their homes. GHMC, HYDRAA join hands to combat waterlogging



Hyderabad: In preparation for the monsoon season, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC), in collaboration with the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Protection Agency (HYDRAA), has intensified efforts to prevent urban flooding and deployed emergency teams across the city. A total of 130 monsoon emergency teams, each comprising 12 personnel, are being deployed under GHMC's jurisdiction. Additionally, 51 Disaster Response Force (DRF) teams from HYDRAA, each with 15 members, will be deployed to support these units. During a review meeting held at the Municipal Secretary's office on Wednesday, officials reiterated that the main objective is to ensure the public faces no inconvenience during the rainy season, with both HYDRAA and GHMC working to minimise flood risks. In this initiative, teams from both GHMC and HYDRAA will operate under the direct supervision of HYDRAA authorities to ensure a prompt response during waterlogging incidents. These teams will be deployed in flood-prone areas and will spring into action whenever water stagnation is reported, particularly in residential areas, with their collaborative efforts aimed at facilitating smooth traffic flow and mitigating the risk of flooding. While GHMC will take charge of removing silt and debris from sewers, HYDRAA will offer logistics and manpower assistance as needed. The responsibility for managing the operations of monsoon emergency teams now lies with HYDRAA.

Two die, one in critical condition after a gas leak at Pharma City, Parawada



Anaparthi: In a tragic accident that took place at Jawaharlal Nehru Pharmacy, Parawada in Anaparthi, two died and one is said to be in critical condition following a gas leak at Sai Sreyas Pharmaceuticals Private Limited. At the time of incident three employees became unconscious after inhaling the gas. The deceased were identified as Parimi Chandrasekhar, safety manager from Telangana, and Saragadam Kumar, safety officer from Munagapaka. Meanwhile, another worker Baidu Baisal, a helper from Odisha, is undergoing treatment in the hospital. The bodies of the deceased were shifted to King George Hospital mortuary. Meanwhile, trade union leaders alleged that the management failed in following safety standards and demanded a compensation of Rs.1 crore for the families of the deceased. (eom)

Profession is Teaching, Instinct Blood donation. she said that Donated blood 31 times. Blood is a living fluid that flows throughout the body. The body is healthy only if the blood is healthy. The body's immune system is good only if the nutrients in the blood are in the right quantity. If there is a deficiency of nutrients in the blood, a situation arises that makes one susceptible to diseases. If there is excessive bleeding due to injuries, surgeries, or any other reason, if the body does not replace the lost blood, life cannot be saved. Blood provides the oxygen and other nutrients required by the living cells in the body. Blood is also the one that removes the waste released as a result of metabolism from the living cells and cleans them. said If we can give them blood at the right time, we can save their precious lives. Not only in accidents, but also in emergency surgeries, difficult deliveries, and in serious illnesses such as anaemia and thalassemia, the need for blood is high. There is no substitute for



blood. Blood cannot be manufactured artificially. Therefore, the blood we donate becomes a life donation for them.

There is no difference between men and women in blood donation. Both are eligible for blood donation. Another factor related to nature in women also leads to anaemia. Blood loss during menstruation in women also leads to anaemia. Also, women lose up to 500 ml of blood during childbirth. Despite such reasons, many countries of the world have proven that women as well as men have the opportunity to participate in the blood donation movement equally.

Dr. Pudota Lilly Mary, Principal, Government Nursing College, Kodangal from Kukatpally, Hyderabad is performing her duties at the Government Nursing College, Kodangal and is also involved in various voluntary service programs. Lilly Mary is a professional

teacher and a blood donor. She has donated blood 31 times voluntarily from 1994 to date. When she was working in a government hospital, pregnant women who were suffering from anaemia and labour pains would die due to the lack of blood donors. That incident deeply moved Lilly Mary. This incident, which had been strongly ingrained in her at a young age that those in need needed blood, inspired her to donate blood. She first donated blood voluntarily at the Gandhi Government General Hospital in 1994 and has not stopped her service program till date. There are occasions when she donates blood twice a year. She said that she has donated blood more often at government blood banks. However, Dr. Lilly Mary says that she is proud to receive blessings from those who donate blood to those in need. As part of this, in order to avoid the shortage of blood needed by patients, she organizes voluntary blood donation camps in colleges, youth organizations, as well as in government and private offices, in collaboration with the Red Cross Blood Bank and government blood banks. Apart from donating blood with them, there are many benefits of donating blood. Every time we donate blood, we save the lives of three vic-

times. Donating blood regularly reduces the risk of cancer. Donating blood at least once a year can reduce the risk of heart attack by 88%. High iron content in the blood can clog blood vessels and increase the risk of heart attack. Donating blood reduces these iron stores. This makes the liver healthy. The bone marrow produces new red blood cells. Donating blood once reduces 650 kilocalories. This process helps control body weight. Along with health, there is mental happiness. It gives priceless satisfaction. Therefore, we urge everyone who is healthy to donate blood voluntarily. Red blood cells decrease even if you do not donate blood. The average life span of red blood cells (RBC) is 110 to 112 days. After this period, they are destroyed in the body. New ones are added in their place. This process continues in every human being in this order as long as there is life. So even if you do not donate blood, red blood cells are destroyed. So it is better to donate blood. Rather than letting them die naturally in our body, donate blood and become life donors. On the occasion of World Blood Donor she will receive the Voluntary Blood Donor Award from the hands of State Governor Vishnu Dev Verma at Raj Bhavan said.

Karun Nair 'excited to grab the opportunity with both hands' on England tour

New Delhi: India batter Karun Nair, who is making his comeback to the red-ball team after a hiatus of eight years, is excited to make the most of the opportunity in the upcoming five-match Test series against England starting on June 20. Nair has been in phenomenal form and struck a double ton against the England Lions in the first unofficial Test at Canterbury. In the recently concluded IPL 2025 season, he played eight matches for Delhi Capitals and amassed 198 runs, including a half-century. The 33-year-old made his Test debut against England in Mohali in 2016 and he went on to hit an unbeaten 303 in his third Test in Chennai and grabbed eyeballs. However, after that historic knock, he only played three home Tests against Australia in 2017 before being dropped from the team due to a series of low scores. The right-handed batter never lost hope of making a comeback into the Indian team. After switching his



base from Karnataka to Vidarbha in 2023, he scored 690 runs in 10 games and followed it with 863 runs in nine Ranji Trophy games in 2024 with four centuries, including one in the finals, which carved the way for Vidarbha to lift the trophy. Nair also showed signs of power-hitting in the Vijay Hazare Trophy, amassing 779 runs in just eight

innings, including five centuries, which prompted the Delhi Capitals to pick him in the 2024 IPL mega auction for Rs 50 lakh. "Feels really special, very grateful and very fortunate to be able to get this opportunity again and really looking forward and excited to grab this opportunity with both hands," Nair said in a video posted by BCCI on social media.

"Not sure actually, I've to experience that feeling myself and just go out there and feel it for myself. I'm sure there will be a lot of feelings, ones that I can't express right now and it will be a special feeling," he added. In the pre-training huddle, head coach Gautam Gambhir praised Nair's comeback to the Test side after eight years and said, "Comebacks are never easy. Someone who has made a comeback after seven [eight] years had a phenomenal last year. Last year, no matter the runs you have got and most importantly, that never-die attitude, never-giving-up attitude, that is something which has got you back into the team. That is something which is inspiring for this entire world. Welcome, Karun." With the Test retirements of stalwarts Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli, it is likely that Nair will get a chance in the middle order because of his County experience with Northamptonshire, where he

scored 487 runs in seven games at an average of 48.70, including a double century. Nair's former Karnataka teammate and experienced batter KL Rahul was elated with the return of him to the Indian setup. "I've known him for a very long time and the months that he spent here in the UK playing cricket and how hard and how lonely it was. For him, to be able to do all of that and comeback to the Indian team is special for him, his family and friends like us who've seen his journey. So, like I said, very inspiring as well, and hopefully, his experience and learnings from playing county cricket here will hold him in good stead when he plays the Test matches here," Rahul said in a video. India's all-important Test series against England runs from June 20 to August 4, with Headingley, Edgbaston, Lord's, Old Trafford and The Oval being the venues. India are aiming to win a Test series in England for the first time since 2007.
