



CM Chandrababu directs MLAs and MPs to be accessibility to people



In a recent meeting held at the TDP central office in Mangalagiri, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister and TDP chief Chandrababu Naidu strongly condemned the state of affairs in the past government. Chief Minister reiterated the importance of communicating the party's achievements to the electorate, reiterating their mission to take the state from destruction to development.

Stampede during Jagannath Rath Yatra in Odisha's Puri, three killed

New Delhi: At least three people, including two women, died and 10 others were injured in a stampede during the Rath Yatra in Odisha's Puri.

The incident occurred around 4.30 a.m. when the three Raths carrying idols of Lord Jagannath, Lord Balabhadra and Goddess Shubhadra were near Shree Gundicha Temple, about three kilometres from Jagannath Temple.

As per reports, the holy chariots were at the Gundicha temple, and a large crowd had gathered for a darshan. As the crowd swelled, some people fell and a stampede began. Three people died on the spot.

These include two women, Prabhati Das and Basanti Sahu, and 70-year-old Premakant Mohanty. All three, it is learnt, are from Khurda district and had come to Puri for the Rath Yatra. The condition of some of those injured is critical, according to reports.

More details were awaited. The chariots were scheduled to reach the Gundicha temple by the evening of Friday. But they had to be



stopped on Grand Road as Lord Balabhadra's Taladhwa chariot got stuck while negotiating a turn, preventing the other two from advancing. While most rituals, including the Pahandi of the deities, were completed largely on schedule as per the Jagannath Temple Administration's plans, the pulling of the chariots was significantly delayed, leading to discontent among the gathered devotees. The chariots of Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra -- Taladhwa and Darpadalana --

stopped midway, while Nandighosha, the chariot of Lord Jagannath, moved only a short distance from the Lion Gate (Singhadwar) before halting. Responding to media queries on the delay, Law Minister Prithviraj Harichandan on Friday had said the pulling of the chariots began at 4 p.m. after all rituals were completed as scheduled. However, issues at key turning points on the Bada Danda (Grand Road), combined with an unexpectedly massive turnout of devotees --

reportedly 1.5 times higher than in previous years -- led to the disruption. "Favourable weather conditions contributed to the higher turnout this year, which made crowd control more challenging," he said. During Rath Yatra, three grand chariots with the idols of Lord Jagannath, Lord Balabhadra and Goddess Shubhadra are drawn by a massive crowd of devotees. The holy chariots are taken to the Gundicha Temple. The three deities spend a week there before returning to the Jagannath Temple.

Weather report: Heavy rain alert issued to Andhra Pradesh and Telangana

Heavy rainfall has been reported across the Telugu states, leading to rising water levels in various streams. In Andhra Pradesh and Yanam, southwesterly and westerly winds are affecting the weather patterns. The forecast for the next three days indicates light to moderate rain or thundershowers in North Coast Andhra Pradesh and Yanam, with gusty winds reaching speeds of 40-50 km/h. Similar weather conditions are expected in the South Coast, albeit with slightly reduced wind speeds of 30-40 km/h. In Rayalaseema, light to moderate rains are also anticipated, accompanied by strong winds up to 50 km/h. In Telangana, the persistent rains have caused significant flooding, particularly in the joint Adilabad district. The Tarnam Vagu in Boraj mandal is overflowing, leading to traffic disruptions towards Jainath and Bela, where a temporary bridge has been submerged. The Chikman Vagu is similarly swollen in Sirikonda mandal. Flood waters have affected the Gaddenna Vagu project in Nirmal, while farmers are optimistic that the rains will benefit their cotton and soy crops. However, the incessant downpour in Khammam district has halted coal production, with an estimated 18,000 tonnes disrupted.

reviewing the work there. On the Gangotri National Highway, roads blocked at Lang, Dhang, Naluna, and Dabrani have been opened for traffic. Adequate arrangements for food and water have been made for the passengers and rescue teams. Meanwhile, Vikram Singh, Director, Dehradun weather office has said that heavy to very heavy rainfall is likely to take place in several districts in Uttarakhand for next two days. "A red alert has been issued for Rudrapur, Uttarkashi, Dehradun, Tehri, Pauri, Nainital, Champawat, Haridwar and Uddham Singh Nagar. For other districts, an orange alert has been issued for two days, beginning Sunday," he said. Singh cautioned people residing near water bodies and urged them to move to a safer place. "Even on August 1 and 2, heavy to very heavy rain has been predicted in the state," he said. As rivers swell dangerously close to banks, the administration has issued a fresh advisory urging people living near riverbanks to remain alert and take all necessary precautions.

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The Silent Architect: A Tribute to Bharat Ratna P.V. Narasimha Rao

In the soft cradle of Laknepally, where fields breathe the rhythm of seasons, A boy was born to Ranga Rao and Rukmini Amma, Not amidst cannon fire or ceremonial feasts But in the quiet rustle of leaves, in the stillness that conceals destiny.

From that soil, rich with Dharma and discipline, He rose like a banyan sapling, slow and unwavering, Sheltered by the Sky of knowledge, Rooted in ancient truths.

A seeker in the garb of a student, He mastered not one, but seventeen tongues, Each language a doorway, each script a friend He conversed with the Vedas, debated with the West, Translated silence into statesmanship.

The boy who once ran barefoot on Telangana paths, Would one day walk the marble halls of power With the Grace of a scholar and the silence of a sage. He did not arrive as a storm, He became one. He was born not just to read history, But to rewrite it.

The 90's Kaanta Laga girl Shefali Jariwala passes away



Actor-model Shefali Jariwala, best remembered for her iconic role in the early 2000s music video Kaanta Laga, passed away at the age of 42 on Friday in Mumbai. Known affectionately by fans as the "Kaanta Laga Girl," Shefali's sudden demise has left the entertainment world in shock. She was reportedly found unresponsive at her Andheri residence. According to Mumbai Police, they received a call around 1 am. She was rushed to Bellevue Multispecialty Hospital by her husband, actor Parag Tyagi, and a few others, where she was declared dead. The cause of death has not yet been confirmed, and her body has been sent to Cooper Hospital for a post-mortem. Shefali gained nationwide fame with Kaanta Laga, a remix track that turned her into a household name. She later appeared in the Salman Khan starrer Mujhse Shaadi Karogi and made waves with her stint on Bigg Boss 13, where her past relationship with the late actor Sidharth Shukla drew public interest. In her personal life, Shefali was previously married to Harmeet Singh of the musical duo Meet Brothers, but the couple separated in 2009. In 2015, she tied the knot with Parag Tyagi. As news of her death spread, tributes poured in from across the entertainment industry. Singer Mika Singh posted, "Still can't believe it... You will always be remembered for your grace, smile, and spirit. Om Shanti." Other celebrities including Kamyra Panjabi, Aly Goni, Rajiv Adatia, and Tehseen Poonawalla expressed their grief online. Actor Divyanka Tripathi called the news "unbelievable" and sent condolences to the family. Tehseen Poonawalla, recalling their time on Bigg Boss, reflected: "Incredible how Sidharth Shukla and now she, from my season, are no more." Anderson-Tendulkar Trophy: India's lower order working on batting skills, says Prasidh after twin collapses in Leeds

Birmingham: In the wake of double batting collapses that prevented India from taking a tighter grip on the first Test against England, fast bowler Prasidh Krishna stated that the lower-order batters are diligently honing their skills in net sessions and trusting their skills to stay at the crease for a longer period. At Headingley, India lost their last seven wickets for 41 runs in the first innings and then went on to lose their last six wickets for 31 runs in the second innings, which meant that despite having five centuries in their kitty, the visitors still couldn't prevent themselves from suffering a five-wicket loss to England in the five-match Anderson-Tendulkar Trophy series. "As the lower-order batsmen, we are definitely working on (our batting). If you look at our net sessions, we are putting in the work. I think it is about putting your mind in there as well. Make sure you trust yourself, trust the skill that you have, and be there at the crease for a little longer. Then the numbers and the runs are going to show, and we are working towards it," Prasidh told reporters in Birmingham on Saturday. The ongoing series against



England is Shubman Gill's first assignment as India's Test captain after Rohit Sharma's retirement. Prasidh, who has already played under Gill at Gujarat Titans (GT) in the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025, spoke about how Gill fared as Test captain in Leeds. "About Shubman, I think he did a pretty good job. All of us saw how he rotated the bowlers, made

sure everybody had enough breaks, and brought in the right kind of bowlers at the right kind of spells whenever he saw an opportunity. Knowing him, he set a very good atmosphere around him. He's been speaking to all of us. We always go in with a plan, and the communication is happening there," he added. Prasidh, who had an expensive outing with the ball at Headingley, explained how the wind and occasional drizzle also posed challenges to the Indian bowling line-up. "You are trying to run in hard. The wind sometimes is on and off. So, it is very important to understand what the pace of the run-up is. I did have a chat with a couple of other guys as well - asking them what they did to be at the right pace when they are running in to bowl." "So, that is about it. I think the best that we can do is bowl on the square every time we get to the ground. Be a little more aware of what you can do, what way the wind is, and how balanced you can be at the point of delivery." "The rain and drizzle definitely didn't help. Then (Joe) Root came on to bat, and the ball was moving around, and then there was drizzle all around. Every

time the ball goes on the ground, the ball becomes wet. When the ball becomes wet, you know what is going to happen - it is going to get softer, the shine is not going to be around." "So, I think that did play a part. But I think all of that I have heard playing in England is, look up, if there are clouds, there is going to be swing. If there is sun, there is not going to be (much) swing. So, that is what we are looking to do, and make sure we bowl the right areas." "The gripping, I wouldn't say it was a problem, it just got softer, and the moment it got softer, the seam got softer, the amount of purchase you get from the pitch differs. So, that is what happened," he said. Prasidh signed off by saying it was always nice to have fellow Bengaluru people, KL Rahul and Karun Nair, in the Indian team. "I know all these guys in the team are very good mates of mine, and I have known them for a few years. But then, when you look at Karun and KL, I have known both of them for quite a long time and ended up having a lot of time together off cricket as well. So, it is definitely nice to have the Bangalore boys around."
