



PM Modi to visit Varanasi, launch development projects worth Rs 2,200 crore

New Delhi: In a significant push towards development in his parliamentary constituency, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to visit Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, on Saturday to inaugurate and lay the foundation stone for a wide range of development projects worth approximately Rs 2,200 crore. During his visit, PM Modi will address a public gathering at around 11 a.m. and will release the 20th instalment of the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) scheme. Under this instalment, more than Rs 20,500 crore will be directly transferred to the bank accounts of over 9.7 crore farmers across the country, reaffirming the government's continued support for India's agricultural community. As part of the efforts to strengthen



en connectivity, the Prime Minister will inaugurate the widening and strengthening of key roads, including the Varanasi-Bhadohi road and the Chhitauni-Shool Tankeshwar road. He will also inaugurate a railway overbridge at Hardattpur, which is expected to alleviate congestion on the heavily used Mohan Sarai-Adalpura route. In addition, PM Modi will lay the foundation stone for

several new infrastructure projects including road upgrades in Dalmandi, Lahartara -Kotwa, Gangapur, and Babatpur. New railway overbridges at Level Crossing 22C and Khalispur Yard are also planned to further enhance local transportation facilities. Focusing on improving the city's power infrastructure, the Prime Minister will also launch electricity projects worth over Rs 880 crore. These

include the Smart Distribution Project and the undergrounding of overhead electrical cables, which aim to modernise and secure the city's power supply system. To promote tourism and protect the city's rich cultural heritage, PM Modi will inaugurate the redevelopment of eight riverfront Kuccha Ghats, the beautification of the pond and ghat at Rangildas Kutiya in Shivpur, and the restoration of the historic Durgakund. Foundation stones will be laid for the restoration of Kardameshwar Mahadev Temple, development of Karkhiyaon, the birthplace of notable freedom fighters, and redevelopment of Munshi Premchand's ancestral home in Lamahi into a museum.

Andhra Pradesh Mega DSC final key released

The final 'key' for the Andhra Pradesh Mega District Selection Committee (AP Mega DSC) has been officially announced.



DSC convener M.V. Krishna Reddy confirmed that the final key has been uploaded to the official website. He objections submitted by candidates regarding the preliminary key have been thoroughly reviewed by a panel of subject matter experts to prepare the final version. Andhra Pradesh tourism The convener clarified that no further objections will be accepted on this final key. Candidates can now log in to the official portal with their details to check the final answer key. Following the formation of the coalition government, the Mega DSC notification was issued for the recruitment of 16,347 teaching posts. A total of 336,307 candidates applied for the examinations. The exams were held over 23 days, in two sessions each day, from 6 June to 2 July, at centres across Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Odisha. Approximately 92.90 per cent of registered candidates appeared for the tests. Officials have indicated that the results are expected to be announced soon.

Heavy Inflow Prompts Gate Openings at Nagarjuna Sagar

River Krishna is flowing rapidly through the Nagarjuna Sagar project as heavy inflows from upstream regions continue. In response to the rising water levels, project authorities have opened 24 crest gates by 5 feet and an additional two gates by 10 feet to release excess water downstream. Currently, 2,47,161 cusecs of water are being received from the upper catchment areas, while a total of 2,57,178 cusecs is being discharged through the main power plant, left and right bank canals, and the reservoir spillways. The water level in the reservoir has receded slightly from 590 feet to 585.10 feet. The storage capacity of the reservoir stands at 312.0450 TMC (thousand million cubic feet), with the present storage recorded at 297.11 TMC. Authorities continue to monitor the situation closely, as inflows remain heavy and consistent.

Along with this, the foundation stone of a new 132/33 KV power substation to be constructed at a cost of Rs. 49.86 crores in Panagal mandal and a new 33/11 KV power substation to be constructed at a cost of Rs. 2.02 crores in Jammapur village of Panagar mandal will be laid in Kollapur today. He said that once the construction of the 132/33 KV substation in Panagal mandal is completed and started, it can be connected to the construction of another (15) 33/11 substations from there. He said that the foundation

stone of 4 more substations related to Vennancherla and Marikal villages in Koderu mandal of Nagarkurnool district will be laid in Kollapur. Telangana travel guide In Velaturu village, the 33/11 KV substation set up at a cost of Rs. 2.2 crore will be used to provide 950 borewells and 600 domestic connections with 3 feeders. Under the three feeders, 6 villages of Velatur, Chinnna Mahadev, Ayyavaripalli, Kaluru, Venkatampalli and Solipur villages will receive three-phase quality electricity. Current problems will be solved for the households and agricultural lands within the respective villages. ORGAN DONORS GIVE A NEW LIFE.

In 1994 one Devi Ram, a 40 year old worker went to the AIIMS in New Delhi with a serious heart problem. After examining him the doctors there told him that the only one way to save him was by replacing his heart. Such heart transplantation was not in India then and he couldn't afford to go abroad for it. But Divine Providence willed otherwise. When one 35 year old woman was declared brain dead, the doctors in the AIIMS tried to convince her kith and kin to donate her heart to save Mr Devi Ram. They readily agreed and the rest is history.

On August 3rd a team of 20 doctors had carried out the 59 minute first heart transplantation surgery on Devi Ram successfully. Though the doctors expected him to survive for just a short period of time, he lived a healthy life for 15 more years before he died of not any heart problem. Thus since then August 3rd has been observed in our country as THE NATIONAL ORGAN DONATION DAY ANNUALLY.

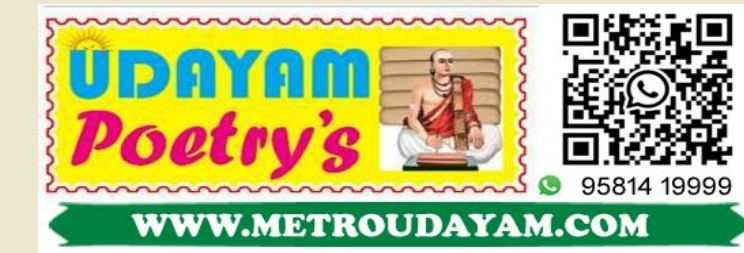
Most of us know that the first human to human heart transplantation was performed in 1967 by Dr. Christiaan Barnard in South Africa. In this case also Barnard, assisted by a team of 30 doctors and others, carried out that historic 6 hour transplantation of the heart of a 25 year old brain dead woman for a 55 year old

man with many health problems. Though the man lived just for 18 days after the operation, the case taught us many lessons.

When we are alive, most of us, if not all, help others in one way or other in times of need and emergency. While many of us do such acts of kindness thinking that those actions bring us Divine blessings that will ensure us a happy life after death, some people help others without expecting anything in return and live here even after their death! What most of us do not know is that even after our death, our body can also help others and give them a new lease of life. In other words, parts from a dead body can help at least 8 persons to survive fatal health conditions!

According to one survey every year around 5 Lakh people die for nonavailability of organs. When 2,50,000 need a kidney transplantation, only about 6000 organs are available, and even organs like Heart and Liver are in great demand for transplantation. Body donations are even less, thanks to our cultural compulsions and beliefs in life after death.

Against this grim background, the reading of the book, ORGAN AND BODY DONATION.... by Arun Anand is a must for us to know more about the fascinating history of this noble act of organ donations since the days of Puranas and Vedas. This book will definitely go a long way in its efforts to create awareness among the general public about



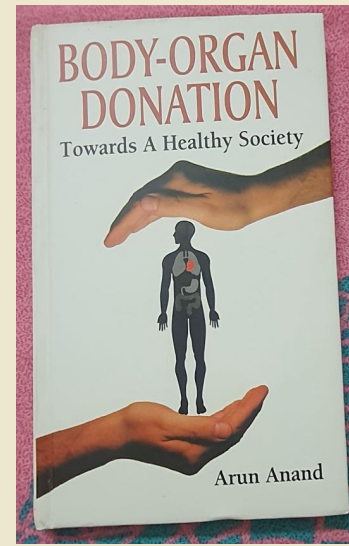
the importance and need for organ donations.

The author reels authentic facts and figures about the strides and changes in the whole proposition of organ transplantations made by Nobel Prize winning scientists and doctors since 1900s. He also tracks down the chain, scientific events and inventions that have touched and encouraged organ and body donations in our country. Be the first Kidney transplantation in Maharashtra in 1970s, or the path breaking heart transplantation in the AIIMS in 1994 and thereafter the transplantation of other organs and tissues in different parts of our country.

In this 11 chapter informative book, the 9th chapter titled FROM THE NEWS DESK: INSPIRING STORIES touches our hearts and spurs us to become a selfless donor. The stories here are about many young and ordinary people who died young and whose family members readily agreed to donate organs and bodies that could give a new life to scores of people.

To put it in a nut shell, the highly informed author deftly handles all aspects of this social and humanitarian issue with the sole and sincere aim of imparting awareness and preparing us to donate organs and bodies.

It needs no saying that we must all first and foremost transcend all our unfounded personal, parochial, social, and even religious misgivings and miscon-

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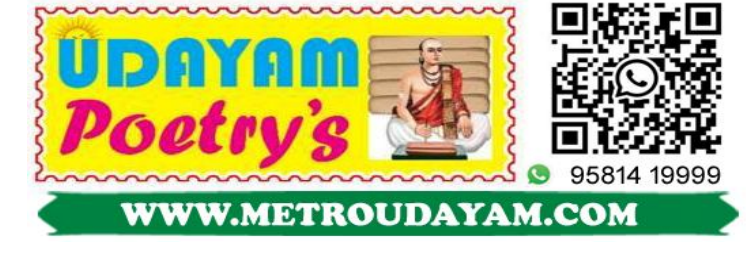
SWACHCHTA ABHIYAN COMMENCED OVER WALT AIR DIVISION

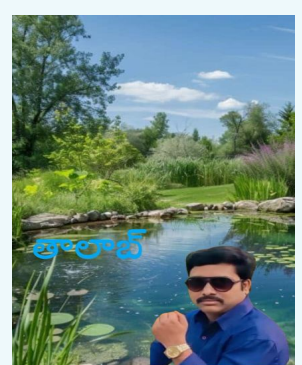

Key will be how Gill bats, India can push for a lead of over 300, says Aaron



London: Former India pacer Varun Aaron believes that captain Shubman Gill's batting approach will set the tone of their second innings after finishing the day 2 for 75/2 with a brief lead of 52 runs. Yashasvi Jaiswal's half-century led India's fightback after the hosts were successful in grabbing two Indian wickets of KL Rahul and Sai Sudharsan cheaply. "I don't think Gill will be taking any risky singles, that's for sure. But I hope he plays just like he has throughout this series. He's already broken multiple records and could even surpass Sunil Gavaskar's tally in this series. If he gets a big one tomorrow, India can push for a lead of over 300 and that would really tilt the game. The key will be how Gill bats and I think he knows his role is central to India's plans," Aaron said on JioHotstar. "I think India are in a good position. The wicket of Sai Sudharsan could have been avoided, but it was a great delivery, there wasn't much he could have done. For me, the story of the day was the bowling spells from Siraj and Prasidh Krishna. They bowled with real heart. Even Akash Deep did a solid holding job. England started aggressively in the morning, almost shock-and-awe, but the Indian bowlers held their nerve. Shubman Gill, as captain, stayed calm, didn't go defensive too early, and ensured England's lead didn't cross 30, which was crucial. Jaiswal's innings looked risky at times and he had a few chances, but his aggressive intent was important. We've seen India struggle with run rate in this series — so someone needed to keep the scoreboard ticking. India now find themselves 50 runs ahead, which is a good position." Earlier on day 2, Mohammed Siraj and Prasidh Krishna bagged four wickets each to bundle out England for 247/10 from 92/1. Aaron lauded Siraj and Krishna's performance on the day to stage a fight back in the match. "I always believed Siraj would come back and take wickets - that's been his story this series. He might not have the best first spell - tends to go for runs - but that's because he's always hunting for wickets. You need bowlers like that. Today, he used his wobble seam really well - his most effective weapon. Once he trusted that and used the outswinger sparingly, he was at his best. That ball that swung back in and trapped the left-hander LBW - classic Siraj. You can call him a lionheart or an energiser bunny; he brings relentless energy and always delivers." "This had to be Prasidh's day. He really stepped up, especially after Siraj had just bowled an eight-over spell and Akash Deep had done a long shift. Prasidh getting those breakthroughs was vital. If he hadn't, we'd have had to turn to spin, and someone like Harry Brook could have taken advantage. Thanks to Prasidh, the bowlers didn't have to overwork, and now they're fresh and full of confidence heading into the next innings," the former India pacer added.

Didn't expect the words I said to get such big reaction: Prasidh on verbal duel with Root

India fast bowler Prasidh Krishna revealed that engaging Joe Root in a verbal exchange on the second day of the fifth Test at The Oval was part of a deliberate strategy to disrupt the former England captain's focus. While Krishna downplayed the incident as mere banter, he admitted to being surprised at Root getting rattled. Root walked out to the crease with the team in a strong position at 129/2 in response to India's 224. The very first ball Root faced, a rising delivery from good length, he was rapped on the glove by Prasidh. Two balls later, a wobble-seam delivery straightened to beat Root's defense. It was then, possibly, that Prasidh said those words to him. The very next ball, Root guided a bound-



ary past gully and even offered a verbal reaction to Prasidh's action from before. At the change of overs, umpire Kumar Dharmasena intervened and had a long chat with Prasidh, with even skipper Shubman Gill and KL Rahul jumping in the bowlers' defense. The exact

words, which came when Root was yet to get off the mark and played and missed at Krishna, were not picked up by the stump mic but Krishna said he just told Root 'you are looking in great shape'. "I don't know why Rooty (reacted). I just said, 'You're looking in great shape,' and then it turned into a lot of abuse and all of that," the 29-year-old pacer told the BBC's Test Match Special. Later at the press conference, Prasidh said it had been a strategy of his to try and get Root off his game but there was nothing antagonistic about the exchange to add to the other sparks that have been lit through the series. "That was the plan, but I didn't expect the couple of words I said to get such a big reaction from him. That's just

who I am when I'm bowling, when I'm enjoying. If it means that I have a bit of a chatter with the batter... and it does help me when I can get under the nerves of the batsman and get a reaction from them. "But I love the guy that he is. He is a legend of the game and I think it is great when two people are out there wanting to do the best and be a winner at a given moment," Prasidh said at the press conference. England assistant coach Marcus Trescothick did not want to read too much into India's plan to rattle Root and said, "He (Prasidh) obviously tried to get after him [Root] and spark him up a little bit. Maybe they have seen him play so well over the last couple of games that India tried a different approach, and

Joe bit back, as sometimes he does." The second day of play also saw Akash Deep putting his arm around Ben Duckett after dismissing him. Later, Duckett was involved in another heated exchange with Sai Sudharsan moments before stumps, following the latter's LBW dismissal that stood despite a review. Reacting to the incident, Trescothick said, "He didn't really say too much. Strange, really. I don't think you really need to be putting your arm around someone, but nothing was really said, was it? You just don't really see it. We were chatting on the balcony there and I know many good people playing in county cricket would have said something or dug the elbow in, or something like that."
