



AP Government Prepares for Heavy Rains Amid Bay of Bengal Low- Pressure Area



The Andhra Pradesh government has been alerted following the formation of a low-pressure system in the Bay of Bengal, which has already brought heavy rains to parts of North Andhra. Home Minister Anitha conducted a review and ordered the establishment of control rooms across all districts. Citizens in low-lying areas are to be warned, and officials are to remain available in the field to provide guidance. The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and its personnel are on standby to carry out relief operations. Officials have been instructed to promptly remove dangerous hoardings and fallen trees. Minister Atchannaidu warned of the heavy rains affecting North Andhra districts and held a phone conference with Srikakulam District Collector Swapnil Dinakar Pundkar and Superintendent of Police Maheshwar Reddy to discuss the situation. Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea due to unfavourable weather conditions. Authorities have been told to be prepared for any emergencies. Irrigation officials are monitoring canals and ponds to prevent blockages, while the agriculture department has issued precautions for farmers in light of the forecasted heavy rains.

CM Chandrababu advocates reform in banking for agricultural support

In a recent state-level bankers' meeting, Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu addressed a range of pressing issues affecting agriculture, primary sectors, MSMEs, and SHGs. The meeting also served as a platform to review loan disbursement targets and banking services in rural areas. Naidu scrutinised the action taken report from 231 State Level Bank Committees (SLBCs) and emphasised the need for banks to actively support the One Family-One Entrepreneur programme and the establishment of MSME parks across 175 constituencies. He urged that decisions taken in these meetings should align with the aspirations of farmers, citizens, and governmental objectives, stating that routine meetings and



indicators had become ineffective. The Chief Minister pointed out that with half of the Kharif season already elapsed, it was essential for banks to provide loans and agricultural inputs promptly, rather than at the season's conclusion. He called for a change in banking approaches to match contemporary needs, acknowledging recent reforms introduced by the Central Government in Goods and Services Tax (GST) and hinting at forthcoming

reforms. Looking ahead, Naidu expressed his vision for India's economic system to compete with nations such as the United States and China by 2047. He encouraged officials to explore innovative solutions for banking and financial institutions and stressed that false lending and unproductive loans should be avoided. In his address, Naidu also highlighted the importance of bridging the gap between the rich and the poor, citing his extensive travels to forums like Davos focused on wealth creation and industrial development. He concluded by urging banks and financial institutions to collaborate in furthering wealth creation and fostering economic growth in the country.

Nalgonda POCSO court sentences accused in assault case

The Nalgonda District POCSO Court has delivered a landmark verdict in a high-profile case. Mohammed Qayyum of Tippi was found guilty of multiple charges related to the sexual assault of a minor girl. Judge Rojaramani announced a combined sentence of 51 years imprisonment. Qayyum was sentenced to 20 years for rape, 20 years under the POCSO Act, ten years for SC/ST atrocities, and an additional year for threatening the minor girl under Section 506. The incident occurred in 2021 within the jurisdiction of Tippi police station, where Qayyum assaulted a Dalit girl. Following the assault, he threatened her with death if she disclosed the matter. The victim confided in her family, who assisted her in approaching the police. A case was registered, and scientific evidence presented by the police, led by SP Sharat Chandra Pawar, confirmed the allegations. The court's stern verdict underscores the strength of justice for victims of such heinous crimes.



Telangana Assembly Sessions likely from August 30 Commence



The Telangana Assembly sessions are scheduled to begin on August 30, following a state cabinet meeting on August 29. A significant agenda item for this cabinet meeting will likely be a decision regarding the conduct of local body elections. Additionally, it is anticipated that the government will take the opportunity to discuss the Kaleshwaram Commission report during the assembly sessions. The commission report is set to be presented to all members in attendance. The sessions are expected to last for five days.

India will become a hub of clean energy: PM Modi

Ahmedabad: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday inaugurated localised production of hybrid battery electrodes and flagged off Battery Electric Vehicle (EV) exports to 100 countries from Hansalpur in Ahmedabad and stated that India will become a hub of clean energy. Addressing the gathering, PM Modi emphasised India's growing role in clean energy and electric mobility, while underlining the deepening partnership between India and Japan. Highlighting India's workforce and manufacturing potential, the Prime Minister said, "India has a demographic advantage, we have a skilled workforce. This makes it a win-win situation for any investment. Suzuki, Japan is manufacturing here and later cars are exported to Japan. This is the strength of Japan and India relations. "This also shows the trust of global firms in India. Companies like Maruti Suzuki are brand ambassadors of India. It is our biggest car exporter. From today, we began to scale EVs at the same level. From now on, EVs that will roll in various countries will have 'Made in India' written on it." He pointed out that India had long been dependent on imports for EV batteries, but the situation was now changing. "The most critical part of an EV is the battery. Earlier batteries were totally imported by India, but it was important to man-



ufacture the battery in India and therefore we sowed the seeds of battery manufacturing in India. Three Japanese companies came together to manufacture battery cells and electrodes in India. This will give our mission new energy. This will boost the hybrid vehicle market of our nation." The Prime Minister also stressed that EVs were not just an alternative but a solution to multiple challenges. "A few years ago, EVs were seen as an alternative but I think EVs are a solution to many problems. Last year during my Singapore visit, we decided to convert our old vehicles, old ambulances into EVs. Maruti Suzuki accepted that challenge and worked on it in six months. They built a hybrid ambulance. This will reduce pollution and also give an alternative to change old vehicles. Clean energy and

clean mobility is our future. India will become a hub of clean energy." Citing India's economic reforms and policies over the last decade, he said their impact was visible today. "The policies that India made in the last decade are reaping benefits now. We started the 'Make in India' campaign, created a conducive environment for business, we are making industrial corridors, logistic parks... India is working in many sectors to give production linked benefit to manufacturers. "We have solved issues of investors to make investments easy for them. The results are in front of us. Electric manufacturing has increased 500 per cent in a decade," he said. Urging state governments to remain proactive, he said, "I have always told all states that we have to be proactive and have to give single window clearance. This is an age of competition. The state that keeps its policies neat and clean will raise the confidence of investors. "Today the whole world is looking at India and so, every state should be competitive. This will benefit the nation. I invite all states to be competitive when it comes to pro-development policies." The Prime Minister also announced future plans in high-tech manufacturing and critical minerals. "India is not going to stop here. We have to perform better in the sectors we have already done well in. We

are focussing on 'Mission Manufacturing'. We want to focus on semiconductors and six plants are going to be ready soon. We are aware about the shortage of Rare Earth magnets and therefore we have launched the 'National Critical Mineral Mission' in India. We will look for more critical minerals." The Prime Minister underlined the historical and cultural depth of India-Japan ties, calling the bilateral relationship one of trust and shared vision. "India-Japan relation is more than just business, it is of history and culture. The journey that began with Maruti Suzuki is now going at bullet train speed. The roots of Japan-India relations are very strong," he said. Recalling his time as Gujarat Chief Minister, PM Modi said he paid attention to even small details to strengthen the partnership. "The journey began from Gujarat, 20 years ago, from the Vibrant Gujarat summit. I even made my visiting card in Japanese. I even arranged Japanese food here for the guests, got golf courses made for them. Today, in many schools of India, there are teachers to teach Japanese language to students. People-to-people connect is huge between the countries." Concluding his address, the Prime Minister affirmed, "Japan-India relation is made for each other."

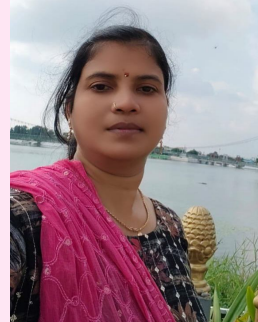

आज भी हजारों साल बाद कुछ न्यायपूर्ण राज्य करने वाले
राजाओं की कीर्ति गाथाएं इतिहास में सुरक्षित रहना इस बात की दलील है के
न्यायपूर्ण व्यवहार करने वालों को कोई मिटा नहीं सकता। न्यायाधीशों को निष्पक्ष
और न्यायपूर्ण होने की प्रेरणा देने के लिए मद्रास उच्च न्यायालय के परिसर में
एक मूर्ती को स्थापित किया गया। यह मूर्ती राजा मनु निधि चोलन की मूर्ती है
जो न्याय का प्रतीक माने जाती है।

राजा मनु निधि चोलन के शासन में मानव को ही नहीं बल्के
पशुओं को न्याय मिला था। न्याय के लिए आज भी जन सामान्य में आदर पाने
वाले इस राजा मनु निधि चोलन के राज्य में केवल मानव ही नहीं बल्के पशुओं
के साथ भी न्यायपूर्ण आचरण किया जाता था। राजा मनुनिधि चोलन का राज्य
दक्षिण भारत के तमिलनाडु राज्य में तंजौर के पास एक छोटा सा शहर "तिरुवरूर"
बताया जाता है।

चोल वंश के कई राजाओं ने इस "तिरुवरूर" शहर को अपनी
राजधानी बनाया और यहीं से शासन किया। इन राजाओं में राजा मनु निधि चोलन
(जिनका असली नाम एलाला चोझा या एल्लालन बताया जाता है) एक प्रसिद्ध
चोल राजा थे, जिन्हें न्यायप्रियता के लिए जाना जाता था। जिनका जीवन काल
205 ईसा पूर्व से 161 ईसा पूर्व बताया जाता है। राजा मनु निधि चोलन ने लगभग
दो हजार साल से भी पहले दक्षिण भारत में चोल साम्राज्य के साथ साथ श्रीलंका
के एक हिस्से पर भी शासन किया था।

न्याय और निष्पक्षता के लिए पहचाने जाने वाले एल्लालन को
"मनुनीति चोलन" भी कहा जाता है। "मनु नीति चोलन" इस का अर्थ है "मनु
स्मृति का पालन करने वाला चोल राजा"। यह एक न्यायप्रिय राजा थे जिनके
महल के सामने एक घंटा बांध रखे थे, जो भी न्याय चाहता था इस घंटे को
बजाता था। फिर राजा फरियादी के समस्या का हल किया करते थे। एक दिन
राजा मनुनिधि चोलन के महल के सामने घंटा बजने लगा। घंटा बजाने वाला
कोई मनुष्य नहीं बल्के एक दुखियारी गाय थी। यह वही गाय थी जिसके बछड़े
को (अनजाने में) राजकुमार के रथ ने कुचलकर मार दिया था।

राजा मनु निधि चोलन ने इस तथ्य का पता लगाने का आद-
ेश दिया। इस बारे में छानबीन करने पर पता चला इस गाय के बछड़े के मृत्यु
का कारण उनका पुत्र ही है, जिसके रथ के नीचे बछड़ा कुचला गया था। बछड़े
को राजा मनु निधि चोलन के पुत्र के रथ से कुचल दिया गया था इस बात को
महानगर रखते हुए राजा मनु निधि चोलन ने बिना किसी भेदभाव के अपने पुत्र
को मृत्यु दण्ड का दण्ड दिया। और उसी रथ के पहिये के नीचे अपने पुत्र को
मरवाकर गाय को न्याय दिलाया था।

कहा जाता है इस घटना से प्रसन्न होकर भगवान शिवजी ने
राजा मनु निधि चोलन को आशीर्वाद दिया और उसके पुत्र और बछड़े को दोनों
को भी पुनर्जीवित कर दिया था। तथ्य जो भी हो लेकिन आज भी राजा मनु निधि
चोलन के न्यायपूर्ण राज्य की चर्चा होती है और आज भी भारतवासियों के दिलों
में उनके लिए आदरपूर्ण प्रेम दिखता है। अफसोस कि बात है के, आज कल के

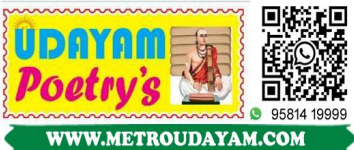


Dr. Dasaradhi Rangacharya 97th Birth Anniversary Poets Conference Felicitates Rajendra Prasad

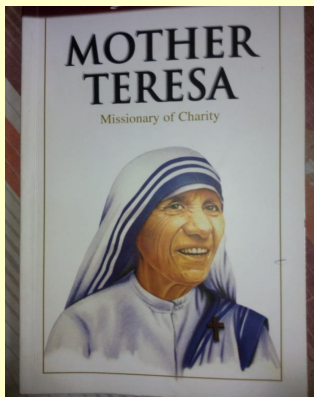
TERESAS BIRTHDAY ANNIVERSARY SPECIAL

MOTHER TERESA REMEMBERED

On her 115th Birth Anniversary yesterday, Mother Teresa was remembered as her name and matchless, selfless services to the poor and the sick continue to inspire us and generation after generation.

Sainthood was conferred on Mother Teresa on September 4th 2016, ending the 13 year long waiting of all her devotees. The beatification of Teresa had taken place in 2003, a time honoured and mandatory ritual before sainthood to be bestowed on the person beatified. For the canonisation of a person as a SAINT, he or she must have led a life of purity, simplicity, in the service of Christ and performing MIRACLES in the lives of people. Mother Teresa had all these stipulated qualifications in ample measures. It is said that some time ago one non christian woman was miraculously healed of a fatal disease when she invoked Mother Teresas name in her prayers. This 'act of miracle hastened and cleared the otherwise complicated and time consuming Catholic process of conferring sainthood on Teresa. This was really a happy tidings for 20 million Indian Catholic Christians who often go on a pilgrimage, visiting Teresas Tomb. Many of us think that Canonisation of Teresa is just a formality as we have for years regarded her a Saint and a godly figure for her healing presence and touching care for millions of poor people through her selfless service. Had the canonisation function taken place in India instead of in Rome, I think it would have been a more fitting tribute to our memory of Mother and an Ode to the Kolkata City, where she lived till her last breadth. Here are some little known things about St Mother Teresa.

- 1) Her original name was 'Gonxha (Gon-jah) in Albanian meaning "Little-flower bud."
- 2) Her parents had three children and Teresa was the youngest.
- 3) At school, Teresa was a top student and very imaginative. She



wrote poems and stories. She was also a great singer.

4) Teresa learnt the art of giving from her parents as both of them were very hospitable.

5) At the age of twelve, Teresa decided to become a teacher.

6) She became a nun and came to India against the wishes of her sister, brother, and near and dear.

7) She took the name Teresa on her own when she came to know about the holy life of a nun who died young and who had been born 'Terese Martin.

8) In Calcutta Teresa worked as a teacher at the school of Loreto. She taught Geography and History both in English and Bengali.

9) Sister Teresa became 'Mother Teresa when she succeeded Mother Cenacle as Superior at the school.

10) Teresa could speak five languages- Albanian, Serbo-Croatian, Latin, English, and Bengali.

11) The BBC made a TV film on the life and work of Teresa in Calcutta.

12) Teresa won the Nobel Prize in 1979 but she spent the entire prize money on building houses for lepers.

13) At the Nobel awards ceremonies she came to know about a grand banquet, but Teresa asked the organisers to cancel the dinner and the money be spent on the poor.

14) On the morning of September 5th 1997, Teresa suffered severe chest pain but refused to be taken out of the Motherhouse. She died with in hours at the age of 87.
