

Modi Embarks On Critical Asia Tour Amid US Trade Tensions

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is undertaking a significant diplomatic journey to Asia this week, visiting Japan and China at a time when India faces mounting pressure from the United States over trade policies and energy purchases. The tour comes against the backdrop of newly implemented American tariffs that have doubled duties on Indian imports to 50 percent, creating an urgent need for India to strengthen relationships with alternative partners. Modi's eastward diplomatic mission begins with his departure on Thursday evening for Japan, where he will remain until August 30 for the 15th India-Japan Annual Summit with Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba. This marks the Indian leader's first standalone visit to Japan in nearly seven years and represents his inaugural annual summit meeting with Ishiba, making it a particularly significant diplomatic engagement between the two nations. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri has emphasized the importance of the Japan visit, describing it as an opportunity for both prime ministers to conduct an in-depth review of bilateral ties while exchanging views on regional and global issues of mutual importance. The meetings are expected to launch several new initiatives designed to build greater resilience in the relationship and address emerging opportunities and challenges facing both countries. Following his Japan engagement, Modi will travel to China's Tianjin for the 25th meeting of the Heads of State of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization, scheduled for



August 31 and September 1. This visit comes at the invitation of Chinese President Xi Jinping and will bring together leaders from ten member nations, including some of the world's most influential political figures under one roof. The Shanghai Cooperation Organization summit will feature a remarkable gathering of global leaders, including Russian President Vladimir Putin and Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. The presence of these leaders creates a unique diplomatic environment where Modi will have opportunities for multiple bilateral engagements, though officials are still finalizing the specific meeting arrangements and agendas. The timing of Modi's encounter with Pakistani Prime Minister Sharif is particularly noteworthy, as it marks the first occasion since the India-Pakistan military conflict in May that both

leaders will attend the same international event. This coincidence presents potential opportunities for diplomatic engagement, though no formal bilateral meetings between the two leaders have been confirmed at this stage. Questions remain about whether Modi will hold bilateral discussions with Russian President Putin during the summit. When asked about potential meetings with the Russian leader, Foreign Secretary Misri indicated that finalization of such arrangements is still underway, promising to provide briefings on any proceedings that emerge from these engagements. Modi's diplomatic tour occurs as India grapples with escalating trade tensions with the United States under President Donald Trump's administration. The American government has implemented a comprehensive tariff regime targeting Indian exports, with the most recent 25 percent increase specifically imposed as a penalty for India's continued purchase of discounted Russian oil. These additional duties, combined with existing tariffs, have created a 50 percent barrier on numerous Indian products entering the American market. The American tariff strategy reflects Trump's "America First" agenda and his administration's broader approach to global trade relationships. The United States has cited unfair trade practices, lack of reciprocal market access, and India's energy relationship with Russia as justifications for these punitive measures. Interestingly, China, despite purchasing significantly

more Russian oil than India, has not faced similar penalties specifically related to energy imports from Russia. Against this challenging backdrop, Modi's visit to China takes on added significance as both nations seek to improve their historically complex relationship. The two Asian giants are actively working to thaw diplomatic ties, with resuming direct flights after a five-year gap being part of their broader reconciliation efforts. Additionally, India and China are engaged in discussions about easing various trade barriers, including the potential reopening of border trade at three strategic Himalayan crossing points. The diplomatic initiatives between India and China represent a pragmatic approach to regional stability and economic cooperation, particularly important as both nations face external trade pressures from the United States. The Shanghai Cooperation Organization summit provides an ideal platform for advancing these bilateral discussions while also engaging with other regional powers on matters of mutual interest. Modi's strategic timing for this Asian tour demonstrates India's commitment to diversifying its diplomatic and economic relationships in response to changing global dynamics. As traditional partnerships face new challenges, India is actively seeking to strengthen ties with regional partners and explore alternative frameworks for international cooperation that better serve its national interests and long-term strategic objectives.

Pawan Kalyan Engages Workers in Visakhapatnam Meetings

Andhra Pradesh CM Reviews Family Benefit Monitoring System

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu held a review meeting regarding the Family Benefit Monitoring System at the Secretariat on Thursday. During the session,



he proposed the introduction of a 'family card' for every household in the state, akin to the Aadhaar system. The Chief Minister directed officials to ensure that this card includes comprehensive details about government schemes and emphasised the need for regular updates. "Field-level information should be gathered about family needs. The system must be designed to facilitate immediate access to government welfare as required. We must avoid situations where families are excluded from receiving benefits. We should also rethink our schemes to ensure they are inclusive. Furthermore, the introduction of a population policy should be addressed promptly," stated CM Chandrababu.

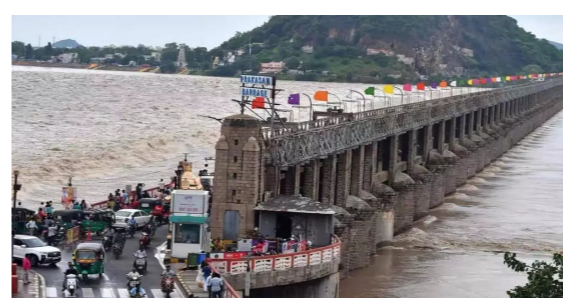
Telangana DGP alerts officials amid heavy rainfall in the state

In response to severe rainfall affecting Telangana, state DGP Jitender has announced that authorities are on high alert. So far, 2,000 individuals have been rescued from the flood-affected areas, with the operations supported by the Indian Air Force and Army using two helicopters. DGP Jitender highlighted the formation of the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), comprising 2,000 personnel, who are conducting rescue operations in coordination with the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF). He stated that the teams are focused on ensuring no lives are lost during this critical period and have been achieving commendable results since last year. During an interview with ABN Andhra Jyothi on Thursday, DGP Jitender reported ongoing heavy rainfall across Telangana. He assured that the police department is executing prompt relief measures, particularly as Vinayaka Chavithi celebrations are underway. While acknowledging that rain in Hyderabad has mostly occurred during the night and posed no immediate threat, he expressed confidence in the city's preparedness to handle further heavy rainfall and flooding. Relief teams have been organised from the DGP office, and it was noted that significant damage has occurred to main roads in Kamareddy and Siddipet districts, along with the destruction of a railway track. DGP Jitender confirmed that measures are being implemented to restore transport infrastructure swiftly.



Inflow to Krishna river increases at Prakasam barrage, first danger warning in place

In light of heavy rainfall in the upper catchment areas, authorities have issued a first danger warning for the Prakasam Barrage in Vijayawada as flood flow in the Krishna River continues to rise. NTR District Collector Lakshmi reported that an influx of 405,790 cusecs of water has currently reached the barrage, prompting the opening of 66 gates to manage the excess water. Also Read - Krishnamma rivers overflows at Prakasam Barrage, 69 gates lifted Residents of low-lying areas are being urged to stay vigilant, with officials establishing 33 emergency rehabilitation centres throughout the NTR district for those in need of safe



shelter. In addition, individuals living in hilly regions are reminded to exercise caution, particularly as authorities have identified residences at risk for landslides. Residents are encouraged to relocate to the designated centres if instructed to do so by secretariat staff.

Despite 30 to 40 cm of rainfall recorded in Thiruvur last night, officials have assured that there are no significant issues, even as water levels have risen near Budameri. People are advised to avoid going outdoors during thunderstorms and lightning. Collector Lakshmi emphasised the importance of adhering to official guidelines, stating that public alertness is crucial to ensuring safety. A special control command centre has been established at the NTR Collectorate to continually monitor the flood situation. Collaborative efforts among officers from various departments are underway to effectively manage the present conditions.

A blueprint for systemic reform in scientific temper across Telangana

The Telangana Science Congress, hosted recently by the Telangana Academy of Sciences (TAS) at Kakatiya University, marks a pivotal moment. Originally founded as the Andhra Pradesh Academy of Sciences in 1963, this Congress must go beyond ceremony to catalyse systemic reform. TAS's mandate is clear: foster scientific temper and advance original research. Yet today, superstition and irrationality persist across educational and research institutions, often with tacit acceptance. India's Constitution enshrines scientific temper as a fundamental duty (Article 51A(h)), and our history is rich with institutions committed to this ethos—from the Indian Academy of Sciences (1934) to Vigyan Prasar and the People's Science Network. Yet many educated citizens remain unfamiliar with core scientific principles like falsifiability, reproducibility, and evidence-based reasoning. The prevalence of occult beliefs, black magic-linked crimes, and fraudulent godmen reflects systemic failures in science education—not just individual lapses. Telangana tourism Schools should be the crucibles of scientific inquiry but many function as certificate factories. In the two Telugu states, an exam-centric marketplace has eclipsed authentic learning. Science education has shrunk to memorizing formulae and mastering MCQ strategies. We celebrate IIT and IAS ranks but ignore the erosion of conceptual understanding and scientific values. The consequences are stark. A 2017 IIT Bombay review found many top-ranked entrants struggling with basic physics and math. IIT Delhi's former director lamented students' lack of independent thinking. At IIT Hyderabad, a 2021 survey revealed that first-year students could not perform unscripted experiments. The dropout rates and industry feedback across the nation point to a system that rewards speed and tricks over reasoning and problem-solving. Globally, science academies have responded with bold reforms. The Royal Society (UK) and the US National Academy of Sciences have reoriented science education around inquiry, modelling, and argument from evidence. Germany's

Leopoldina invests in sustained teacher development. India's own academies have defended research integrity and warned against predatory publishing. These institutions align curriculum, assessment, teacher learning, and research culture with ethics and inquiry. The Telugu region has its own legacy of science popularisation. Osmania University and RR Labs (now IICT) contributed significantly. P M Bhargava, founding director of CCMB, along with leaders such as Satish Dhawan, founded the Society for the Promotion of Scientific Temper nationally and the Society for Communicating Science in Hyderabad, organizing impactful programs. Bhargava—credited, along with D D Kosambi, with helping shape the constitutional emphasis on scientific temper—famously wrote in Angels, Devil and Science that even India's scientific community often lacks a scientific outlook. His declaration for membership in the Society stated: "I believe that knowledge acquisition happens only through human effort, and all problems must be faced with human ethical and intellectual resources without relying on supernatural powers." Local events calendar Many scientists then were unwilling to sign—an unease that, arguably, still lingers. Ironically, the same Hyderabad that once championed scientific temper has become a hub of exam coaching, rote-driven corporate education, and dubious journals. Purposeful research in universities is rare; school and college laboratories are often on paper only. In public life, evidence-based reasoning is scarce, critical thinking and questioning are subdued, and manufactured consent thrives on social media. Education is reduced to markets and metrics; historical memory fades; and imported ignorance erodes rights and institutions. To reverse this decline, TAS must play a pivotal role in driving a genuine paradigm shift in science education. As a means to catalyse a genuine paradigm shift in science education, it must assume a proactive and strategic role—pressuring institutions, influencing policy, and modelling reform. It should insist that 25–40 per cent of

curriculum time from middle school to undergraduate levels should be reserved for authentic laboratory and field investigations apart from fostering practical education with open-ended problems that cultivate inquiry and reasoning. Assessment systems must be overhauled to prioritise understanding across segments. TAS can lead pilot programs in collaboration with SCERT, school boards, and universities to demonstrate feasibility and impact of such reforms. Local events calendar To professionalise teaching, TAS should launch a year-long and all-encompassing science teachers fellowship, including spreading its reach to the district-level. There is a need for a phased increase in education funding, urging the government to move toward global benchmarks and prioritise teacher development and laboratory infrastructure over superficial construction. TAS should demand that AI be used as a thinking partner in classrooms—requiring students to critique model outputs, justify reasoning, and revise based on evidence. TAS must push for the replacement of answer-only submissions with annotated notebooks. Beyond the classroom, TAS must engage the public to strengthen scientific temper. It should host regular town halls on pseudoscience and data literacy, featuring citizen experiments that invite community participation. Science communication bootcamps must be offered to help teachers and students translate research for lay audiences, bridging the gap between academic knowledge and public understanding. These are not optional enhancements—they are urgent interventions. TAS must move beyond its ceremonial role and become a catalyst that rewires incentives, practices, and culture across the education ecosystem. By setting bold but workable standards and relentlessly advocating for reform, TAS can help Telangana transition from rote to reason, from performativity to practice, and from fear of being wrong to the courage to learn. 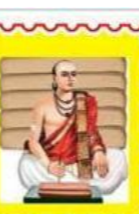

ऋषि पंचमी

इस दिन, बड़े-बुजुर्ग कहते हैं कि व्यक्ति को कम से कम एक बार सात महान ऋषियों अत्रि, कश्यप, भारद्वाज, गौतम, वशिष्ठ, जमदग्नि और विश्वामित्र का स्मरण करना चाहिए। यदि कोई इस ऋषि पंचमी पर रामायण पढ़ता है, तो उसे इन सभी महान ऋषियों की याद आ जाएगी। क्योंकि अत्रि महर्षि ही थे जिन्होंने सीता और राम को वन में आश्रय दिया था। वे वास्तव में एक महान पुरुष थे जिनके पुत्र भगवान हरि थे। भारद्वाज महर्षि ही थे जिन्होंने सीता और राम को शिवकूट का मार्ग दिखाया था। गौतम महान ऋषि थे जिन्होंने अपनी पत्नी अहिल्या के माध्यम से राम को अपनी तपस्या का फल प्रदान किया। राम के गुरु विश्वामित्र थे। राम के कुलगुरु वशिष्ठ ऋषि पंचमी व्रत पति-पत्नी दोनों को करना चाहिए। विशेषकर महिलाओं को इसे अवश्य करना चाहिए।

विनायक चतुर्थी के बाद पाँचवें दिन को "ऋषि पंचमी" कहा जाता है। इस दिन सप्त ऋषियों की किरणें साधकों पर पड़ती हैं। इसलिए, ब्राह्मी मुहूर्त में उठकर ध्यान करना चाहिए। सप्त ऋषि गायत्री मंत्र के मूल गुरु हैं। मानव शरीर में सात योग चक्र होते हैं। ये सप्त ऋषि ही इनका विकास करते हैं। वेदों को सर्वप्रथम देखने और वैदिक धर्म का पालन करने वाले प्रथम हिंदू ऋषियों को याद करने का एक शुभ अवसर...भाद्रपद शुद्ध पंचमी। यदि हम इस दिन व्रत रखते हैं, तो वे गुरु बहुत प्रसन्न होते हैं और हमारी मनोकामनाएँ पूरी करते हैं। विशेषकर यदि महिलाएँ पूरे दिन पूर्ण व्रत रखें, तो वे उन्हें और उनकी संतानों को पीढ़ियों तक उत्तम स्वास्थ्य और सुख का आशीर्वाद देते हैं। पूर्ण व्रत का अर्थ है कि सभी प्रकार के भोजन (केवल फल) ग्रहण किए जा सकते हैं। यदि घर की मौसियों में शक्ति न हो, तो बहुओं को भी व्रत रखना चाहिए। सभी के कुल नाम भी ऋषियों के नाम हैं। वे इन सप्तऋषियों के वंश, जो से हमारे पास आए। यह हमारा कर्तव्य है कि हम उन्हें श्रद्धापूर्वक याद करें और सती के साथ उनकी पूजा करें, उनकी महान सेवा के लिए कृतज्ञता के प्रतीक के रूप में। व्रतकल्प में कहा गया है कि भगवान ब्रह्मा ने राजा सीताश्व से कहा था कि यदि यह व्रत पूरी लगन से किया जाए, तो सभी पाप क्षमा हो जाएंगे। क्या हम इन दिनों सप्त ऋषियों के दर्शन कर सकते हैं? अर्थात्, हम कह सकते हैं कि वे अवश्य दर्शन देंगे। और अधिक स्पष्ट रूप से कहें तो... यदि हम उन्हें अपनी आँखों से देख सकें, तो वे प्रतिदिन दर्शन देंगे। दूसरे शब्दों में, प्रत्येक दम्पति को शाम के समय सप्त ऋषियों और अरुंधति वशिष्ठ को भी प्रणाम करना चाहिए। वे कहाँ हैं? वे कैसे हैं? यह हमारे विवाह समारोहों में 'अरुंधति दर्शन' करने जैसा है। चूंकि वे शाम के समय उत्तर दिशा में होते हैं, इसलिए हम उनका ध्यान कर सकते हैं और प्रतिदिन दर्शन कर सकते हैं।

सप्त ऋषि कौन हैं? भारतीय पौराणिक कथाओं के अनुसार, प्रत्येक वंश के संस्थापक एक ऋषि होते हैं। प्राचीन ऋषियों का वंश आज के भारतीय वंश का क्रम है। कुछ लोग अपने पूर्व ऋषियों को गोत्र के रूप में प्रतिदिन स्मरण करते हैं। कुछ लोग अपने पूर्व ऋषियों को नहीं जानते, लेकिन उनके वंश में ऋषि होते हैं। सप्त ऋषियों को अनेक ऋषियों के प्रतिनिधि के रूप में पूजने की प्रथा है। 1. कश्यप 2. अत्रि 3. भारद्वाज 4. विश्वामित्र 5. गौतम 6. जमदग्नि 7. वशिष्ठ ये सात पूजनीय हैं। वेद, जो देवताओं की दिव्य शिक्षाएँ थीं और जिन्हें राक्षसों ने चुरा लिया था, भगवान विष्णु ने व्यास के रूप में अवतरित होकर हमें उपनिषदों और पुराणों के रूप में प्रदान किए। व्यास को चार मुखों वाला ब्रह्मा, दो भुजाओं वाला विष्णु और तीसरी आँख रहित शिव कहा गया है।

1. ऋषि कश्यप:- सप्त ऋषियों में कश्यप एक प्रजापति थे। वे मरीचि और काल के पुत्र थे। उन्होंने दक्ष प्रजापति की 13 कन्याओं और वैश्वानर की दो कन्याओं से विवाह किया था। उनके माध्यम से उन्हें दैत्य, आदित्य, दानव, सिद्ध, गंधर्व, अप्सरस, मनेय, यक्ष, राक्षस, वृक्ष-लता प्रजातियाँ, शेर, जानवर, नाग, पक्षी, गोगण, अनुरास, गरुड, नाग, कालकेय, पॉलोमस, दिव्य ऋषि पर्वत और ब्राह्मण ऋषि विभांडक अपने पुत्रों के रूप में मिले।

2. अत्रि महर्षि:- सात ऋषियों में से दूसरे, अत्रि महर्षि ब्रह्मा मनसा के पुत्रों में से एक थे। उनकी पत्नी अनसूया थीं। अत्रि ने अपनी तपस्या से सोम, दुर्वास और दत्तात्रेय को, जो त्रिमूर्ति के समान थे, अपने पुत्रों के रूप में प्राप्त किया। अत्रि की पत्नी पतिव्रत शिरोमणि की पत्नी अनसूया थीं।

3. भारद्वाज महर्षि:- भारद्वाज उत्तथ्यु के पुत्र थे। उनकी माता का नाम ममता था। उनका जन्म बृहस्पति की कृपा से हुआ था और घृताची पर मोहित होने के कारण, वे घट में द्रोण के जन्म का कारण बने।

4. विश्वामित्र महर्षि:- विश्वामित्र एक राजर्षि थे। उन्होंने त्रिशंकु को स्वर्ग भेजने के लिए तपस्या कीस

Change in PKL 12 schedule: Chennai leg concludes on Oct 10, Delhi leg commences on Oct 11

New Delhi: Organisers of the Pro Kabaddi League have announced changes to the schedule of season 12 during the Chennai and Delhi legs of the tournament. The Chennai leg will now operate from September 29 to October 10, followed by the Delhi leg, which will now begin on October 11. This change ensures continuous tournament action while accommodating for the revised Chennai schedule. The following matches, originally scheduled for October 11 and 12 in Chennai, have been relocated to Delhi. On October 11, the matches moving from Chennai to Delhi are Bengaluru Bulls vs

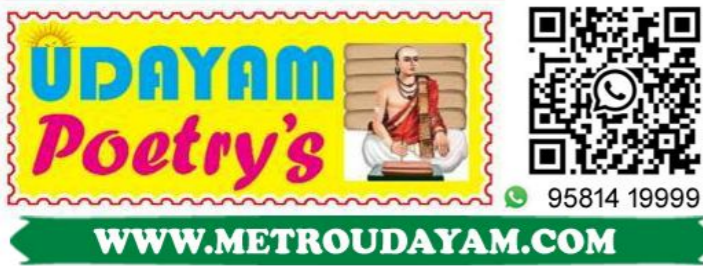


Jaipur Pink Panthers, and Tamil Thalaivas vs Puneri Paltan. On October 12, the relocated matches include Dabang Delhi K.C. vs Puneri Paltan, and Bengal Warriorz vs Bengaluru Bulls. Barring these changes, all other match dates, orders, and team alignments remain

unchanged. The overall tournament schedule and structure continue as originally planned, with only the venue location changed for the specified matches on October 11 and 12. The league stage of PKL 12 will kick off with blockbuster clashes between Telugu Titans and Tamil Thalaivas, followed by Bengaluru Bulls and Puneri Paltan at the Vishwanadh Sports Club in Vizag on August 29. Earlier, PKL have also announced significant format changes for Season 12, introducing an enhanced league stage and revamped Playoff structure designed to intensify competition and provide fans

with more thrilling kabaddi action. The upcoming season, which will travel to Vizag, Jaipur, Chennai and Delhi, bringing the PKL experience closer to fans deeper in India, will feature an exciting league stage with 108 matches, where each team will play 18 matches. PKL 12 also introduced a comprehensive tie-breaker rule system, including the Golden Raid format, to all league-stage matches. Previously limited only to Playoff matches, this system now ensures decisive outcomes throughout the tournament. In case of ties, teams will engage

in a structured 5-raid shootout with special rules. Both teams field 7 players with the baulk line treated as baulk line cum bonus line. Each team nominates 5 different raiders who raid alternately. Out and revival rules don't apply - only points scored count. If still tied after 5 raids, the Golden Raid rule applies. In the Golden Raid format, where a fresh toss determines which team gets the decisive raiding opportunity. If both teams remain tied after golden raids, the winner is decided by a toss

On Sunday, the senior actor took to his Instagram, and shared a monochromatic video from the sets of the film. The BTS video shows him walking with his arms around the neck of director Vivek Ranjan Agnihotri and an assistant director. He wrote in the caption, "From the sets of @vivekagnihotri's #TheBengalFiles! @pallavijoshiofficial #Gandhi #BehindTheScenes". 'The Bengal Files' is set against the blood-soaked backdrop of West Bengal's violent political past, and based on true events and spine-chilling testimonies. The film is based on the Direct Action Day, and is touted to bring events from one of the darkest chapters of modern

India to light. Mahatma Gandhi had camped in Noakhali for four months and toured the district in a mission to restore peace and communal harmony. Earlier, actress-producer Pallavi Joshi, who has co-produced and acts in 'The Bengal Files', had opened up on the blockade imposed on the trailer of the film, and has called the ruling government of West Bengal for the same. She said the trailer of the film, and a special screening was stopped on the orders of the ruling government of TMC spearheaded by Mamata Banerjee. The makers of 'The Bengal Files' wanted to launch the trailer of the film in Kolkata on August 16, which marks the 79th anniversary of the Direct Action Day, a dark chapter in the history of India when the state of Bengal was rocked by widespread communal

riots. Talking about the blockade, Pallavi earlier told IANS, "Well, it was very clearly done by the ruling party, and we are making no bones about it. We knew that we'd get some kind of resistance". "But we didn't know it would be like this, that we won't be able to show our trailer at all. It was very significant for us to choose Kolkata to release our trailer on August 16, which was the anniversary of Direct Action Day", she added. 'The Bengal Files' also stars Mithun Chakraborty and Darshan Kumar. The film is written and directed by Vivek Ranjan Agnihotri and produced by Abhishek Agarwal, Pallavi Joshi and Vivek Ranjan Agnihotri. Presented by Tej Narayan Agarwal & I Am Buddha, The film is a worldwide release by Zee Studios, and will arrive in theatres on September 5, 2025.
