



PM Modi, Singapore PM Wong hold bilateral talks at Hyderabad House

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi met with Singaporean Prime Minister Lawrence Wong at Hyderabad House in New Delhi on Thursday to discuss ways to further strengthen bilateral ties. The meeting is expected to see the signing of several high-level agreements across diverse sectors, including finance, digital innovation, skill development, civil aviation, maritime cooperation, and space technology. Earlier in the day, External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar called on the Singaporean Prime Minister and discussed the strengthening of bilateral relations, expressing confidence that ties between the two nations will further deepen following Wong's meeting with PM Modi. Taking to X,



Jaishankar posted, "Pleased to call on PM Lawrence Wong of Singapore this morning in Delhi. Appreciate his constant encouragement for the strengthening of India-Singapore ties." Wong is

scheduled to hold bilateral discussions with PM Modi later in the day. "Confident that his talks later today with PM Narendra Modi will chart a roadmap for our contemporary ties,"

Jaishankar added. Following the meeting, Wong also shared his remarks on X, stating, "With India External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar -- we discussed regional & global developments, and the good progress in India-SG cooperation." This is his first visit to India since assuming office, and he is accompanied by his wife and a high-level delegation including cabinet ministers and senior officials. The Singaporean Prime Minister will also call on President Droupadi Murmu after his meeting with PM Modi. Earlier on Tuesday, Wong met Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda and Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to discuss cooperation in the fields of health and finance. "Singapore is an important partner for India, including in our 'Act East' Policy.

During the visit of Prime Minister Modi to Singapore in September 2024, bilateral ties were elevated to a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated. Wong's visit also coincides with the 60th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Singapore, reaffirming the commitment of both nations to strengthening the partnership further. "The visit will provide an opportunity for both Prime Ministers to review our robust and multifaceted cooperation and to set the path for future collaboration. The two Prime Ministers will also engage on regional and international issues of mutual interest," the MEA added.

Teachers' Day Celebrations begin early in Pithapuram, Pawan Kalyan offers gifts to teachers



Teachers' Day commenced a day early in the Pithapuram constituency, represented by Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan. In a gesture of appreciation, Kalyan sent gifts to 2,000 teachers across government and private schools, as well as junior colleges within the constituency. The gifts, consisting of sarees for women and trousers and shirts for men, were distributed by a special team early in the morning at the education offices of Pithapuram, Kothapalli, and Gollaprolu mandals. Educators received the thoughtful gesture with joy, expressing their gratitude for the Deputy Chief Minister's recognition of their contributions.

AP Cabinet Announces Universal Health Policy and New Medical Colleges

In a significant move to enhance healthcare accessibility, the Andhra Pradesh Cabinet has approved the Universal Health Policy during a meeting chaired by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu at the Secretariat. The key decision aims to provide health insurance coverage to all residents of the state, regardless of their financial circumstances. Under the Ayushman Bharat-NTR Vaidya Seva Scheme, the Cabinet has launched a new initiative that guarantees free treatment for families up to ₹25 lakh per year. This ambitious plan will cover health insurance for approximately 1.63 crore families across Andhra Pradesh. The NTR Vaidya Seva Hybrid Policy will be implemented to offer complimentary medical services at 2,493 designated network hospitals. A total of 3,257 treatments will be provided at no cost. In an effort to streamline the process, pre-authorization for med-



ical treatments will now be managed within six hours. Claims under ₹2.5 lakh will be processed by insurance companies, while expenses ranging from ₹2.5 lakh to ₹25 lakh will be covered by the NTR Vaidya Seva Trust. This policy aims to support 1.43 crore underprivileged families alongside 20 lakh

other households. In addition to the health policy, the Cabinet has approved the establishment of 10 new medical colleges across the state under a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model. These institutions will be located in Adoni, Madanapalle, Markapuram, Pulivendula, Penugonda, Palakollu, Amalapuram, Narsipatnam, Bapatla, and Parvathipuram, with plans to roll out construction in two phases. The Cabinet has authorised the issuance of Requests for Proposals (RFP) to facilitate this development. This comprehensive approach to healthcare reform and educational infrastructure reaffirms the government's commitment to improving medical services and training in Andhra Pradesh.

Hyderabad police make arrangements for Ganapati Mahanimajjanam

GHMC Commissioner RV Karnan and Police Commissioner CV Anand have announced that extensive arrangements are being implemented to ensure the Mahanimajjanam proceeds smoothly and safely. The officials conducted an inspection of the route for the Nimajjana Shobha Yatra on Wednesday, accompanied by District Collector Dasari Harichandana, Rachakonda Commissioner Sudheer Babu, and Hyderabad Commissioner AV Ranganath. The officials earlier visited Balapur Ganesha, where they were welcomed by Utsav Samiti Chairman Niranjan Reddy and committee members. The Shobha Yatra will commence from Balapur, following a route that will lead to Hussain Sagar, the primary immersion site, passing through Charminar Circle,



Mojamjahi Market, and Telugu Talli Bridge. During their discussions, the officials addressed critical arrangements including sanitation management, power supply, traffic diversion, and security measures. Commissioner CV Anand emphasised that extensive security measures will be in place to guarantee a peaceful immersion, with 30,000 police personnel deployed for the event. In a related statement released

on Wednesday, the GHMC reported that up until September 2, a total of 121,905 idols had been immersed across the greater area. The Kukatpally zone recorded the highest number of immersions, exceeding 41,000, followed by Serilingampally with over 21,000. In contrast, the Charminar zone recorded the lowest figure, with 6,254 idols immersed.

CM Chandrababu praises centre's GST reforms decision

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu has expressed his approval following the Central Government's decision to reduce Goods and Services Tax (GST) slabs. In a post on his X account, Naidu welcomed the reforms, stating that the move will lead to significant reductions in taxes on essential commodities, education, healthcare, and agricultural products. Naidu described the decision as a boon for the poorer sections of society and a catalyst for development, emphasising its potential to benefit various groups, particularly farmers and traders. He extended his congratulations to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman for what he termed a "revolutionary" choice to alter the GST structure. The Chief Minister further clarified that these next-generation GST reforms, aimed at enhancing the livelihoods of citizens, are poised to strategically transform the tax system and elevate the living standards of every Indian.



SEMINAR HELD ON SAFETY PRECAUTIONS WHILE WORKING ON TRACK



The Engineering Department of Waltair Division conducted a seminar on the Working Procedure on track and precautions to be observed while using Push Trolley, Motor Trolley etc at Kottavalasa. The event brought together track maintainers, trolley operators, and key-men, Supervisory staff for a comprehensive session on safety protocols, operational rules, and best practices.

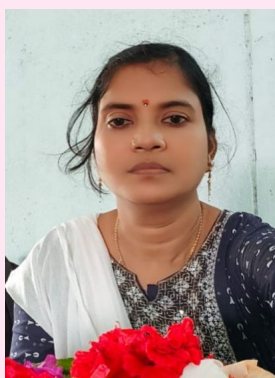

Yes, S Teacher.

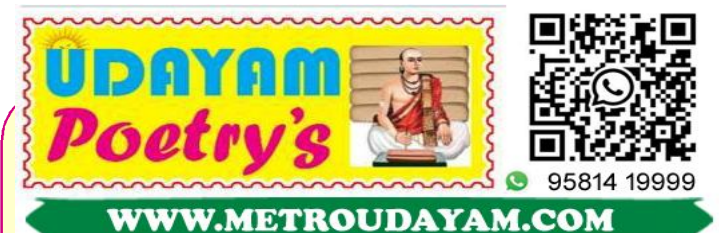
Practicing what he preached,

कुछ लोगों ने दौलत की लालच में या मौत के डर से तो और कुछ लोग अपनी लाइलमी (अनभिज्ञता) के कारण जालिम हुक्मरानों (अत्याचारी शासकों) के अधार्मिक कृत्यों के विरोध में खामोश रहे हैं। कुछ भोले भाले लोग अत्याचारी शासकों के चालबाजियों को न समझने से उनका विरोध नहीं किया। सच्चा धार्मिक कभी भी खुदा (ईश्वर) के व्यातिरिक्त और किसी से उम्मीदें (अपेक्षाएँ) नहीं रखता। और अपने गुनाहों (पापों) के अलावा किसी और बात से नहीं डरता।

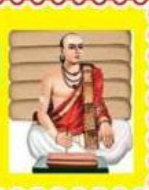

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शिक्षक दिवस

डॉ. सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन भारत के एक महान शिक्षाविद्, दार्शनिक और राजनीतिज्ञ थे। उनका संपूर्ण जीवन शिक्षा के क्षेत्र और मानवता के उत्थान के लिए समर्पित रहा। भारत के प्रथम उपराष्ट्रपति और द्वितीय राष्ट्रपति के रूप में अपने कार्यकाल के दौरान, उन्होंने भारतीय शिक्षा प्रणाली और दर्शन के महत्व को समझाया। उनकी स्मृति में 5 सितंबर को शिक्षक दिवस के रूप में मनाया जाता है। डॉ. सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन का जन्म 5 सितंबर 1888 को तमिलनाडु के तिरुत्तनी में एक ब्राह्मण परिवार में हुआ था। उनके पिता का नाम सर्वपल्ली वीरस्वामी और माता का नाम सीताम्मा था। उनके पिता उन्हें पुजारी बनाना चाहते थे, लेकिन राधाकृष्णन ने शिक्षा का मार्ग अपनाया। बचपन से ही उन्हें पढ़ने का शौक था और उन्होंने दर्शनशास्त्र का गहन अध्ययन किया। राधाकृष्णन की दर्शनशास्त्र में विशेष रुचि थी। उन्होंने हिंदू दर्शन 'वेदांत' का गहन अध्ययन किया और अपने विचारों में प्राचीन दार्शनिकों के विचारों को आधुनिक विश्व के अनुकूल व्यवस्थित किया। उनके अनुसार, दर्शनशास्त्र मानवता के परम सत्य की खोज है। उन्होंने ईश्वर, धर्म, अध्यात्म और जीवन के उद्देश्य पर कई पुस्तकें लिखी हैं। शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में डॉ. राधाकृष्णन का योगदान अत्यंत महत्वपूर्ण है। उन्होंने मद्रास क्रिश्चियन कॉलेज और कलकत्ता विश्वविद्यालय में दर्शनशास्त्र पढ़ाया। उनकी शिक्षण शैली ने उन्हें एक लोकप्रिय शिक्षक बनाया। उन्होंने पढ़ाते समय विषय के सार को समझाने के लिए सरल और प्रभावी भाषा का प्रयोग किया। उनका मानना ​​​​छ्था कि शिक्षा समाज की प्रगति की कुंजी है।

उन्होंने छात्रों में बौद्धिक क्षमता और आत्मविश्वास के निर्माण पर जोर दिया। शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में महान योगदान देने के बाद, डॉ. राधाकृष्णन ने भारतीय राजनीति में प्रवेश किया। 1947 में भारत के स्वतंत्र होने के बाद, उन्हें यूनाइटेड किंगडम में भारतीय राजदूत नियुक्त किया गया। उन्होंने 1952 से 1962 तक भारत के उपराष्ट्रपति के रूप में कार्य किया। अपने कार्यकाल के दौरान, उन्होंने भारतीय संसदीय प्रणाली और संवैधानिक प्रक्रियाओं में बहुमूल्य योगदान दिया। उन्होंने 1962 से 1967 तक भारत के दूसरे राष्ट्रपति के रूप में कार्य किया। डॉ. राधाकृष्णन एक महान लेखक और वक्ता थे। उन्होंने दर्शन, धर्म, शिक्षा और मानवता पर कई पुस्तकें और लेख लिखे हैं। उनकी पुस्तक 'भारतीय दर्शन' ने विश्व को भारतीय दर्शन से परिचित कराया। उनकी लेखन शैली सरल, किन्तु प्रभावशाली थी। उनके विचारों ने विश्व भर के विद्वानों और दार्शनिकों को प्रभावित किया है। डॉ. राधाकृष्णन का जन्मदिन, 5 सितंबर, भारत में 'शिक्षक दिवस' के रूप में मनाया जाता है। उनके छात्रों ने उनका जन्मदिन मनाने की इच्छा व्यक्त की थी, लेकिन उन्होंने अनुरोध किया कि यह दिन शिक्षकों को समर्पित किया जाए। शिक्षक दिवस के अवसर पर शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में उनके योगदान और महत्व पर प्रकाश डाला जाता है। डॉ. राधाकृष्णन के विचार आज और भी महत्वपूर्ण होते जा रहे हैं। उन्होंने समय-समय पर यह स्पष्ट किया कि शिक्षा केवल ज्ञान प्राप्ति का ही साधन नहीं है, बल्कि समाज परिवर्तन का भी माध्यम है। उनके अनुसार, शिक्षा व्यक्ति के जीवन में सच्चे मूल्यों और आदर्शों का निर्माण करती है।

उनके द्वारा दिए गए विचार आज के समाज में शिक्षा के महत्व को उजागर करते हैं। सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन एक अद्वितीय दार्शनिक, शिक्षाविद् और राजनीतिज्ञ नेता थे। उनके विचारों और कार्यों ने भारत की शिक्षा प्रणाली और दर्शन को एक नई दिशा दी। उनका जीवन एक प्रेरक आदर्श है, जो शिक्षा के माध्यम से समाज के उत्थान की प्रेरणा देता है। उनके सम्मान में, हम शिक्षक दिवस मनाकर उनके विचारों का स्मरण करते हैं। डॉ. राधाकृष्णन द्वारा दिया गया शिक्षा का महत्व आज भी उतना ही प्रासंगिक है जितना उस समय था, और उनकी विरासत को वर्तमान पीढ़ी को आगे बढ़ाना चाहिए।

A TEACHER WITHOUT A SENSE OF SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY IS AN INCOMPLETE TEACHER.

It is a universal truth that a teacher plays a seminal role in the life of his/her students. Our culture and literature is resplendent with inspirational tales about the role of Gurus and teachers in shaping the hand, head and heart of their taught, using their lives and experiences as illustrious examples and lessons. Often drawing live examples and illustrations from the "Supreme Teacher called nature these gurus and teachers curved out for themselves niches in the edifice of our schooling and learning system. Hence we call them Gurus meaning elders and give them an august place, next only to our parents.

All of us do have our favourite teachers, teachers who have imparted to us not only bookish knowledge, worldly gumption, but also showed us affection and personal concern in our interests and career. Such teachers live in us and with us for the values and qualities they have nurtured in us. We always cherish our memories about defining times which made teachers our favourites. Best teachers are those who teach us from books as well as through what they preach and practice. Thoughts about such teachers do take us down the memory lane every year on Teachers Day.

I had studied in a Christian mis-

sion school from LKG to 5th class in Anantapur town. It was run as an aided school and manned by all women teachers. Though all the teachers were very strict in disciplining us, they had shown personal concern for almost all students. Very early in my life, these teachers sowed in me seeds of interests in drama, singing, drawing and other fine arts. Punctually they held a special class for all the students together in the last two hours on every Saturday, called Sunday Class. In that class one teacher would tell us biblical stories and tales of love, faith, affection, service, forgiveness and charity.

I still remember the tale of Job who, like king Harichandra, withstands great afflictions with unwavering and rock steady faith in God that eventually brings back to him all his lost health, wealth, children and cheers. My favourite is the story of a Samaritan saving the life of a stranger, beaten and robbed by thieves. I remember those teachers for instilling in me very early in life that sense of selfless love and charity.

From 6th to 10 class, I had studied in the Government Multipurpose School near the Arts College. The school had spacious grounds and a Junior College wing. Among other teachers, Oblesu sir was my favourite one. He taught us Social Studies and was also in-charge of our Navy Classes. In the five years of my association with him, he made me the captain of the Navy wing and taught me leadership qualities and how to conduct myself in a dignified and impressive manner while dealing with others. In other words, Oblesu sir nurtured in me

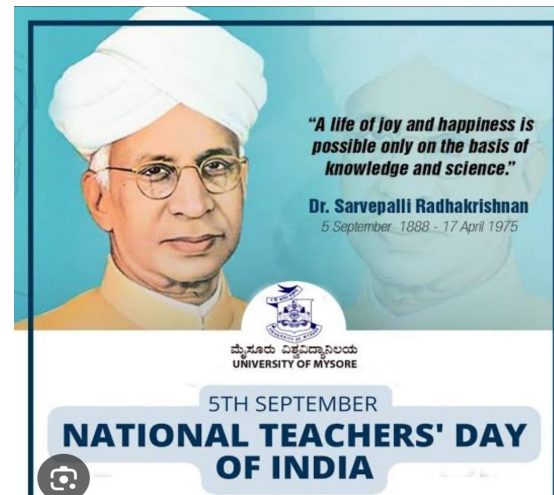
the qualities of leadership and good deportment that helped me a lot in my later years.

My Intermediate studies in the same school premises later on radically changed my interests in academic matters, and views about life in general, thanks to a new, young, handsome Commerce Lecturer, late Lokanantham sir.

Soon a group of five friends struck a deep personal bond with him and he too readily took us into his fold like an elder brother. A good teacher always encourages true friendship among his students. True friendship is something that is above all "isms like regionalism, casteism, religion, social and economic differences. As Gandhiji said, a teachers life is an open book from which students learn life lessons.

Though he belonged to a conservative Vaisya Community, Lokanantham sir was secular to the hilt. He attended all functions in our families and dined sitting with his students. He also attended our birthday parties and gave us trinkets and keepsakes. He took us to movies and discussed them with an open mind. During every summer vacation, before he went to his native place Tirupati, he would hand over his house to our group of friends for months and we chilled out there. All this happened in late 70s and even now we have been members of his family, though, alas, he had passed away suddenly in late 90s. We the five trusted students of Lokanantham sir have been friends for five decades, thanks to his bonding.

It is a pity that today many of our teachers live and work along the



caste considerations and encourage such narrow mindedness among students. And in terms of communal divisions, the less we talk about our universities, the better!

A teacher may be a genius, a great expert in his subject and command respect for his knowledge, yet he should always be simple and humble and these qualities in our Professor Sethuraman sir made him a great favourite with me in my days at SK university, Anantapur.

A Tamil brahmin, Sethuraman sir was a scholar of international fame, yet he never put on airs. He used to come to the department in simple ordinary clothes and on the campus most of the times he would move wearing his traditional dhoti and half sleeve shirts. His greatest quality was his simplicity. Whenever students went to meet him in his chamber, he would stand up and greet his students with folded hands! Had he wanted he would have been a VC in a prestigious university but he was never for

hankering after posts and positions after his retirement. He spent his last days quietly in the Arabindho Ashram in Kanyakumari and passed away like an unsung hero. Yes, Professor Sethuraman was a class of his own. Such teachers influence and mould the personality of his students quietly and lead them like a lodestar.

It needs no saying that mother is our first and best teacher in life. My mother was a teacher by profession and she couldn't bear my lack of interest in studies and chronic habit of bunking school. One day she lost her patience and took me to school, beating me with a stick on the way in full view of my neighbors and the general public! Thus she made me learn a lesson the hard way. This turned a habitual school truant into a college teacher as a punishment for life!

And I don't know whether I succeeded or not in my calling but my students are my best judges.
