Additionally, Minister Lokesh expressed his appreciation to the Prime Minister for the decision to set up a semiconductor unit in the state, highlighting its significance for local development.

CM says that common man reposes faith in judicial system for its transparency and effectiveness

Visakhapatnam: There is a hope for the common man that justice would be meted out when courts are approached. Although justice might be delayed in some cases, it is, however, not denied, emphasised Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu. Speaking at the International Mediation Conference organised in Visakhapatnam on Friday, the Chief Minister mentioned that unlike earlier where people used to feel reluctant to visit courts and litigation is considered as the last resort to look forward to, the trend has completely changed now. "People in the country repose immense faith in the judicial system for its effectiveness and it is quite apparent," the CM underlined. Organised jointly by Trilegal, Asian Centre for International Arbitration and Mediation (ACIAM) and National Law Institute University, Bhopal and sup-



ported by Commonwealth Lawyers Association, London, NIVAARAN, Delhi and IAMC, Hyderabad, the conference saw participation of Supreme Court judge Justice PS Narasimha, Supreme Court Judge Justice Surya Kant, Chief Justice of High Court of Andhra Pradesh DS Thakur, among others. About how technology has become handy in more ways than one, the Chief Minister highlighted how mobile case updates, e-filing, virtual hearings, multi-lingual tools, etc., are mak-

ing the judicial system not just accessible to the common man but also transparent. "Also, online dispute resolution platforms aid in resolving conflicts in any part of the world seamlessly. Artificial Intelligence has to be used judiciously and with block chain, enforcement is made possible across the globe," the Chief Minister explained, adding that there is a need to take the law enforcement way forward incorporating innovativeness along with technology. For the proposed biggest Alternative Dispute

Resolution centre, Naidu assured that the government of Andhra Pradesh is willing to contribute to the ADR ecosystem. "India is taking advantage of new technology. In the past one year, AP is able to mobilise investments to the tune of 100 billion USD. Next month, Google, TCS and Cognizant are going to set up their shops here," the Chief Minister reiterated. From the fourth largest economy currently, Naidu expressed confidence that India is sure to inch towards the third largest economy next year under the able and strong leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. By 2038, India is certain to become the second largest economy in the world. The country is set to become the first largest economy globally by 2047 because of the inherent strengths it has, the Chief Minister expressed confidence.

CM Revanth Reddy offers prayers at Khairatabad Ganesh

In a vibrant celebration of culture and tradition, Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy visited the Khairatabad Vinayaka on Friday to perform special pujas for Bojja Ganapayya, ahead of the immersion of the Khairatabad Maha Ganapati scheduled for Saturday. During his visit, the Chief Minister commended the Khairatabad Ganesh Utsava Committee for their dedication to the festival, which has now been celebrated for 71 years. "The Khairatabad Ganesh Utsava began with a single step 71 years ago, and it has grown into a celebration that resonates across the nation," he remarked.



"I extend my heartfelt congratulations to the festival committee for organising this event with such prestige, despite numerous challenges and losses." He highlighted the government's

commitment to the festival by stating, "We are providing free electricity to Ganesh mandapams, a unique initiative in the country, and we have ensured the festivals take place without any untoward incidents." The Chief Minister also assured that all necessary arrangements for the immersion of Maha Ganapati have been completed. He praised Hyderabad as a shining example of religious harmony and noted that the Khairatabad Ganesh festival has significantly contributed to the positive reputation of Telangana. In a related meeting on the same day, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy held discus-

sions with a delegation from Germany's Bebig Medical Company, led by Chairman and CEO George Chan. The company expressed interest in establishing a medical equipment manufacturing unit in Telangana. Revanth Reddy assured them of the government's full support and instructed officials to research suitable locations and address any pertinent issues. Additionally, he encouraged the company representatives to consider setting up radiation centres for cancer treatment within government hospitals alongside their medical equipment

Andhra Pradesh Assembly Sessions to Commence on 18th September

The Andhra Pradesh Assembly is set to convene from the 18th of September, as announced in a gazette notification issued by State Governor Abdul Nazeer. Assembly sessions will commence at 9 am, followed by the Council sessions at 10 am. Following the first day's proceedings, meetings of the Business Advisory Committee (BAC) for both houses will take place to determine the agenda and duration of the sessions.



However, YSRCP leader Jagan Mohan Reddy has declared that he will not participate in the assembly sessions once again. In light of this, Deputy Speaker Raghuramakrishnam Raju has cautioned YSRCP members that failing to attend for 60 consecutive assembly working days may result in disqualification. In a related development, a special meeting for women MLAs is scheduled to be held in Tirupati on 14th and 15th September. Approximately 300 women MLAs from various political parties across the country are expected to attend the conference. Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly Speaker Ayyannapatrudu revealed to reporters in Narsipatnam, Anakapalle district, that both Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and the Lok Sabha Speaker will grace the event on the first day, while the Governor is scheduled to attend on the final day. Arrangements are also being made for the MLAs to have darshan at the famous Srivari temple during the conference. Ayyannapatrudu confirmed that information regarding the Legislative Assembly sessions has been communicated to all MLAs.

GST rates cut will benefit the poor and middle class, says Yanamala Ramakrishnudu

Senior Telugu Desam Party (TDP) leader and former minister Yanamala Ramakrishnudu has expressed optimism over recent government initiatives aimed at improving the quality of life for the poorer segments of society. He stated that the reduction in Goods and Services Tax (GST) rates would significantly lower consumption expenditures for low-income households. Ramakrishnudu also highlighted the universal healthcare scheme approved by the state government, which he believes will diminish medical costs and further enhance living standards for the common people. He noted that the various welfare schemes introduced by the government would serve as additional income sources for the impoverished, leading to increased savings and greater participation in economic development. According to him, these measures could play a crucial role in poverty alleviation and reducing economic inequalities. The former minister emphasised that the coalition government is diligently working to fulfil its manifesto and implement its "Super Six" programmes, ultimately striving to establish a welfare state.



Weather Alert: Meteorological dept issues alert to AP, Telangana as low pressure weakens

The weather conditions in the coastal states are experiencing a positive shift as the low pressure system in the Bay of Bengal weakens. However, authorities have issued a yellow alert for several districts in Telangana due to the influence of the monsoon trough, currently situated approximately 1.5 km above sea level. According to a statement from the Meteorological Department, residents in various districts of Telangana are urged to exercise caution as the trough impacts local weather patterns. Wind speeds are anticipated to reach between 40-60 km per hour in many areas, accompanied by the likelihood of moderate rainfall. In Andhra Pradesh, meteorological officials are also warning of potential moderate rains in several districts. Fishermen in the affected coastal regions have been advised against venturing out to sea due to the expected gusty winds, which may similarly reach speeds of 40-60 km per hour. Authorities have expressed concerns that road conditions could deteriorate because of the combined effects of rain and wind. Citizens are encouraged to take necessary precautions to ensure their safety during this period of unsettled weather.

CM Chandrababu emphasises judiciary's importance at International Mediation Conference

Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu highlighted the crucial role of the judiciary during his address at the International Mediation Conference, held in Visakhapatnam. The event, organised by ACIAM and Bhopal National Law University, brought together experts and stakeholders to discuss the significance of mediation in the legal system. During his speech, Naidu stressed the necessity of skills in mediation, noting that efficient mediation could offer quick resolutions to disputes. He observed that citizens approach courts with the expectation of receiving justice as their inherent right. The Chief Minister also remarked on India's advancements in technology, announcing that the state government plans to establish a Quantum Valley. He outlined his government's ambition to cultivate an ecosystem conducive to the development of quantum technology, aiming to position the state as a hub for innovation in this emerging field.

Telangana poised for a triangular contest in 2028

As Telangana approaches the 2028 Assembly elections, the state's political arena is brimming with intrigue and strategic maneuvering. The contest is shaping up as a three-cornered fight among the ruling Congress, the resurgent Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), and the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). While the Congress holds power under Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, speculations about shifting alliances—particularly a potential tie-up between the BJP and BRS—have fueled debates. Such a partnership could alter the electoral dynamics, although official denials and internal frictions suggest a more complex reality. This analysis explores the evolving landscape, drawing on recent developments to assess the strengths, challenges, and implications for each player. At the heart of current discussions is the possibility of a pre-poll pact between the BJP and BRS, often described by observers as a “calculated gamble” that could consolidate opposition forces against the Congress. Proponents argue that the alliance would leverage complementary assets. The BJP, with its control over the central government, could funnel resources into major infrastructure projects in Telangana, such as expansion of Hyderabad Metro, Musi Riverfront development, and upgraded road networks. This could provide a compelling development narrative, potentially eroding the Congress's financial edge in campaigning. Additionally, financial facilitation through national banks and schemes could address state-specific needs, like agricultural support amid ongoing urea shortages affecting over 70 lakh farmers. Meanwhile, the BRS brings a robust grassroots network and influential leaders like founder K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), K T Rama Rao (KTR), and T Harish Rao. This organizational strength could enable targeted attacks on the Congress's alleged governance lapses, such as delays in welfare schemes and internal factionalism. Rumours of power-sharing arrangements have circulated, with KTR positioned as a potential Chief Ministerial candidate and Harish Rao eyed for a Union Cabinet role, blending regional clout with national influence. However, these speculations have been met with firm denials. Harish Rao has repeated-

ly asserted that the BRS aims to contest independently, targeting a majority with ambitions of securing up to 100 seats in the 119-member Assembly. Similarly, BJP leaders, including its state president N Ramachander Rao, have dismissed any alliance talks. Union Minister Bandi Sanjay Kumar echoed this, labeling the BRS as “outdated” and ruling out collaborations. Internal strains within the BRS further complicate the alliance narrative. In June, their MLC K Kavitha publicly accused certain party sections of pushing for a merger with the BJP, highlighting rifts within the KCR family and raising questions about succession and stability. Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy dismissed merger talks, underscoring no such discussions were entertained. High-profile defections are reshaping the field. In August, former MLA Guvvala Balaraju joined the BJP, part of a broader trend of political migrations that could influence voter perceptions ahead of 2028. This follows earlier shifts, such as the BJP's absorption of disgruntled leaders from other parties, bolstering its cadre in key regions like northern Telangana, where it secured seven Assembly seats in 2023. The BJP's vote share has surged from seven per cent in 2018 to 14 per cent in 2023 and 35 per cent in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, indicating growing appeal among backward classes (BCs) and urban voters. The BJP is now focusing on local body elections, expected soon, as a prelude to 2028. Party leaders like Sunil Bansal have emphasized high-voltage campaigns targeting BCs, while criticising both Congress and BRS on corruption and anti-people policies. This grassroots push aims to counter the BJP's historical weakness in rural areas, where regional parties dominate. Under Revanth Reddy, the Congress is fortifying its position by emphasizing internal unity and inclusivity. Since its 2023 victory—securing 64 seats against BRS's 39—the party has targeted the state's BC population through enhanced reservations in local bodies (up to 42 per cent) and welfare initiatives. Revanth's youth-oriented, energetic image, backed by the party's high command, positions him as a bulwark against any opposition coalition. The government has also nur-

tured a political-business ecosystem, implementing guarantees like free power for farmers and addressing land issues via an improved version of the Dharani portal. Yet, challenges loom. KTR has accused Congress and BJP of a “secret pact” harming Telangana's interests, citing lost projects and quid pro quo deals. Anti-incumbency could build by 2028 if issues like urea shortages and governance gaps persist. The Congress's performance in southern Telangana, where it won 30 seats in 2023, will be crucial, while urban and northern regions remain vulnerable to BJP inroads. Telangana's politics cannot be isolated from national trends. The BJP's Hindutva agenda has found traction in the state, evident in its 2024 Lok Sabha gains, where it matched Congress's eight seats while BRS drew a blank. The BRS, positioning itself as independent, has tied its support in national matters—like the Vice-Presidential election—to state-specific demands, such as urea supply. This pragmatic stance underscores its regional focus but exposes vulnerabilities amid family dynamics and defections. Economic and social issues will likely dominate the 2028 campaign. Agricultural distress, urban development, and reservations for marginalized groups could sway voters. Opinion polls and analyses suggest a hung Assembly, with some predicting a BJP-Jana Sena Party tie-up or even a post-poll BRS-BJP government. However, the BRS resilience—rooted in its role in Telangana's formation—remains a factor, despite its 2023 setback attributed to anti-incumbency and welfare discrepancies. For now, Telangana appears set for a triangular showdown, with no clear frontrunner. While the underlying logic of a BJP-BRS coalition persists—driven by mutual benefits and anti-Congress sentiment—internal divisions and public denials make it unlikely in the immediate term. As 2028 nears, electoral math, defections, and issue-based campaigns could force realignments. The outcome will hinge on how each party addresses local aspirations amid national pressures, ultimately determining whether Telangana witnesses unified opposition or fragmented mandates.

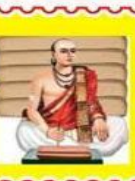

A rainbows splendor, for me and you.

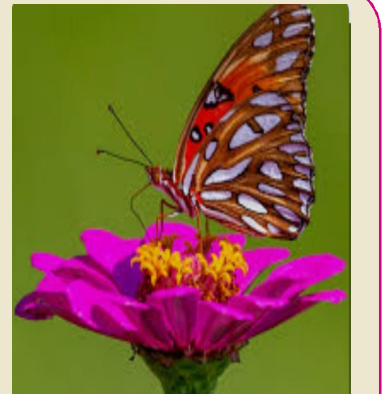

Want to milk my body as much as I can for playing Test cricket: Starc

Sydney: Australia fast bowler Mitchell Starc said his recent decision to retire from T20Is was aimed at preserving his body for Test cricket. He also revealed that he considered giving up one of the two white-ball formats but opted to continue in ODIs with an eye on playing the 2027 World Cup. Starc, who made his T20 international debut in 2012, announced his retirement from the shorter format last week to extend his Test career and set his sights on the 2027 ODI World Cup. "For lack of a better term, I want to milk my body as much as I can for as much Test cricket as possible. That was never going to be off the table. I just felt like one of the other (formats) had to give." "I feel like



I've got plenty to offer the ODI team and with that goal of getting my body to 2027 — but also being good enough to be in that team for the World Cup in 2027. I felt like this was my best opportunity to prolong my Test career and get to that World Cup. "If I wasn't going to be in the frame for 2027 then I didn't want to hold up the spot. I still feel like I've got plenty to offer that ODI team. I'd thought about it for a while. I feel like it was probably a good time. I'm 35 now, Tests have always been my priority and they will remain my priority," Starc was quoted as saying by cricket.com.au on Friday. He also feels the Australia T20I team is in a

great spot in their build-up to the next year's T20 World Cup in India and Sri Lanka. "The T20 team seems pretty settled with the guys that have come in, they've done some great stuff." "Nathan Ellis is flying, Ben Dwarshuis has played a great role, Spencer (Johnson) has done some good stuff when he's played, Sean Abbott as well. I feel like that team is in a great spot and I don't need to interrupt that." Starc signed off by saying he could have informed skipper Mitchell Marsh in advance about his T20I retirement. "I probably should have rang Mitchy. He texted me and said he found out through Instagram. I felt bad about that one - I didn't tell the captain."

Duleep Trophy: Malewar, Shubham fifties lead Central Zone's reply, trail West Zone by 209 runs



Bengaluru: Fifties from Danish Malewar and Shubham Sharma, along with an unbeaten 47 from skipper Rajat Patidar, led Central Zone's strong reply, as they reached 229/2 in 67 overs at stumps on Day Two of their Duleep Trophy semifinal and trail West Zone by 209 runs at BCCI COE Ground 2 here on Friday. In the morning, the West Zone were bowled out for 438 in 108 overs, with Ruturaj Gaikwad's 184 and were supported by fifties from Tanush Kotian (58) and Shardul Thakur (52). But their innings came to a swift end as they lost their last four wickets for 27 runs. Spinners Harsh Dubey and Saransh Jain picked up three wickets each for Central Zone. But Malewar's 76 and Shubham's 60 not out, along with Patidar being unbeaten on 47 off 59 balls, meant Central Zone are still very much in control of the match. Malewar and Aayush Pandey put on a stand of 67 runs for the first wicket. After Pandey fell for 40, Malewar then added 93 runs for the second wicket with Shubham before falling to Dharmendrasinh Jadeja. Patidar looked fluent thereafter to be unconquered at stumps alongside Shubham. For the West Zone, their bowlers struggled to maintain consistency, especially with skipper Thakur and Tushar Deshpande being expensive, while Kotian and Jadeja couldn't sustain pressure. Previously, in the morning, Kotian had a life when Pandey spilt his catch at the gully off Khaleel Ahmed. Thakur, who resumed the day on 24, quickly reached his half-century off 83 balls, as West Zone got past the 400-mark. But a mix-up with Kotian ensured Thakur was run out, which marked the start of a collapse for West Zone. Left-arm spinner Dubey came in to breach Kotian's defences while off-spinner Saransh trapped Jadeja lbw. The duo would eventually end up with three-fers each on a day where the Central Zone got things to move their way. 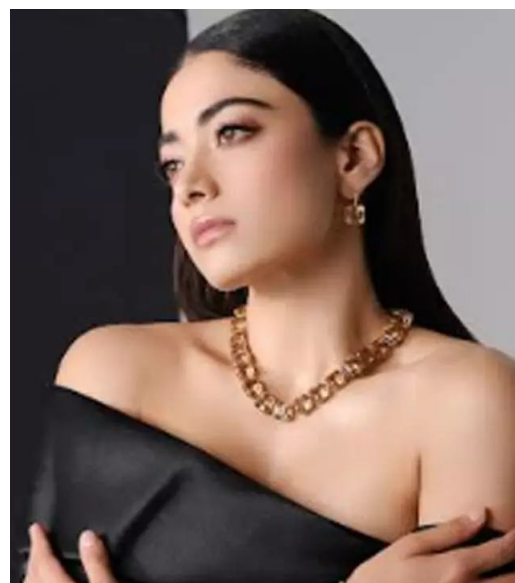

₹2.75 crore in gross advance bookings (excluding blocked seats), which jumps past ₹5 crore once those are included. For comparison, Bade Miyan Chote Miyan (2024) had garnered ₹4.81 crore (non-block), over ₹7 crore (with block), while Ganapath (2023) recorded an unimpressive number which was under ₹3 crore. Heropanti 2 (2022), on the other hand, had an

advanced booking of around ₹5 crore with blocks. Clearly, Baaghi 4 is now poised to become Shroff's most successful pre-sales release yet. The 4th instalment in the Baaghi franchise features an ensemble cast including Sanjay Dutt, Sonam Bajwa, Harnaaz Sandhu, and Shreyas Talpade, and is set to release on September 5.

Cooks bats for flexible new-ball rule in Tests

Former England captain Alastair Cook has suggested that teams in Test cricket should be allowed to take the new ball at any stage within 160 overs, instead of the current rule that mandates a fresh ball only after 80 overs. Cook, who retired from international cricket in 2018, said the change would add flexibility and tactical depth to the longest format of the game. "A new rule I would add would be, how about, in 160 overs, you can take the new ball whenever you want? You have got two new balls for those 160 overs, and you can take that second ball whenever you want. You could take one after 30 overs if you wanted to," he said during the 'Stick to Cricket' podcast.



Former England skipper Michael Vaughan, who was also part of the same podcast, called for greater flexibility in substitutions. said cricket was lagging behind other sports

by restricting replacements to concussion cases alone, citing the recent India-England series where Rishabh Pant batted with a fracture while Dhruv Jurel only kept wickets. "In the first innings of a game, let's say Rishabh Pant takes a knock to his hand. He can still bat but can't keep wickets. Under current rules, India can't bring on another keeper like Dhruv Jurel unless it's a concussion case," Vaughan said. "We have concussion subs. So why don't we have substitutes? All of the other sports have it - why are we allowing the game to be reduced in quality if someone gets a clip," he added.
