



Govt paving way for cleaner streets, better housing, faster Metros, greener cities in new India: PM Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday highlighted how consistent efforts of the government were paving the way for cleaner streets, better housing, faster Metro trains and greener cities as a new, urban India, is taking shape. Responding to an article written by Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri, the Prime Minister said: "Indian cities are turning into engines of growth! Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri outlines how consistent efforts of the government are paving the way for cleaner streets, better housing, faster Metros and greener cities." The minister has stated that "Indian cities are again on that path to being modern yet humane, ambitious yet inclusive, global in outlook yet rooted in our values." The minister further states that "even as we demand more from our cities, we must also pause to acknowledge the distance we have already travelled. For decades after Independence, India's urban spaces were an afterthought. Jawaharlal Nehru's fascination

with Soviet-style centralisation gave us the likes of Shastri Bhavan and Udyog Bhavan, concrete monoliths already crumbling by the 1990s, monuments to bureaucracy rather than service. "By the 2010s, central Delhi presented a dismal sight: Potholed avenues, drab and leaking government buildings, and peripheral roads in the National Capital Region (NCR) that were hopelessly jammed. Expressways were scarce, Metros were confined to a handful of cities, and civic infrastructure was visibly decaying. A country aspiring to global leadership had a capital city that reflected neglect." He further states, "Prime Minister Narendra Modi changed that trajectory. He placed cities at the heart of the national development agenda, treating them not as burdens to be managed but as engines of growth and symbols of pride. The transformation is visible everywhere. The Central Vista redevelopment turned Kartavya Path into a people's space, the new Parliament building into a



future-ready institution, and Kartavya Bhawan into a streamlined hub for governance. Where once there was decay, there is now ambition and confidence." The scale of this change is backed by numbers. Between 2004 and 2014, cumulative central investment in India's urban sector was around ₹1.57 lakh crore. Since 2014, that figure has risen to nearly ₹28.5 lakh crore, a 16-fold increase. This unprecedented

financial commitment is reshaping the urban fabric at a pace India had never seen before, Puri further stated. "India's broader economic and digital surge amplifies this momentum. Today, we are the world's fourth-largest economy at roughly \$4.2 trillion, with digital rails powering everyday life. The Metro revolution illustrates the transformation on the ground. In 2014, India had about 248 km of operational Metro across five cities.

Today, over 1,000 km span more than 23 cities, carrying more than one crore passengers daily. Dozens of new corridors are under construction, from Pune and Nagpur to Surat and Agra, making urban commutes faster, cleaner and safer. This is not just steel and concrete; it is reduced travel times, cleaner air, and millions of hours of productivity returned to citizens. "Urban connectivity has been rewritten. NCR's choked peripheries are being decongested by the newly inaugurated Urban Extension Road II, linking NH-44, NH-9 and Dwarka Expressway to ease traffic at chronic bottlenecks. India's first Regional Rapid Transit System (Delhi-Meerut) is already running on major sections and nearing full commissioning, slashing end-to-end travel to under an hour. These high-speed, integrated systems are defining a new metropolitan logic for a new India," the minister added.

Supreme Court Issues Partial Stay On Controversial Waqf Amendment Act

The Supreme Court delivered a significant ruling on Monday by imposing a partial stay on several controversial provisions of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025. The decision provides interim relief to petitioners who have mounted constitutional challenges against the newly enacted legislation. Chief Justice BR Gavai, leading the bench, clarified that while the court found no grounds to halt the entire Act, specific sections facing legal challenges would remain suspended during the ongoing constitutional review process. The court emphasized that it had conducted a thorough examination of the legislative history dating back to the 1923 Act before reaching this decision. Among the most significant provisions stayed by the court is the requirement that individuals must practice Islam for five years before being eligible to create a Waqf. The court ruled this provision would remain suspended until proper guidelines are established to determine religious practice qualifications. The Supreme Court also blocked the implementation of Section 3C(2), which would have allowed designated government officers to classify properties as non-Waqf based on encroachment reports. Additionally, the court struck down provisions granting Collectors the authority to determine property rights, stating this violated the constitutional principle



of separation of powers. The bench expressed strong concerns about executive authorities making judicial determinations, noting that allowing collectors to decide citizen rights contradicts fundamental governance principles. This represents a significant check on administrative overreach in property disputes. Regarding Waqf Board composition, the court modified provisions to ensure no more than three non-Muslim members serve on Waqf Boards, with a total limit of four non-Muslims on Waqf Councils. The ruling also mandated that ex-officio officers should preferably come from the Muslim community when possible. However, the court chose not to interfere with registration requirements, acknowledging that such mandates have existed intermittently since 1995 and do not represent a novel imposition. The ruling follows extensive deliberations that began in May when the court reserved its decision after three

consecutive days of arguments from both sides. The constitutional challenges stem from amendments passed by Parliament earlier this year, which received presidential assent in April. 2025 was approved by Parliament with substantial majorities in both houses, garnering 288 votes in favor in the Lok Sabha and 128 in the Rajya Sabha. The Centre had previously defended the legislation through the Ministry of Minority Affairs, opposing any blanket judicial stay. Legal representatives for the petitioners expressed satisfaction with the outcome, with lawyer MR Shamshad describing the verdict as "reasonably good" and noting that most challenged provisions had been addressed by the court. Political leaders also welcomed the decision, with Congress MP Imran Pratapgarhi characterizing it as a check on governmental overreach. He highlighted concerns among property donors who feared potential land acquisition by authorities under the new provisions. The Supreme Court's intervention reflects ongoing tensions between religious community rights and administrative authority, setting important precedents for how constitutional challenges to religious legislation will be evaluated. The case continues as the court prepares to hear arguments on the broader constitutional validity of the amended law.

Sarbananda Sonowal recalls how PM Modi's suggestion led to tree plantation drive in Assam

Guwahati: Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal has recalled how a simple suggestion from Prime Minister Narendra Modi during a rally in 2016 led to one of the biggest plantation drives in Assam, which turned tree planting into a people's movement across the state. Minister Sonowal said the incident took place in Guwahati after he had completed his first year as Chief Minister. A massive public rally had been organised to mark the occasion, with thousands of people gathering to hear the Prime Minister. "The atmosphere was electric. The energy of the crowd was overwhelming, and I was seated right beside Modi ji on the stage," Sonowal remembered. As one of the speakers was addressing the gathering, PM Modi's attention, Sonowal said, shifted to something beyond the crowd. Pointing to a tree visible in the distance, PM Modi softly asked him, "Which tree is that?" Sonowal identified it as the 'Krishna Chura', a tree known for its striking, fiery red blossoms, and explained that it grew widely across Assam. "It was at that moment that his visionary instinct came alive," Sonowal said. "He immediately suggested that we should plant more Krishna Chura trees across the state. He told me -- imagine Assam in full bloom, people from all over the world will come to witness its beauty. It will not only strengthen your identity but also boost tourism," Sonowal recalled. Inspired by the suggestion, the then Chief Minister launched an ambitious plantation campaign with a target of planting 10 crore trees. "During my tenure itself, we managed to plant 9.5 crore trees. What began as the Prime Minister's idea soon turned into a people's movement," Sonowal said. According to him, tree plantation gradually became a cultural practice in Assam. People began planting saplings on birthdays, during festivals, and on special occasions, giving a unique social dimension to the campaign. "For me, this was one of the most memorable moments of my life," Sonowal reflected.

ITR deadline: Over 1 crore tax filings expected on last day

Mumbai: As the extended deadline for income tax return (ITR) filing ends on Monday, filers are hurrying to comply, with more than 1 crore returns anticipated on the final day. As of now, 6.29 crore returns have been filed for the assessment year (AY) 2025-26. Last year, ITR filings grew 7.5 per cent year-on-year, and assuming a similar pace, the number could touch 7.8 crore this year. The growth trend has been steady — 6.77 crore returns were filed in AY 2023-24, 5.82 crore in AY 2022-23, and 5.77 crore in AY 2021-22. Tax experts caution that



this year's challenges are intensified by the September 15 deadline for the second installment of advance tax, placing a

dual burden on taxpayers and professionals. Chartered accountants and tax lawyers have said that even with a fully operational portal, the clustering of deadlines would still put a strain on filers. The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) officials have maintained that the system is stable and attributed most issues to browser-related glitches at the user's end. The portal processed a record 70 lakh returns in one day last year. Meanwhile, the Income Tax Department on Sunday refuted reports which claimed that the date of filing tax return has been

extended to September 30. To assist taxpayers for ITR filing, tax payment and other related services, "our help desk is functioning on a 24x7 basis, and we are providing support through calls, live chats, WebEx sessions and Twitter/X," it added. In May, the IT department announced an extension of the due date for filing ITRs for Assessment Year (AY) 2025-26 (for income earned in financial year 2024-25) by individuals, HUFs and entities who do not have to get their accounts audited from July 31 to September 15.

Illegal Construction Boldly Carried Out on Government Land



Visakhapatnam: In the jurisdiction of VRO Uday, under the Papayya Rajapalem Secretariat, illegal construction has been boldly taking place on government land for the past few days. Despite the fact that there is an HD (high-density) line very close to the site, the construction is being carried out without obtaining any permissions. It appears that VRO Uday may have a hand in facilitating this illegal activity.

Locals have made several complaints, prompting Pendurthi Tahsildar Venkata Apparao to previously warn that the illegal construction must be stopped immediately, or strict action would be taken. However, despite these warnings, the individuals involved have continued the illegal construction unabated. Locals now say they plan to file a formal complaint with higher authorities regarding the issue.

Meanwhile, Sunday marked a career-defining moment for actress Britt Lower, who won the Emmy Award for Outstanding Lead Actress in a Drama Series for her performance in Severance. Lower won in a competitive category, beating out Kathy Bates (Matlock), Sharon Horgan (Bad Sisters), Bella Ramsey (The Last of Us), and Keri Russell (The Diplomat). The win was especially meaningful as it marked both Lower's first Emmy nomination and her first win.
