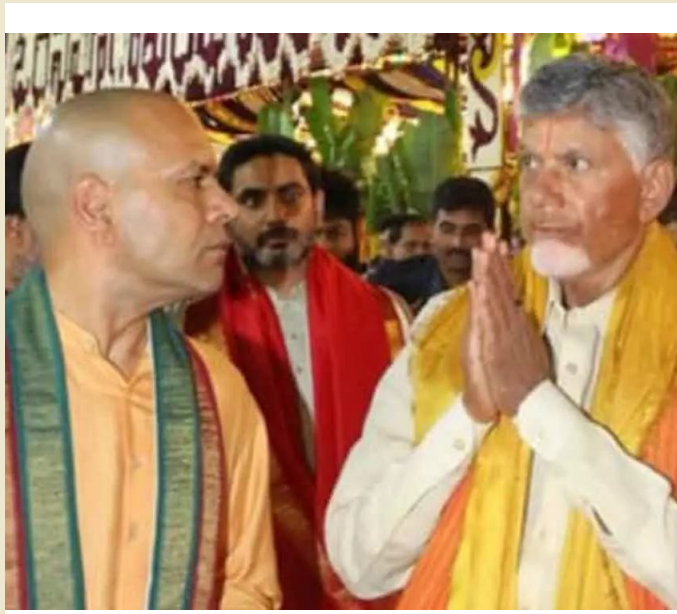
"The history of BJP workers in Delhi has been a unique example of struggle and dedication. Amidst every challenge, they not only kept the organisation alive

The new Delhi BJP office, a five-storey building, has been constructed in South Indian architectural style on a plot of around 825 square meters. The basement of the new office has car parking, ground-floor conference room, reception hall and canteen. On the first floor, there is an auditorium with a seating capacity of 300 people. On the second floor, there are rooms for the various fronts and staff of the party. Advertisement The third floor has been designated for

the offices of the state vice president, general secretary and secretary. On the fourth floor, there are rooms for leaders from other states, while on the fifth floor, there are offices for the state BJP president and state organisation general secretary, as well as the offices of Delhi MPs. The journey of state BJP or Jan Sangh leaders started from Naya Bazar after Independence. During the days of the Jana Sangh, politics was conducted from the office in Naya Bazar in the Walled City. After this, the first office after the establishment of the BJP was built in Ajmeri Gate. Later, it shifted to 20, Rakabganj Road before finally reaching 14, Pandit Pant Marg near Parliament, where it has remained for the past 35 years.

PM Modi Pens Foreword For Italian PM Meloni's Autobiography, Draws 'Mann Ki Baat' Parallel

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has authored the foreword for the Indian release of Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni's autobiography, drawing an interesting comparison between her memoir and his own popular radio broadcast. Modi likened the essence of Meloni's book to his "Mann Ki Baat" program, describing it as her personal voice speaking directly to readers. The Indian edition of "I am Giorgia — My Roots, My Principles," published by Rupa Publications, will soon be available to readers. Modi expressed that writing this foreword was a significant honor, undertaken with deep respect, admiration, and friendship for Meloni, whom he regards as both a patriot and an exceptional leader of contemporary times. Drawing from his extensive experience of engaging with numerous global leaders over the past eleven years, Modi reflected on how each leader's personal journey speaks to something universal. He emphasized that Meloni's life story and leadership style embody timeless principles that resonate strongly with Indian values, particularly her commitment to preserving cultural heritage



while maintaining equal engagement with the global community. The Indian Prime Minister repeatedly highlighted how Meloni's remarkable journey would strike a chord with Indian audiences. He characterized the book as a refreshing narrative of a distinguished modern political figure and patriot, whose story mirrors India's own philosophical values. Meloni's memoir originally appeared in 2021 during her time as an opposition leader in Italy. Her political trajectory reached new heights when she became Italy's first female prime minister the following year. The book has already achieved best-seller status internationally, with its American edition launching in June 2025 with an introduction by Donald Trump Jr. A central theme

of Meloni's narrative revolves around her experiences as a woman in politics. She openly addressed the challenges and discrimination she faced, including smear campaigns targeting her for being a woman, an unmarried mother, and someone who remained politically active during pregnancy. Her memoir contains powerful reflections on proving that motherhood and political ambition are not mutually exclusive but rather complementary. Modi focused particular attention on these themes in his foreword, applauding Meloni for championing motherhood, national identity, and tradition. He articulated his belief that India and Italy share bonds that extend far beyond diplomatic agreements and economic rela-

tions. According to Modi, both nations are united by common civilizational values: protecting heritage, recognizing community strength, and honoring womanhood as a fundamental guiding principle. He described these shared values as the foundation of his personal friendship with Meloni. The relationship between India and Italy has strengthened considerably since Meloni's state visit to India in March 2023, marking the first such high-level engagement from Italy in five years. This visit resulted in upgrading bilateral relations to Strategic Partnership status. The warm rapport between the two leaders gained public attention in late 2023 when the hashtag #Melodi became widely popular on social media platforms. This followed an exchange between Modi and Meloni after she shared a photograph of them together at the COP28 conference in Dubai, playfully combining their names in the hashtag. Modi's response, expressing his pleasure at meeting friends, further fueled the positive public perception of their diplomatic relationship.

State Election Commission sounds poll

Hyderabad: The State Election Commission (SEC) on Monday announced schedule for the local body elections in the state. The elections will be held in five phases including MPTC, ZPTC and Sarpanch elections starting from October 9 and ending on October 25. The State Election Commissioner Rani Kumudini announced the schedule for the local body elections in a press conference here on Monday. There will be elections in two phases for MPTC and ZPTC and in three phases for Sarpanch elections. The first notification will be

issued on October 9 and the election will be held on October 23. The second notification will be issued (for MPTC, ZPTC second phase) on October 13 and election will be held on October 27. The notification for the first phase of Gram Panchayat election will be issued on October 17 and election will be held on October 31. Notification for second phase will be issued on October 21 and election will be held on November 4 and the final phase notification will be issued on October 25 and the election will be held on November 8. Along with election

results will be announced the same day. The MPTC and ZPTC results will be announced on November 11. There are 31,375 polling stations for MPTC and ZPTC elections and 15,522 polling stations for Gram Panchayat elections. There are 5749 MPTCs and 565 ZPTC posts. Total Gram Panchayats are 12733 and total number of voters are 1,67,03,168 including 81,65,894 male, 85,36,770 female and 504 other category voters. The SEC said that the model code of conduct comes into place with immediate effect and asked the DGP and



other officials to strictly implement the same.

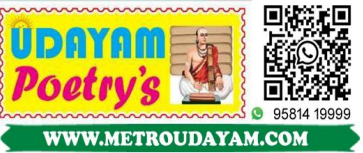

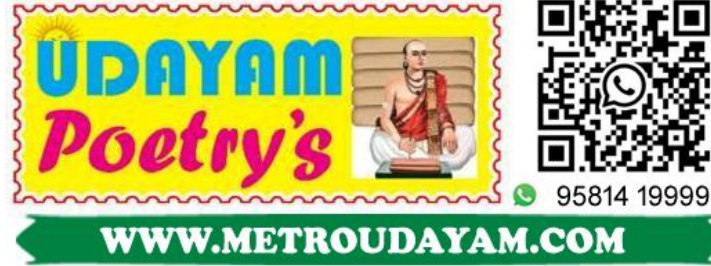

9 lakh health camps organised under Swasth Nari, Sashakt Nari, 3.6 cr people screened: JP Nadda



New Delhi: Nine lakh health camps have been held across the country under the 'Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan', said Union Health Minister JP Nadda on Monday. Speaking at a media event in the national capital, Nadda noted that the health camps have screened over 3.6 crore people for non-communicable diseases, such as hypertension, diabetes, and cancers. "The health initiative that was launched on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's birthday, and will run till Gandhi Jayanti, is called Swasth Nari, Sashakt Nari. So far, 9,00,000 health camps have been organised and each was attended by specialists. Nearly 3.6 crore have already been screened, and I believe we will cross 4 crore by October 2," Nadda said. At the nationwide health camps, citizens have been screened for hypertension, diabetes, breast cancer, cervical cancer, oral cancer, and anaemia. The camps also conducted antenatal check-ups, provided life-saving vaccines to children, and nutrition counselling sessions to families. Further, the health camps also conducted screening for tuberculosis and Sickle Cell Disease, registered blood donors, and issued new Ayushman/PM-JAY cards. The Health Minister noted that the country's health policy has changed over the last decade, and a holistic health approach has been introduced since 2014. "In this approach, we started looking at health by incorporating prevention, health promotion, detection, curative, and palliative parts into our system," Nadda said. As part of this continued approach, the government has established 1,79,000 Ayushman Arogya Mandirs, which serve as the first point of contact to connect with 140 crore citizens. Further, from the very day a woman conceives, ASHA workers start tracking their health, check-up regimen, and share the data with the state government. He also shared the achievements in the rate of institutional deliveries. "Our institutional delivery rate has increased from 79 per cent to about 90 per cent. This progress has been possible because we incentivised ASHA workers. For every mother, the delivery is free, and the transportation to the institution and back home is provided by the government," Nadda said. He also spoke about the health initiatives launched by PM Modi, such as the Fit India Movement, POSHAN Abhiyan, and Khelo India, to promote a healthy lifestyle. The Minister also highlighted a positive change in mental health awareness, and that the availability of high-quality medicines has supported people in leading a normal and healthier life.

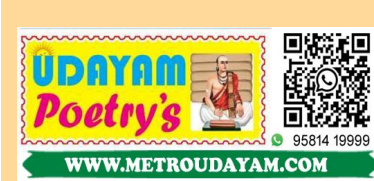

India T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav responded to the Asia Cup trophy row following their five-wicket win over Pakistan in the final, stating that the team's main goal was to play good cricket and win. He emphasised that whether they received the trophy or not was unimportant, adding that seeing smiling faces back home is the real reward for the team.

After beating Pakistan in the summit clash, the Indian team refused to accept the Asia Cup trophy during the presentation ceremony from ACC chief Naqvi, who also serves as the chairman of the Pakistan Cricket Board, Asian Cricket Council, and Pakistan's Interior Minister.

When the presentation ceremony began, which started after a 90-minute delay, India spinner Kuldeep Yadav, opener Abhishek Sharma, and batter Tilak Varma received their individual awards from other dignitaries on stage. When Naqvi stepped onto the dais, the Indian team made it clear they would not accept the trophy from him. Moments later, the trophy was removed from the venue, leaving the champions without their prize.

Speaking to NDTV, Suryakumar reflected on the incident and said, "I think it spoke



volumes. Our main focus was to win matches and play good cricket. It doesn't really matter if the trophy came or not. Smiles on the faces of people back home is our trophy.

"What matters is that my country is happy and we are celebrating. We have billboards in our name that we are the

Asia Cup champions. What more do you need?"

The win in the final was India's third victory over Pakistan in the span of 15 days, which no Indian captain has achieved before Suryakumar, who believes it was "destined" to happen.

"Winning 3-0 was excellent. Incredible show from the boys. They delivered what I expected from them. All the talks that we have had with them – right here in this team room that we are sitting in – have all worked and I'm very happy. Never played them three times in a single tournament. It was destined to happen," the Indian skipper said.

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Talking about how he manages provocative actions from the opposition, Suryakumar said, "I think there is a difference between the two sides. None of us at any point have shown any inappropriate gesture, because we wanted to play this game with dignity. We just wanted to give a nice statement out there while playing a good brand of cricket, irrespective of the result – which can go either way when you are playing."

"Back from the match, when one is talking, there should be a feeling of happiness thinking that they have given all the effort possible at the ground. I keep telling my boys that let's not get deviated from the game. Follow the situation and the game, keeping emotions aside," he further said.

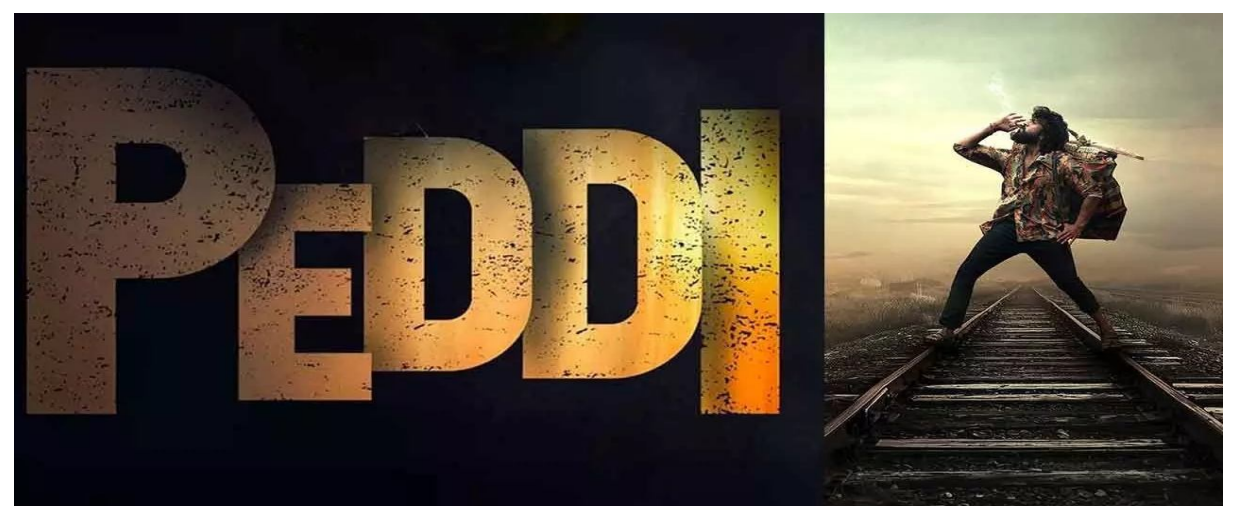
