



Putin Praises Modi's Leadership, Proposes Trade Balance Plan Amid US Tariff Pressure

Russian President Vladimir Putin once again highlighted the strength of India-Russia relations while strongly praising Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership. Speaking at the Valdai discussion forum in South Russia, Putin said that despite mounting pressure from the United States, India would never compromise on its sovereignty or bow down to tariff threats. This comes after US President Donald Trump imposed 50% tariffs on India, half of which targeted its oil trade with Russia, in an attempt to push back against the Kremlin amid the Ukraine conflict. Putin argued that India would face significant losses whether it halted or continued crude imports from Russia, estimating damages at around \$9-10 billion in either scenario. He added that maintaining energy ties with Moscow would not only balance losses but also reinforce India's global standing. Lauding PM Modi, Putin described him as a "balanced and nationally oriented leader" who prioritizes his country's interests above all. He also recalled the deep-rooted ties between India and Russia, stress-



ing that New Delhi has always valued the support it received during its independence movement. To ease trade disparities caused by India's high crude imports, Putin proposed expanding purchases of Indian goods such as agricultural produce and pharmaceuticals. He acknowledged logistical challenges but expressed confidence in further strengthening bilateral economic cooperation. Putin's remarks came shortly after his warm interaction with PM Modi at the Shanghai Cooperation Organization summit

in China, where both leaders showcased their camaraderie. Interestingly, while Trump initially praised Modi as a "great prime minister," he later accused India and China of financing Russia's war in Ukraine through continued oil purchases. Despite shifting narratives from Washington, Putin emphasized that India-Russia relations remain a "privileged strategic partnership" built on trust and mutual respect, with Modi at the helm as a "very wise leader."

Bengaluru infrastructure row: Nara Lokesh's tweet draws sharp response from Priyank Kharge



Bengaluru The debate over Bengaluru's poor infrastructure and pothole-ridden roads has once again triggered a political war of words. Recently, Andhra Pradesh minister Nara Lokesh had called on IT companies to shift to his state after several industry leaders expressed concerns about the city's failing infrastructure. BlockBux CEO Rajesh Yabaji and veteran entrepreneur Mohandas Pai had taken to social media, highlighting the plight of Bengaluru's roads and embarrassing the Karnataka Congress government. Following their criticism, the state government promised immediate measures, including filling potholes and assuring better infrastructure for IT firms. Yabaji later clarified that his company had no intention of leaving Bengaluru. However, the controversy refuses to die down. On Thursday, Lokesh again weighed in on social media, only to face a sharp rebuttal from Karnataka's IT-BT minister Priyank Kharge. Responding to a post by an X user, Christine Mathew Philip, who said many start-ups and firms were moving towards North Bengaluru and Whitefield due to the crumbling Outer Ring Road, Lokesh commented: "Yes, the north side is somewhat better. But if you go a little further north, Anantapur is even better. We are developing a world-class aerospace and defense ecosystem there." Priyank Kharge hit back with biting sarcasm, saying: "It is natural for weak systems to attempt to strengthen themselves. There's nothing wrong with that. But when such efforts reach a point of desperation, they only weaken further." Kharge went on to list Bengaluru's achievements and growth trajectory, asserting that the city remains one of the strongest global hubs. "Bengaluru is projected to witness 8.5% GDP growth until 2035, making it one of the fastest-growing cities in the world. Property values are expected to rise by 5% in 2025," he noted. He further highlighted that Bengaluru consistently ranks high in global indices of urbanization, innovation, and economic growth. "By 2025, the city's population is projected to reach 14.4 million, growing annually at 2.76%. It is among India's top migration hubs," Kharge stated. In a parting shot, he quipped with a pointed metaphor, asking rhetorically: "What do you call a living being that survives only by sucking nutrients from another?" a jibe clearly aimed at Lokesh.

Banni Festival Clash in Devaragattu Leaves Two Dead and Over 100 Injured

In a tragic turn of events, the Banni festival in Devaragattu, Kurnool district, turned deadly on Thursday night as devotees clashed over the transportation of deity idols. The annual celebration, which commenced at midnight, escalated into violence as two rival groups fought fiercely, each determined to claim the idols for their respective areas. The confrontation involved devotees wielding sticks wrapped in rings, leading to chaos as both



sides engaged in a fierce battle. Tragically, two devotees lost their lives during the clash, while over 100 others sustained injuries. The injured were promptly transported

to Adoni Hospital for medical attention. The Banni festival, a long-standing tradition in Devaragattu, witnesses enthusiastic participation from devotees across the region. On this occasion, adherents from three villages confronted those from seven others, all in an effort to safeguard the cherished deity idols. The festival, marked by its fierce rituals, draws not only local residents but also spectators from distant locations eager to witness the combative display. The events of last night have cast a shadow over what is typically a vibrant celebration, leaving the community in mourning.

Telangana to receive rains, yellow alert issued

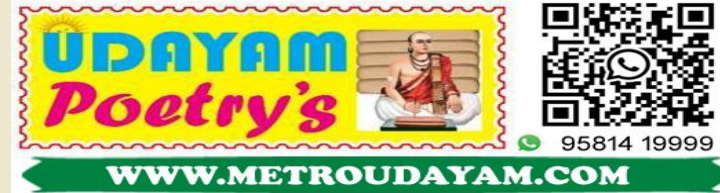


A cyclonic storm has made landfall on the coast of South Odisha and North Andhra Pradesh today (Friday), moving in a north-northwesterly direction. The Meteorological Department has announced that the storm will impact the state of Telangana, issuing a yellow alert across all districts. Residents can expect moderate to heavy rainfall in various areas, with winds reaching speeds of 40 km/h accompanied by light thunder and lightning in some regions. Specifically, districts likely to experience significant rain include Suryapet, Khammam, Bhadradi Kothagudem, Mahabubabad, Janagama, Warangal, Hanumakonda, Mulugu, Bhupalpally, Karimnagar, Peddapalli, Mancherla, Jagtial, and Hyderabad. Authorities are advising residents to remain vigilant as the situation develops.

Surrender is the only way forward for naxals



Even after independence, three major internal challenges have long plagued the nation: Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir, separatist militancy in the Northeast, and the scourge of naxalism. The first two issues have been effectively addressed under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Now, the country is witnessing the final phase of dismantling the third: Left-wing extremism, aka Naxalism. Also Read - Dairy plays crucial role in rural economy: Amit Shah at inauguration of Rs 325 crore Sabar plant in Rohtak At the recently held "Bharat Manthan" event organised by the Dr Syama Prasad Mookerjee Research Foundation, Union Home Minister Amit Shah categorically rejected overtures from naxal factions calling for talks and ceasefires. He made it clear that while the government is committed to the Constitution and the rule of law, those who have chosen the path of violence will not be welcomed with open arms by simply declaring their intent to lay down arms. I had the opportunity to attend this event and offer insights into the social, political, and developmental challenges in Maoist-affected areas. What has brought the nation to this turning point is not just the success of security operations, but a broader national effort encompassing social awareness, developmental initiatives, and democratic empowerment. In his Independence Day address this year, the Prime Minister spoke with heartfelt concern about how tribal communities have suffered immensely due to naxal violence. Generations of tribal families have lost their youth—bright, promising minds misled into armed struggle. This loss is not just personal but a national tragedy. The government is therefore striving to empower tribal communities, offering educational and developmental support to enable their youth to compete globally and showcase their talents. However, the Maoist leadership continues to obstruct this progress. By hiding behind forests and portraying themselves as protectors of tribals, they seek to maintain their grip through intimidation and misinformation. The government has consistently offered naxals a chance to participate in the democratic process. However, rather than engage constructively, they have aligned with anti-national forces and sought weapons from external sources. This betrayal of the democratic spirit has left the government with no option but to act decisively. Several factions within the Maoist movement remain at odds with one another, yet their capacity for disruption remains a shared threat. Some claim to have laid down arms and call for dialogue, while others have rejected even that. But the Centre maintains a firm and unified position: the time for negotiations has passed. Surrender is not a matter of public declaration—it is a responsibility. The only path remaining is to join the democratic mainstream and work the constitutional framework. The perception of naxalites has undergone a dramatic transformation in public opinion. Once seen by some as revolutionaries, they are now widely regarded as domestic threats. This change did not happen overnight. It is the outcome of years of brutal killings, often targeting the very people they claim to protect. Their acts of violence against police, elected leaders, and especially tribal villagers accused of being "informants" have eroded any residual sympathy. In the last two decades (2005-2025), an estimated 10,500 to 12,000 people have lost their lives to naxal-related violence. Of these, around 3,500 to 4,000 were civilians, and approximately 2,500 to 3,000 were personnel from the police and central security wings. The rest belonged to the Naxal cadre. Most of the civilians killed were tribal villagers, targeted under suspicion of collaboration with authorities. In Chhattisgarh alone, official records show that police registered over 2,000 such cases in the past 20 to 25 years. In August 2024, for instance, the brutal murder of Nilso alias Banti Radha in Khammam district's Charl mandal caused widespread outrage among Dalit and tribal communities. Once a committed Maoist, she was executed by her own organisation. Her death exposed deep fissures within the Maoist ranks—ranging from forced recruitment and internal violence to systemic abuse of cadres seeking a return to normal life. Between 2001 and 2024, naxals killed at least 1,623 tribals in the Bastar region alone. In 2020, Bijapur district recorded 25 such murders. These so-called "people's courts" are nothing more than instruments of fear, designed to terrorise villagers and deter any cooperation with development initiatives. It is precisely this legacy of violence that prompted Prime Minister Modi to highlight the issue during his Independence Day speech. Bastar, once a region associated with landmines and gunfire, is now making headlines for its youth taking part in sports and national development.

It rests in peace with the sweetness of grain.

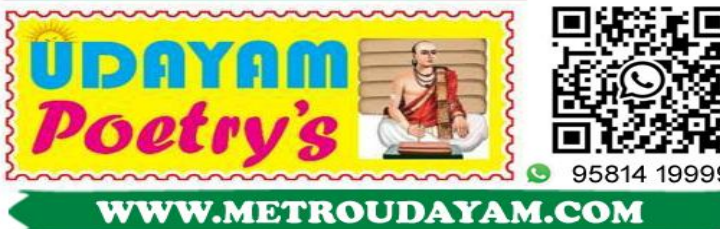

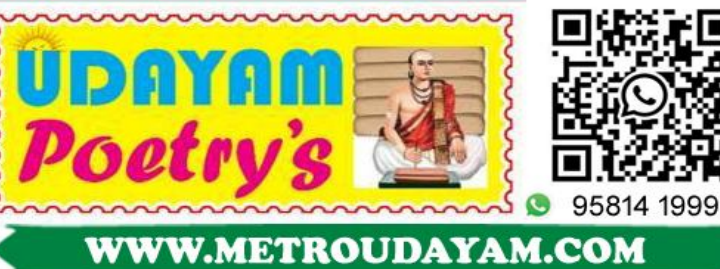

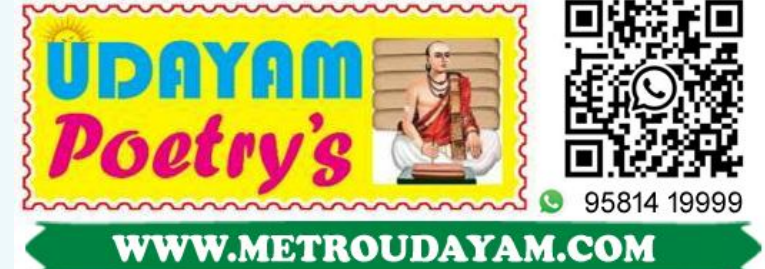

Scattered rains likely in north Andhra as cyclonic circulation makes landfall



The Meteorological Department has reported that a severe cyclonic circulation has made landfall near Gopalpur, located on the northern coast of South Odisha. The storm is now moving north-northwestwards and gradually weakening. As a result, rainfall in the northern coastal districts has reduced; however, forecasts indicate a possibility of scattered rain in many areas tomorrow (Friday), with heavy rain expected in one or two locations. Officials have cautioned that the extensive rainfall in Odisha and Chhattisgarh may lead to increased inflow in rivers within the Godavari, Srikakulam, and Vizianagaram districts, urging residents to remain vigilant. In Srikakulam district specifically, authorities have noted rising flood levels attributed to the precipitation in Odisha. Significant flooding is currently affecting the Vamsadhara, Nagavali, Bahuda, and Mahendranaya rivers, prompting the issuance of a first danger warning near the Gotta Barrage. Water is being released from the Vamsadhara at the Gotta Barrage to manage the situation. Flooding has led to water entering the Pathapatnam RTC Complex and Mahendranagar Street. Consequently, officials have issued alerts to residents in nearby river basin areas. A control room has been established at the Srikakulam Collectorate for assistance, and locals are encouraged to report any issues by contacting 08942-24055.
