



PM Modi, Mongolian Prez Ukhnaa plant sapling at Hyderabad House

Prime Minister Narendra Modi met Mongolian President Khurelsukh Ukhnaa at Hyderabad House in New Delhi on Tuesday. The two leaders warmly greeted each other and planted a sapling before proceeding to hold talks. Earlier in the day, Khurelsukh Ukhnaa paid tribute to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat. "Together for a peace-loving and harmonious world. President Khurelsukh Ukhnaa of Mongolia paid homage to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat this morning," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) posted on X.

Khurelsukh Ukhnaa arrived in New Delhi on Monday for a four-day State Visit to India. Union Minister of State for Civil Aviation and Cooperation, Murlidhar Mohol, received him at the airport. Jaiswal said that Khurelsukh Ukhnaa was accorded a Guard of Honour and a ceremonial welcome at the



airport. This is Ukhnaa's first visit to India after assuming office.

Extending a warm welcome to the Mongolian President, the MEA, in a post on X wrote, "Reinforcing the deep civilisational bonds between our countries. President Khurelsukh Ukhnaa of Mongolia has arrived in New Delhi on a State Visit to India. He was accorded a Guard of Honour and a

ceremonial welcome at the airport." According to the MEA statement, President Droupadi Murmu will meet Khurelsukh Ukhnaa and host a banquet in his honour. Vice President C.P. Radhakrishnan, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar are expected to call on the visiting dignitary.

"Diplomatic relations between India and Mongolia were established

in 1955. Over the past seven decades, the two countries have developed a close and multifaceted partnership, anchored in shared cultural and spiritual links and democratic values. The partnership spans across sectors such as defence and security, parliamentary exchanges, development partnership, energy, mining, information technology, education, healthcare, and cultural cooperation," read a statement issued by the MEA. "India and Mongolia are Strategic Partners, Spiritual Neighbours, and Third Neighbours. The forthcoming State Visit will provide an opportunity for the leadership of India and Mongolia to review progress in bilateral relations, set the vision for strengthening the strategic partnership, and exchange views on regional and global issues of mutual interest," it added.

Nara Chandrababu Naidu Welcomes Google's \$15 Billion Investment in AP

Recognised by the UK Tech Nation Ecosystem, Kalyani's pioneering work has attracted attention within the UK's innovation ecosystem. Her vertical farming model directly aligns with the Tech Nation Promising Talent criteria — combining technical innovation, leadership, and global collaboration. She has demonstrated measurable innovation through the integration of IoT and data-driven resource management; leadership through mentoring students and non-coders in India and the UK; and global impact potential by connecting sustainable UK technologies to local communities in Visakhapatnam. It's humbling to know that what started as a small idea can now be part of something global she reflects. Giving Back Where It All Began Even as her company grows in London, Kalyani continues to nurture her roots in Andhra Pradesh. She has launched pilot vertical farming projects and hands-on training sessions in Visakhapatnam, showing students and small business owners how simple sensors and automation can make farming efficient and eco-friendly. TSUTF demand for stay of order Deputation the teachers inspection of schools

Jangaon, October 14, Metroodayam:

TSUTF district president Chandrasekhar Rao said that it was not proper for the government to issue orders for the formation of a committee by the teachers working in the schools for continuous inspection of the schools and appointing two MEOs for the zone for inspection was the right solution. According to the government order, 270 primary schools in the district will be given 3 teams of 3 members each. Each team will have 3 members



for each of the 64 primary schools. Orders have been issued to form 2 teams of 9 members each for inspection of 103 High Schools. This means that 30 teachers in the district will be absent from the schools they work in for the entire academic year. The orders stated that they would be adjusted from the additional schools in their place. But the fact is that since the beginning of the academic year, educational programs have been hampered due to various

reasons. On the one hand, in the name of vocational trainings, trainings for local body elections, and promotions, for a few days, schools are facing many difficulties in conducting educational teaching, and the vacancies due to promotions have not been filled even through adjustment. There is a shortage of teachers in most elementary, some high schools. It is not enough to form teams with teachers now, it is like a palm leaf falling on a barking fox, it is not wrong to carry out

an inspection of schools, but the method chosen for it is not right, instead of temporary arrangements, permanent arrangements should be made for teachers to be promoted and the posts of Mandal Education Officer should be filled, two MEOs for each mandal should be given one for educational programs and another for administrative programs. The inspection of the schools by the teachers was not proper and the order should be withdrawn immediately.

Kumble lauds 'clinical and consistent' Team India fow series sweep over WI

New Delhi: Former India cricketer and coach Anil Kumble has lauded Team India's "clinical and consistent" all-round show in the series win over the West Indies after beating the visitors by seven wickets in the second Test here at Arun Jaitley Stadium on Tuesday. This was India's tenth straight win against the West Indies and overall 122th Test win, going past South Africa to No. 3. "A commanding performance by Team India throughout the series... Clinical and consistent with both ball and bat. Congratulations. Well done WI for putting up a fight in the second test match," Kumble shared on X. The victory marks India's first Test series win under Shubman Gill's captaincy, following the drawn 2-2 result in England earlier this year. Though the margin suggests an easy victory, India were to earn it in New Delhi and defeat the West Indies for the tenth straight time in Tests. Former cricketer S Badrinath lauded Gill's captaincy and his evolution as a batter. "Shubman Gill's evolution



since the England tour has been pure class both as a batter and a captain," he posted on X. India needed exactly an hour on day five to complete a seven-wicket win over the West Indies and seal a 2-0 series sweep. KL Rahul anchored the chase with an unbeaten 58 off 108 balls, hitting six fours and two sixes to help India easily hunt down 121. West Indies, asked to follow on, refused to fold easily, thanks to John

Campbell and Shai Hope's twin centuries and a defiant last-wicket 79-run stand which led to the contest stretching to day five. But once play resumed, India made quick work of the chase despite an early wobble and earned 12 valuable points to their World Test Championship tally. With the win, India remains third in the World Test Championship table, but their point percentage rose to 61.9 per cent.

Arrayed like festoons in the Facades of lives.

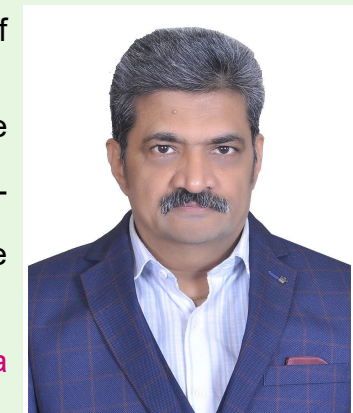
But my hopes find no echo -

The Modi Government supports street vendors to grow their business. One way is the PM SVANidhi scheme. It started on June 1, 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic. The scheme gives vendors financial help at low interest. Vendors can get loans of Rs 15,000, 25,000, or 50,000. The scheme offers a 7% interest subsidy for regular repayment. There is also a cash-back of up to Rs 1,600 per year for using digital payments. There are no pre-closure charges on the loans.

Street vendors with a Certificate of Vending or Identity Card issued by Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) can apply. Vendors who were not included in surveys or new vendors can apply with a Letter of Recommendation (LoR) from ULBs or Town Vending Committees (TVCs). Applications can be made online on the PM SVANidhi portal or at Common Service Centres (CSCs). Loans are given through banks, NBFCs, microfinance institutions, and SHG banks. Basic KYC documents like Aadhaar or voter ID are required. The scheme helps street vendors start or grow their businesses easily. It gives financial support, encourages digital payments, and is available to all eligible vendors, even those missed in surveys.

Rahul hits unbeaten 58 as India beat WI by seven-wicket to sweep series 2-0

New Delhi: India needed exactly an hour on day five to complete a seven-wicket win over West Indies and seal a 2-0 series sweep at the Arun Jaitley Stadium on Tuesday. KL Rahul anchored the chase with an unbeaten 58 off 108 balls, hitting six fours and two sixes to help India easily hunt down 121. The victory marks India's first Test series win under Shubman Gill's captaincy, following the drawn 2-2 result in England earlier this year. Though the margin suggests an easy victory, India were to earn it in New Delhi and defeat West Indies for the tenth straight time in Tests. West Indies, asked to follow on, refused to fold easily, thanks to John Campbell and Shai Hope's twin centuries and a defiant last-wicket 79-run stand which led to the contest stretching to day five. But once play resumed, India made quick work of the chase despite an early wobble and earn 12 valuable points to their World Test Championship tally, where they are still at number three and their points

percentage now at 61.9. It was a brave fight from the West Indies, who showed grit and character after a heavy innings defeat in Ahmedabad. Yet, in the end, India's depth and composure, despite spending 200 overs on the field, proved to be decisive, as Rahul, Gill and Yashasvi Jaiswal were amongst the run-makers, while Kuldeep Yadav picked eight wickets on a pitch which was slow and docile. The day began with KL Rahul and B Sai Sudharsan playing out four maidens before the latter broke the shackles by dancing down the pitch to loft Jomel Warrican through the line over mid-off for four. Though it was followed by a bit of prodding and defending against Warrican and Khary Pierre, Rahul kept India steady by dancing down the pitch again — this time off Pierre — and lofted over long-on for six, before whipping the spinner off his wrists through mid-wicket for four more. Sudharsan added only nine runs to his overnight



total, before his outside edge on an attempted drive was caught by a sharp one-handed diving catch from Shai Hope at slip off Roston Chase's bowling. Rahul continued to be at his pristine best by sweeping Warrican for a flat six over square leg fence, while Shubman Gill stepped down the pitch to loft Chase over long-on for another maximum. A ball later, Gill went back in the crease to pull Chase through square leg for four, before miscuing a loft to mid-wicket off the West Indies' skipper. Rahul, though, got his fifty through a sweep fetching him required two runs and followed it up by reverse-sweeping Warrican

through backward point for a boundary. After some solid forward defence, Dhruv Jurel got off the mark with a late dab off Chase going through third man for four, before Rahul finished off the chase with a backfoot punch fetching him a boundary and seal a comfortable win for India.
