



State admin on high alert

Amaravati: Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, who placed the state machinery on high alert on Saturday, following IMD's warning that Cyclone Montha is expected to make landfall near Kakinada with heavy to very heavy rains and gales along the Andhra Pradesh coast between October 27 and 29, has got down to the nitty gritty of the state's preparedness.

During a review on Sunday with senior officials, Naidu directed all departments to be fully prepared to minimise loss of life and property as the system, currently over the Bay of Bengal, is forecast to intensify into a severe cyclonic storm by Monday morning. Since the stretch from Machilipatnam to Kakinada is likely to bear the brunt of the cyclone's impact, the Chief Minister stressed that alerts should reach every village in time. He instructed officials to send early warnings to the public through SMS, IVRS calls, social



media, and WhatsApp, ensuring real-time information dissemination from village to state level. He said that relief and rescue measures must be coordinated across departments. He mentioned that both the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) teams have been deployed in vul-

nerable districts.

Naidu asked irrigation and revenue officials to closely monitor water levels in reservoirs and major irrigation projects. "Reservoir levels should be tracked continuously, and prompt action taken wherever required," he said, directing immediate preventive steps to avoid breaches to

tanks, ponds, and canal embankments. The Chief Minister said that 27,000 telecom towers across the state have been equipped with diesel generators to maintain connectivity, while contingency plans have been drawn up to ensure uninterrupted power, telecom, and drinking water supplies. District collectors have been told to declare holidays for educational institutions depending on the cyclone's severity and to evacuate people from coastal habitations to cyclone shelters without delay.

Naidu wanted cranes, JCBs, and power saws to be kept ready at every subdivision to clear fallen trees and debris. He suggested that drones be deployed for rapid damage assessment. He emphasised the need for coordinated action among various departments, saying the government machinery must "take full responsibility for the safety of people, their property, and critical infrastructure". Officials informed the

Chief Minister that 11 preparatory meetings had been conducted so far on cyclone readiness. The state has positioned 851 JCBs, 757 power saws, and enough cranes for emergency operations along key highways. The Chief Minister directed the Agriculture Department also to work with the Real-Time Governance (RTG) system to assess crop losses and take immediate relief measures. He specifically instructed that all 82 mechanised and 37 motorised fishing boats currently at sea be brought back safely to shore. Andhra Pradesh Eastern Power Distribution Company Limited (APEPDCL) CMD Prithviraj said that control rooms have been set up across 11 districts to ensure uninterrupted power supply, especially to hospitals, relief centres, and communication networks. He said employees' leave between October 27 and 29 has been cancelled. He advised the public to avoid contact with fallen electric poles and wires and urged them to report electrical issues through helpline 1912.

IMD warns of heavy rain in TN, AP, Odisha

New Delhi: The Indian Army has been placed on high alert as twin weather systems over the Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal intensify into Cyclone Montha, expected to make landfall on Tuesday. The IMD has warned of heavy rain, strong winds, and possible flooding across Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Puducherry. The Indian Army is working closely with the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), IMD, and respective state administrations to ensure a swift and coordinated response once the storm makes landfall. Officials said the army has activated its Disaster Response Columns (DRCs) across southern and eastern regions, with dedicated and reserve units deployed in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Kerala, West Bengal, and the Lakshadweep Islands. Control rooms have been set up for 24-hour coordination with disaster agencies to enable timely evacuation, relief, and rescue operations. According to the IMD's latest forecast issued on Sunday, a deep depression over the southeast Bay of Bengal about 610 km west of Port Blair and 790 km east-southeast of Chennai, is expected to intensify into Cyclone Montha within 24 hours. The system is likely to strengthen further into a severe cyclonic storm by October 28 before crossing the Andhra Pradesh coast between Machilipatnam and Kakinada that evening or night. Wind speeds are expected to reach 90-100 kmph, gusting to 110 kmph, when the cyclone makes landfall. Govt committed to develop temples: Anam



Nellore: Endowments Minister Anam Ramanarayana Reddy asserted that the government is committed to bringing past glory to the ancient temples by reconstructing them across the State. He laid foundation for the reconstruction of Sri Kodandarama Swamy temple at Kavaliyedavalli village of AS Pet mandal in Atmakur constituency on Sunday. The Minister said it was also decided to construct village deities by spending Rs 5 lakh for each structure and as part of this, Rs 3.5 crore were sanctioned for the construction of 77 Village Deities temples in Atmakuru constituency. Earlier, Minister Anam laid foundation stone for construction of water tank with Rs 51 lakh under Jal Jeevan Mission in the village. Atmakur RDO Pavani and local leaders were present.

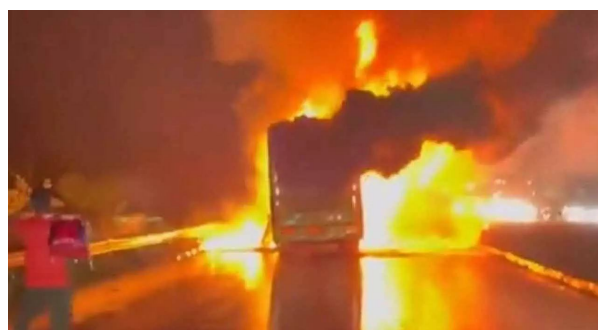
Aster DM Healthcare delegation meets CM Naidu in Dubai

Kurnool mishap: Road safety should be a priority, not an afterthought

Full details of the horrific Kurnool bus mishap in Andhra Pradesh, in which 20 people died, are yet to come out, but the accident proves for the nth time that the authorities in our country are not proactive but reactive—and that too in a slow and slipshod manner. For a few days before this, a fire in a moving AC sleeper bus burned at least 20 passengers alive and wounded 15 on the Jaisalmer-Jodhpur Highway. Even the Rajasthan tragedy did not wake up the officials concerned in other states. To be sure, intercity private buses are generally doing a good job by providing comfortable travel to passengers at reasonable prices; the entrepreneurs running these services are doing what the Railways has failed to do despite its massive resources and government support. It is a measure of government incompetence and apathy at all levels, Central as well as state, that the authorities haven't even been able to come up with realistic rules and regulations to ensure smooth and safe operations by private bus companies.



Despite the vital role these buses play, the regulatory framework governing them remains chaotic and outdated. Operators are required to obtain multiple clearances—from transport authorities, road safety departments, and local administrations—but these are often reduced to paperwork rather than meaningful checks. Vehicle fitness certifications, driver training standards, and fire safety inspections are either perfunctory or routinely bypassed through bribes and middlemen. The Kurnool tragedy underlines the tragic consequences of this regulatory vacuum. Most intercity

buses, particularly AC sleeper coaches, are not equipped with basic fire-suppression systems or emergency exits that meet modern safety standards. In many cases, buses are illegally modified—wooden interiors, non-standard electrical fittings, and extra berths are added to increase revenue, often at the cost of passenger safety. Drivers are overworked, maintenance schedules are ignored, and routes are extended beyond legal limits. Authorities, who are supposed to monitor and enforce the rules, remain invisible until an accident occurs. Equally troubling is the lack of coordination between state and Central agencies. Road transport is a shared responsibility, yet each level of government tends to pass the buck to the other. The Centre frames the Motor Vehicles Act, but implementation is left to the states. State transport departments, underfunded and understaffed, struggle to monitor thousands of buses running across districts and borders. The result is a patchwork of oversight, with no unified safety protocol, no centralized inspection system,

and no real-time monitoring of bus operations. When accidents occur, the official response follows a predictable script: expressions of condolence, a promise of compensation, an inquiry committee, and a few suspensions. Rarely does such outrage translate into lasting reform. The committees set up after each tragedy submit reports that are soon forgotten. Meanwhile, transport authorities continue to function with the same inefficiency and complacency. The problem is not that India lacks regulations—it is that the existing ones are outdated, poorly enforced, and riddled with loopholes that unscrupulous operators exploit with ease. What India needs urgently is a comprehensive framework for intercity bus transport that emphasises safety as much as efficiency. This includes stricter (but not anti-business) vehicle design standards, periodic safety audits, fireproof materials in sleeper coaches, and mandatory driver rest intervals. Technology can help too. Road safety should be a governance priority, not an afterthought.

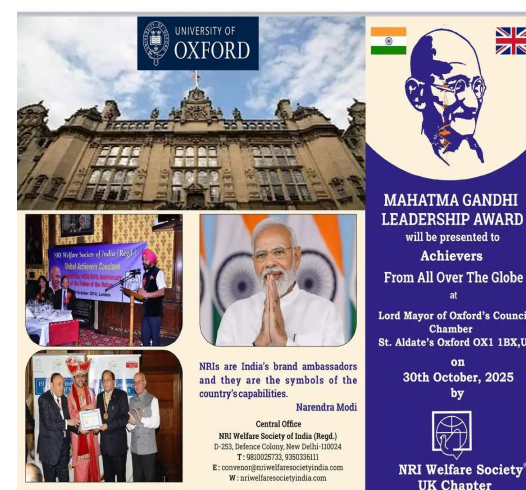
