



Severe Cyclone Montha Intensifies: Red Alert Issued for Andhra Pradesh

Cyclone Montha is steadily gaining strength as it approaches the coast, having recently intensified into a severe cyclonic storm. In light of the developing situation, authorities have issued a red alert for the state of Andhra Pradesh.

Currently located over the west-central Bay of Bengal, Cyclone Montha is tracking north-north-west at a speed of 12 km per hour. As of now, it is approximately 160 km south-southeast of Machilipatnam, 240 km



south-southeast of Kakinada, and 320 km south-southwest of Visakhapatnam.

Additionally, the cyclone is situated 530 km south-southwest of Gopalpur in Odisha.

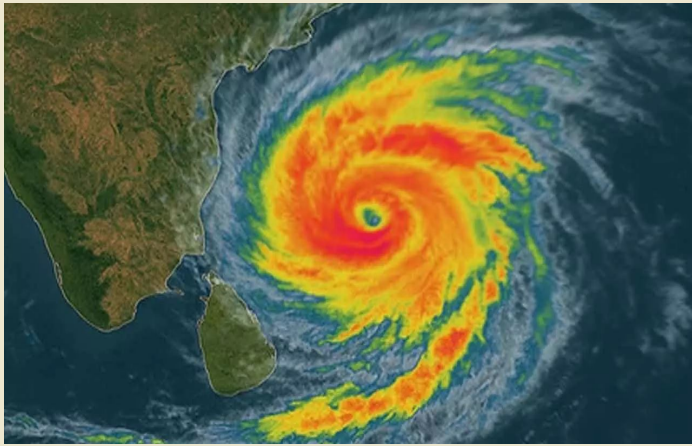
Meteorological Department officials predict that the storm is expected to make landfall between Machilipatnam and Kalingapatnam, near Kakinada, later this evening or tonight. Wind speeds are anticipated to reach between 90-100 kilometres per hour, with a maximum gust of 110 kilometres per hour at the time of coastal impact.

Cyclone Montha: Danger signal seven hoisted at Kakinada Port



With severe cyclone 'Montha' in the Bay of Bengal racing towards the Andhra Pradesh coast, authorities have hoisted danger signal number seven at Kakinada port. Cyclone Warning Centre, Visakhapatnam, has issued danger signal number six at Visakhapatnam and Gangavaram ports. Danger signal number five has been hoisted at Machilipatnam, Nizampatnam and Krishnapatnam ports. Informatory messages have been sent to Kalingapatnam, Bheemunipatnam and Vadarevu ports. According to India Meteorological Department (IMD), cyclonic storm Montha over westcentral Bay of Bengal moved north-north-westwards with a speed of 15 kmph during past six hours, intensified into a severe cyclonic storm and lay centered at 0530 hrs IST of Tuesday over the same region, about 190 km south-southeast of Machilipatnam (Andhra Pradesh), 270 km south-southeast of Kakinada (Andhra Pradesh), 340 km south-southwest of Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh), 550 km south-southwest of Gopalpur (Odisha).

"It is likely to continue to move north-northwestwards and cross Andhra Pradesh coast between Machilipatnam and Kalingapatnam around Kakinada during the evening/night of today, the 28th October, as a severe cyclonic storm with a maximum sustained wind speed of 90-100 kmph gusting to 110 kmph," the IMD said. The IMD has issued a red alert for coastal Andhra Pradesh. It said in a bulletin that scattered heavy to very heavy with extremely heavy rainfall likely to occur at one or two places over Srikakulam, Parvathipuram Manyam, Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, Alluri Sitharama Raju, Anakapalli, Kakinada-Yanam, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Konaseema, East Godavari, West Godavari, Eluru, NTR, Krishna, Guntur, Palnadu, Bapatla and Prakasam districts of coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam. Heavy to very heavy rainfall is likely to occur at a few places over Sri Potti Srimamulu Nellore, Tirupati, Annamayya, YSR Kadapa and Nandyal districts of Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam and Rayalaseema. Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) has issued high wave alerts for coastal districts. It forecasted high waves in the range of 3 - 4.7 meters. INCOIS advised small vessels not to ply near shore and to avoid recreational activities. Erosion/wave surges are possible under the impact of the cyclone.

Great danger signal 10 at Kakinada Port as cyclone Montha nears Andhra Pradesh coast

Great danger signal number 10 was hoisted at Kakinada Port on Tuesday as the severe cyclone 'Montha' in the Bay of Bengal was hurtling towards the Andhra Pradesh coast. With the cyclone nearing the coast, the Cyclone Warning Centre, Visakhapatnam, directed authorities to replace danger signal seven with 10 at Kakinada Port. The great danger signal is the highest issued to port in times of severe cyclones.

Great danger signal number nine was hoisted at Visakhapatnam, Gangavaram, Kalingapatnam and Bheemunipatnam ports. Great danger signal eight was hoisted at Machilipatnam, Nizampatnam, Krishnapatnam and Vadarevu ports. According to Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA), cyclonic storm Montha over the west-central Bay of Bengal has intensified

into a severe cyclone and moved north-northwestwards with a speed of 12 kmph during the past six hours. It lies centred about 160 km from Machilipatnam, 240 km from Kakinada and 320 km from Visakhapatnam.

The system is being continuously monitored from the Disaster Management Authority's control room. The severe cyclone is likely to cross the coast between Kakinada and Machilipatnam tonight. At the time of crossing the coast, strong cyclonic winds with speeds of 90-110 km per hour. Due to its impact, extremely heavy rainfall is expected from Srikakulam to Nellore, with very heavy rainfall in some areas.

APSDMA has advised people to stay safe indoors. The IMD has issued a red alert for coastal Andhra Pradesh. It said in a bulletin that scattered heavy to very heavy with extremely heavy rainfall likely to occur at one or



two places over Srikakulam, Parvathipuram, Manyam, Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, Alluri Sitharama Raju, Anakapalli, Kakinada-Yanam, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Konaseema, East Godavari, West Godavari, Eluru, NTR, Krishna, Guntur, Palnadu, Bapatla and Prakasam districts of coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam.

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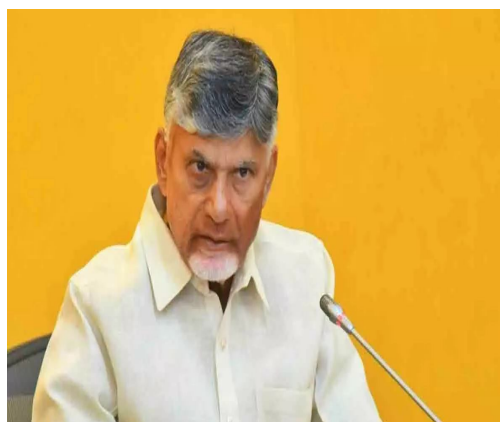
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CM Chandrababu calls cadre to carry relief efforts amid cyclone Montha

Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu convened a teleconference today with NDA alliance MPs, ministers, MLAs, and leaders to address the impending threat of Cyclone Montha, which is reported to be approximately 270 km from Kakinada, moving towards the state at a speed of 15 km/h. The Chief Minister urged leaders to remain vigilant and to provide immediate assistance to the affected citizens over the next couple of days.

Naidu warned that Cyclone Montha is expected to intensify into a severe cyclone tonight and make landfall between Machilipatnam and Kalingapatnam. Heavy rainfall is anticipated in the Krishna, West Godavari, Konaseema, and Eluru districts. To ensure public safety, the NDA representatives have been instructed to alert residents and mobilise their support.

The CM emphasised the importance of timely communication, stating that



real-time updates regarding the situation would be sent via mobile notifications. He also assured that measures were being put in place to mitigate crop damage from potential flooding and to prioritize saving lives while minimising property damage. In a call to action, Naidu encouraged NDA cadres to volunteer in relief efforts and indicated that the government would seek central assistance if necessary.

He highlighted the state's resilience in handling previous cyclones, such as Titli and Hudhud, and expressed confidence in the government's ability to respond effectively to this crisis.

Medical camps are being established, and efforts are underway to clear roads and remove fallen trees and poles swiftly. NDRF and SDRF personnel have been deployed in response to the threat of flash floods, and fishermen have been returned from the sea as a precautionary measure. The Chief Minister reiterated the need for ministers, MLAs, and party cadres to remain present and supportive to those in need during this challenging time. With approximately 39 constituencies expected to be affected by the forthcoming rains, Naidu assured that updates would be issued hourly throughout the cyclone's progression, reinforcing the need for coordinated efforts to assist the communities at risk.

WALT AIR DIVISION TAKES ELABORATE SAFETY MEASURES - DRM

Waltair Division of East Coast Railway has taken extensive precautionary measures and put in place elaborate arrangements to effectively manage the impact of Cyclone Montha.

Addressing the media, Divisional Railway Manager Shri Lalit Bohra informed that help desks have been set up at 10 major stations across the Division to provide timely information regarding train cancellations, diversions, and short-terminations. More than 23 trains per day have been cancelled, while 15 trains have been rescheduled to ensure the safety of passengers. To handle any possible disruptions, 17 diesel locomotives and generators are kept on standby to restore operations in case of power failures. Expert teams have been deployed at intervals of every 50 kilometres, ready to respond swiftly in the event of any emergency. Adequate drinking water facilities have been arranged in railway colonies and stations to serve as back-up during restoration work. Communication systems have been strengthened with satellite phones and enhanced rail network connectivity to maintain effective coordination. Sufficient stocks of food and essential items have been ensured at station catering units to support stranded passengers. A 24x7 War Room has been activated at the Divisional Headquarters to monitor the situation continuously and coordinate field operations. Accident relief trains, material relief trains, excavators, and bulldozers are strategically positioned at various key locations, in Kottavalasa-Kirandul, Koraput-Rayagada, Rayagada-Vizianagaram, and the Duvvada-Visakhapatnam-Palasa section, for prompt restoration of train services after the cyclone. Continuous surveillance of railway bridges, tracks, yards, and signaling systems is being carried out to ensure infrastructure safety. Patrolmen and watchmen have also been deployed to keep a close watch on vulnerable locations. Frequent passenger announcements are being made at stations to update the public on train movements and safety precautions. In addition, bulk messages have been sent in advance to passengers about train cancellations, diversions, and rescheduling details. DRM Shri Lalit Bohra appealed to passengers to cooperate with the Railways during this period of adverse weather, assuring that all possible measures are being taken to ensure the safety and comfort of passengers.

If Chief Justice BR Gavai was attacked in the country's highest judiciary, the Supreme Court, why are no cases being registered yet? The police system and the judiciary, which accept many cases suo motu, do not see the attack on the Chief Justice? Why is the Human Rights Commission, which responds to many issues, silent..? MRPS founding president Padmashri Mandakrishna Madiga questioned why the attack was not punished under the content of court and contempt of court even if it



was in court. Speaking as the chief guest at a media conference organized in Neredmet, Malkajigiri district of Medchal on Tuesday, Mandakrishna Madiga said that if the Dalit who is the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court is not protected, how can the common Dalits in the country be protected. He said that it is outrageous that even after 20 days of this attack, a case has not been registered. If there was a judge from an upper caste in place of Justice Gavai, would he have neglected to register the case like this? He objected that even the constitutional institutions that should have responded because he is a Dalit are silent.

In Haryana, when a lawyer and a judge had an argument and were taking action, a suo motu case was filed against him for speaking disrespectfully to the judge, he reminded that there were no cases or arrests even for attacking the CJ with a shoe here. Starting with the Prime Minister of the country, the top leaders of the opposition Congress condemned the attack across the country, saying that the incident was barbaric, but there were no arrests or legal cases, and the reason for this was that the CJ was a Dalit.

What is the point of those who condemned the attack being limited to condemnation and not demanding arrest and filing of cases? He expressed anger that the existence and self-respect of Dalits are being damaged by these dual policies. He said that nothing is more important than self-respect for us. He questioned whether laws will apply if attacks are launched in the name of beliefs and dharma. That is why he said that he sees the attack on Justice BR Gavai as an attack on Dalits, the judicial system and the spirit of the Constitution. He said that no matter how hard Dalits rise to a higher position, casteism will haunt them. That is why they are protesting the attack on Gavai and are fighting for the self-respect of Dalits at the national level. He said that the attack on Gavai has deeply hurt the hearts of Dalits in the country. But despite waiting for 20 days, justice has not been done even today. That is why the call for the movement was given. He demanded that a case be registered immediately on the attack, the accused be arrested and put in jail. An inquiry should be conducted into this incident by a retired Supreme Court judge and the forces

behind it should be identified. He demanded that appropriate steps be taken to prevent such incidents from happening again. He said that no negligence in this matter will be tolerated. They have called for a Dalit self-respect rally called Chalo Hyderabad on November 1 with lakhs of people demanding justice in the attack on Chief Justice Gavai. In this rally, Dalit people who want to live with self-respect as well as people who want to maintain respect for the judicial system and protect the spirit of the Constitution, have called for a large number of people, regardless of caste, religion, or party, to come together.

On November 1, a grand rally for the self-respect of Dalits will be held from the statue of Babu Jagjivan Ram to the big statue of Ambedkar next to the secretariat, and people from all villages across the state have been asked to come to this rally. If Surya gets some runs, he can completely destroy the opposition, says Parthiv Patel

New Delhi: As India prepare to face Australia in a high-stakes T20I series as part of preparations for next year's T20 World Cup, former wicketkeeper-batter Parthiv Patel believes it will be very beneficial for the visitors if captain Suryakumar Yadav rediscovers his form and ends his lean run with the bat. Widely regarded as one of the most destructive batters in the shortest format, Suryakumar has faced a challenging period – as evidenced by him scoring only 72 runs during India's victorious Asia Cup campaign in the UAE.

In 2025, Suryakumar has scored just 100 runs across 11 innings and hasn't made a fifty in his last 14 T20Is. Since taking over the captaincy last year after Rohit Sharma's retirement from the format following the T20 World Cup win, Suryakumar has accumulated 330 runs in 20 matches, which is concerning for a player of his calibre. "More than the personal thing, I feel it's important that Surya finds form for the team. Basically, we know what he can do as a batter. If he gets runs, he can completely

destroy the opposition. So from that point of view, I feel that if Surya gets some runs, it will be very helpful for the team," Patel, a JioStar expert, told IANS during a virtual media day ahead of the first T20I, to be played at Canberra's Manuka Oval on Wednesday.

India are coming on the back of winning their last nine bilateral T20I series and have won seven of their past eight games against Australia in the shortest format, including a current three-game streak against the Mitchell Marsh-led side. For most Indian batters, how they adapt and respond to the extra bounce that Australian pitches offer, especially with significantly larger boundaries, would make for a fascinating watch. Patel believes India should stick to their aggressive batting style that has consistently brought them success.

"I don't think India needs to change their approach at all. You change your approach or try to rectify something if it has gone wrong. I think India has



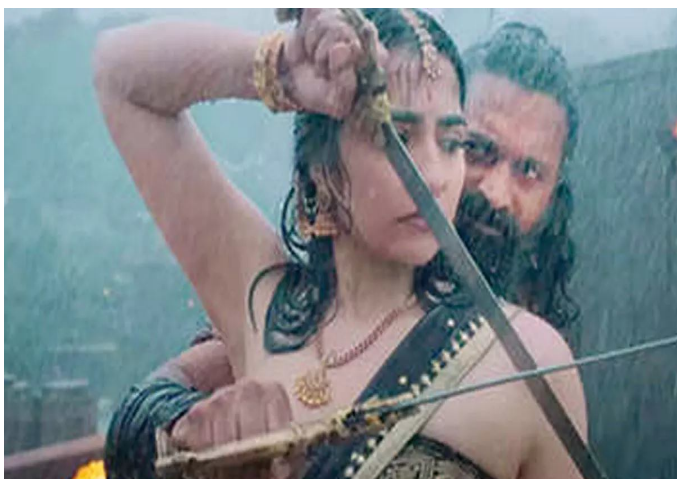
been playing fantastic cricket in the last few years, especially in this format. So, I don't see India needs to change anything. I know the conditions are different. You just have to get used to the conditions and keep backing yourself," he said.

Drawing parallels with India's series win in South Africa last year, Patel elaborated, "See, when you are playing in Australia, obviously, the new ball seems to swing a little more than it usually does. But another thing is that this Indian team

played in South Africa with the same approach and also performed well there. So that adjustment is only of the bounce." "With the grounds being big, you will have to see where and how you would use its big boundaries. When you are playing in small grounds, you will have to see where there is a small side so that big shots can be bit there. All those things, when you go to the ground, you look at the dimensions and make adjustments accordingly. I am sure this Indian team is as prepared as they can be to

make those adjustments." In the Asia Cup, vice-captain Shubman Gill returning to the top and partnering with Abhishek Sharma meant wicket-keeper-batter Sanju Samson was moved to number five. Although he was sometimes tentative, Samson demonstrated signs of adjusting to his new batting position through a vital 39 in a Super Over victory over Sri Lanka and 24 in the final over against Pakistan. Patel concluded by saying that Samson can be expected to deliver good performances in Australia as a number five batter. "We saw in the Asia Cup how the Indian team was thinking in terms of giving confidence to Sanju Samson that he can bat at number five. He is adjusting; there is no doubt about that, and we saw that too. But hopefully, after the Asia Cup, you will get to see Sanju perform even better here in this series." Kantara Chapter 1 grosses Rs 800 crore



Mangaluru: Rishab Shetty's magnum opus Kantara: A Legend – Chapter 1 continues its dream run at the box office, grossing over ₹800 crore worldwide within just 25 days of release. The sequel to the 2022 cultural phenomenon Kantara has now emerged as the highest-grossing Indian film of 2025, surpassing Chhaava's lifetime collection. According to early trade estimates, the film collected approximately ₹10 crore on Day 25, taking its India total to ₹589 crore across all languages. The film's strong occupancy rates—Kannada (40.51%), Hindi (35.72%), Tamil (49.24%), Telugu (26.50%), and Malayalam (24.81%)—reflect its pan-India appeal.

Produced by Hombale Films, the studio behind KGF and Salaar, the mythological action drama has reportedly crossed ₹809 crore globally. Independent trackers such as Sacnilk have placed the worldwide figure at around ₹775 crore after 21 days. Kantara: Chapter 1 opened with ₹61.85 crore on Day 1—one of the biggest openings in Kannada cinema history—and crossed ₹337.4 crore in its first week. Karnataka remains its strongest market with ₹181 crore, followed by Hindi with ₹192 crore.

The film's success has also outperformed its predecessor, which earned ₹407.82 crore globally in 2022. Actress Rukmini Vasanth, who plays Kanakavathi, said she had to "emotionally connect with the rituals and music" of the role. Director and lead actor Rishab Shetty hinted that Chapter 1 is part of a larger cinematic universe rooted in folklore and spirituality. With packed houses and repeat audiences, Kantara: A Legend – Chapter 1 stands as proof that regional storytelling can achieve global resonance.

Bumrah has kept himself at the top and knows how to prepare for good series: Suryakumar

Canberra: Indian T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav shared his thoughts on the importance of having Jasprit Bumrah on the side and stated that the pacer has been 'raising his hand' to take up responsibilities whenever required. Bumrah was rested for the recently concluded ODI series and was named in the T20I squad, with the team's focus on keeping him energised and fit for the T20 World Cup in India next year. However, it remains to be seen whether the pace spearhead will play all five T20Is or be benched in some to manage his workload.

Surya stated that taking wickets in the powerplay is challenging and praised Bumrah for taking respon-

sibility in the first six overs to provide breakthroughs for the team whenever possible. "Yes, it is always a challenge. We have seen how they (Australia) played in the ODI series and also in the T20 World Cup. Powerplay is always important. You saw in the Asia Cup, he (Bumrah) took the responsibility of bowling two overs minimum in the power play, so it is good that he is raising his hand, acting as if he is the guy who will take charge. It is going to be a good challenge, definitely against the Aussie team in the powerplay," Suryakumar said while speaking at the pre-match press conference.

"The way he (Bumrah) has played cricket over the



last so many years, he has kept himself right at the top, and he knows how to prepare for a good series; he knows how to come and play cricket here. I think he has visited this country more than most of the guys, so all of the players have spoken to him; he is very open and very help-

ful in that. Definitely, when he takes the ground, it will be a good thing, good to have him in the squad, when we play in Australia," he added. Australia will host India in the T20I series opener here at the Manuka Oval on Wednesday.
