



Death toll rises to 20 in Telangana bus-truck collision

Hyderabad: Twenty people were killed and several others injured in a collision between an RTC bus and a truck in Telangana's Rangareddy district on Monday. The accident occurred around 6.30 a.m. on the Hyderabad-Bijapur highway near Mirzaguda in Chevella mandal, about 60 km from Hyderabad. The bus, which was moving to Hyderabad from Tandur, was hit by a concrete-laden tipper truck coming from the opposite direction.

According to eyewitnesses, passengers sitting in the first six rows were crushed and buried under the gravel as the tipper lorry pierced through the bus. The entire gravel load fell in the bus, adding to the intensity of the crash. Eighteen passengers of the bus, including 10 women, died in the collision. The deceased include drivers of both the bus and the truck. A 10-month-old baby and her mother



were among those dead.

There were about 70 passengers aboard the bus, which belonged to the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TSRTC). Several passengers were injured, and they were shifted to the government hospital at Chevella, where the condition of three of them is stated to

be critical. Heart-wrenching scenes were witnessed as several injured people trapped in the rubble were crying for help.

Police and other rescue personnel had a tough time pulling out the injured. Three JCBs were pressed into service to cut through the bus to retrieve the bodies and rescue the injured.

One of the survivors said the bus started from Tandur at 5 a.m. and was full to its capacity by the time it reached Vikarabad. Several passengers were standing. The survivor said a speeding tipper truck coming from the opposite direction rammed into the bus. The driver and the passengers sitting in six rows behind him were crushed to death.

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has expressed grief over the road accident. He directed the officials to immediately reach the accident site and undertake relief measures. The Chief Minister also asked officials to keep him informed of the situation and provide updates on the details of the accident from time to time. The Chief Minister directed the Chief Secretary and Director General of Police to ensure that all those injured in the bus accident are immediate-

ly shifted to Hyderabad and provided with the best possible medical treatment. He also instructed the Ministers available nearby to rush to the accident site without delay. The Chief Minister further directed the District Collector to intensify the rescue and relief operations and to take all necessary measures to ensure effective assistance. Transport Minister Ponnampalapati Prabhakar ordered officials to launch relief measures and provide the best possible medical care to the injured. This is the second major road accident in the Telugu states in less than 10 days. Twenty people were burnt to death when a private bus caught fire after running over a motorbike near Kurnool town of Andhra Pradesh on October 24. The bus belonging to a private tour operator was on its way to Bengaluru from Hyderabad.

CM Revanth Reddy Responds to Chevella Road Accident orders officials to act

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has expressed his deep sorrow regarding the tragic road accident that occurred in Chevella mandal of Rangareddy district.



In response, he has instructed officials to promptly arrive at the scene and implement necessary relief measures. The Chief Minister emphasized the importance of regularly updating him with complete details about the incident. In a direct communication, Reddy instructed the Chief Secretary (CS) and Director General of Police (DGP) to expedite the evacuation of injured passengers from the bus accident to Hyderabad, ensuring that arrangements are made for superior medical treatment. The CM has also called on available ministers to immediately head to the accident site to provide support. Furthermore, he directed the District Collector to enhance relief efforts and to take all required steps to assist those affected. Reddy reiterated the need for ongoing relief measures to be executed "on a war footing," collaborating with all relevant departments. He ordered that emergency medical assistance be swiftly provided to save lives, alongside the deployment of sufficient ambulances and medical personnel to the scene.

Bihar polls: RJD, Cong do not understand language of development, says PM Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday launched a strong attack on the RJD-Congress alliance, alleging that both parties have no connection with development and are still trapped in the politics of jungle raj. Addressing a massive rally in Saharsa, Bihar, the Prime Minister said, "Their dictionary is filled only with words like Katta, cruelty, bitterness, misgovernance and corruption. This is all they have learnt in the school of jungle-raj. The RJD and Congress simply don't understand the language of development." PM Modi said that while the NDA stands for development, the opposition represents destruction. He claimed that due to the earlier revenge politics of RJD and Congress, people in the Kosi-Mithilanchal region once had to travel nearly 300 km to move from one side of the area to the other, whereas today that distance has



been reduced to less than 30 km. PM Modi also highlighted women's empowerment and congratulated the nation on India's historic first-ever Women's Cricket World Cup title. He said the win was an example of the emerging confidence of women coming from small towns, farmers' families and lower-middle-class households. PM Modi also referred to Bihar's Jeevika Didi campaign and the Chief Minister's Employment Scheme, say-

ing around 1.4 crore women in the state have received Rs 10,000 each in their accounts under various initiatives. The Prime Minister said Bihar has accelerated the pace of development in recent years and urged voters to again elect an NDA government. PM Modi added that the aim is to create conditions where the state's youth can find opportunities in Bihar itself and bring glory to the state. He reiterated that the NDA's resolve is to

ensure that Bihar's youth get opportunities within the state itself.

"Our resolve is that the youth of Bihar should work in Bihar and bring glory to Bihar," he said. Prime Minister Narendra Modi appealed to first-time voters in the state to support the NDA in the upcoming Assembly elections, saying their vote should go towards forming a stable government. "There are many sons and daughters here who will be voting for the first time. When I voted for the first time, I also wished that my vote would not go to waste. I was happy that I succeeded. I want to tell you -- your first vote should help form the government. Your vote will strengthen the NDA government." PM Modi reminded that only two days remain for the first phase of polling and that voting in Saharsa and Madhepura will take place on the morning of November 6.

EAM Jaishankar, counterpart from Bahrain review progress in bilateral ties

New Delhi: External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar and his Bahrain counterpart, Abdullatif bin Rashid Alzayani co-chaired the 5th India-Bahrain High Joint Commission meeting in New Delhi on Monday. The two leaders reviewed the progress in bilateral ties, focusing on trade, security, defence, health, culture, people to people ties and also discussed opportunities in space, fintech and cyber sectors.

EAM Jaishankar expressed confidence that the ties between India and Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) will continue to deepen as Bahrain takes over the GCC presidency. "Co-chaired the 5th India-Bahrain High Joint Commission meeting alongside FM Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Alzayani. Reviewed the progress in our bilateral relations focusing on trade, security, defence, health, culture, people to people



ties as well as promising opportunities in space, fintech and cyber domains. As Bahrain takes over the GCC presidency, confident that India-GCC ties will continue to deepen," EAM Jaishankar posted on X.

"Thanked the leadership of Bahrain for ensuring welfare of the Indian community. Also exchanged perspectives on recent global and regional developments," he added. In his opening remarks at the 5th

India-Bahrain High Joint Commission meeting, EAM Jaishankar stated that the two nations are bound by a centuries-old friendship rooted in trade linkages and strong people-to-people ties. He underscored that both countries share a common goal of promoting peace and prosperity for their people in the region. "India and Bahrain share centuries-old ties of friendship underpinned by trade linkages and strong people-to-people ties. We also believe in a common goal and commitment for promoting peace and prosperity for our people and for our common region. Since our last HJC meeting, we have made significant progress bilaterally in defence, security, trade and commerce, health, culture, and people-to-people ties. But there are new areas such as space, fintech and technology that hold considerable promise for our

partnership," EAM Jaishankar said.

Meanwhile, the visiting Foreign Minister noted that economic links between India and Bahrain remain central to the bilateral ties that have flourished across various sectors with Manama intending to enhance connectivity with India. In his opening remarks at the meeting, Abdullatif bin Rashid Alzayani said, "While Bahrain and India established diplomatic relations over 50 years ago in 1971, our rich historical ties extends back nearly 5,000 years rooted in trade and cultural exchange between the ancient civilizations of Dilmun and the Indus Valley. Today, these economic links remain central to our relationship which has flourished across various fields. India continues to be one of Bahrain's primary trading partners and both our nations recognise that economic cooperation and interdepend-

The Republic of Mauritius commemorated the 191st anniversary of the arrival of the first indentured labourers at the historic Aapravasi Ghat World Heritage Site in Port Louis — a UNESCO-recognised landmark symbolising resilience, migration, and the human spirit.

As part of the ongoing partnership between the two nations, the Government of India announced a remittance of 25 million under the Special Economic Package 2025, aimed at supporting cultural preservation and bilateral development initiatives in Mauritius.

A Shared Legacy

The ceremony concluded with floral tributes and traditional performances, honouring the memory of those who arrived between 1834 and 1920 from India, forging a multicultural Mauritius.

This year's commemoration reaffirmed the enduring bonds between India and Mauritius, and the global importance of the Aapravasi Ghat as a site of remembrance, reflection, and gratitude.

Railway Minister Visits Ahmedabad Station



• Review of Ahmedabad Station Redevelopment and High-Speed Rail Project Progress

Railways, Information & Broadcasting, and Electronics & IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw visited Ahmedabad station on Monday. On this occasion, he reviewed the ongoing station redevelopment works and the progress of the High-Speed Rail (Bullet Train) project.

The Minister inspected the Ahmedabad station redevelopment works and informed the media that considering the needs of passengers, extensive redevelopment of stations is underway across the country. Currently, redevelopment work is progressing at more than 1,300 railway stations, among which Ahmedabad station is one of the major ones.

The Railway Minister stated that a 16-storey modern building is being constructed at Ahmedabad station. On the Saraspur side, the bullet train project work is progressing rapidly, and the Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail station is almost complete. The bullet train station and the Ahmedabad railway station are being developed in an integrated manner. The metro station

on the Saraspur side has been completed and opened for passengers. He further informed that Ahmedabad station will get three additional platforms, which will increase the station's train handling capacity. The station is being developed in a modern manner on both sides—Kalupur and Saraspur. All platforms will be covered by a concourse roof plaza, and work on the elevated road is also progressing quickly. Thus, both ends of the city will be connected through the concourse, elevated road, and foot overbridge. The minister said that during his previous visit, basement work was in progress, and now both underground basements and the ground floor are completed, while the structure up to the fourth floor has been erected.

Among the major 20 stations of the country like Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, and Ahmedabad, the demand for new trains is high. In Gujarat, Ahmedabad and Surat have the highest demand. To enhance train handling capacity, a mega terminal will be developed at Vatva in Ahmedabad with 10 pit lines, enabling around 45 additional train operations—making it possible



to operate around 150 trains from Ahmedabad.

The redevelopment work at Ahmedabad station is based on the concept of integrating heritage monuments with a modern urban center. The project will create a world-class Multimodal Transport Hub (MMTH), including ample parking, an elevated road network connecting the Kalupur and Saraspur ROBs, landscaped plazas, concourse areas, and upgraded passenger facilities.

The stations architectural design is inspired by the Modhera Sun Temple, showcasing a beautiful blend of cultural heritage and modern aesthetics. The iconic MMTH tower on the Kalupur side will become a new landmark in Ahmedabad's skyline. ASI-protected monuments Brick Minar and Jhulta Minar will also be integrated into the redevelopment plan.

The station will be seamlessly connected to the National High-Speed Rail terminal, Metro, and

BRTS through an elevated network, ensuring smooth multimodal integration and reducing congestion in the city.

A concourse plaza spread over 15 acres above the railway tracks and a 7-acre mezzanine plaza will be constructed, providing waiting areas, restrooms, food courts, retail shops, and other passenger amenities. The redeveloped station will be developed as a green building with a focus on energy efficiency, water conservation, and renewable energy use.

The station will feature advanced security technologies, an automated parcel depot system, and Divyang-friendly infrastructure including lifts and escalators.

The Ahmedabad railway station redevelopment project will not only symbolize modern infrastructure but will also preserve cultural heritage, helping establish Ahmedabad as a major global metropolis.

but she frames every moment.

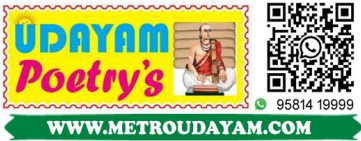
The house breathes because she does.

Adore

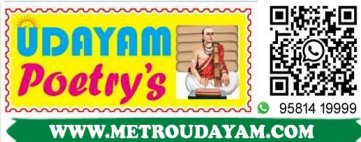
And feel it

As Spring has arrived.

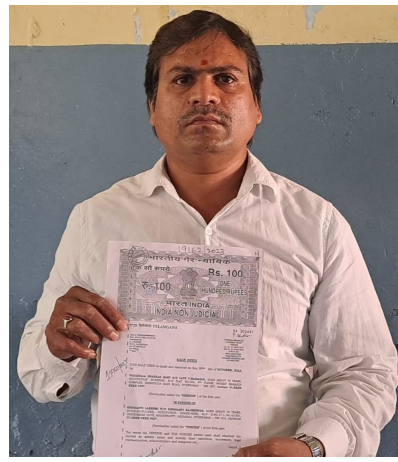

Shocking Real Estate Scam: VSN Bhoomi Infras Shankar Babu Faces Serious Fraud Allegations

A shocking real estate fraud has come to light, with allegations that VSN Bhoomi Infra Developers Chairman Voddirala Shankar Babu has been deceiving innocent people under the guise of real estate business. Kodiganti Rajeshwar, a municipal employee from Neredmet, expressed deep anguish over being cheated by the company. Speaking at a press conference held in Kachiguda on Monday, Rajeshwar revealed that in 2019, Chairman Shankar Babu had entered into an agreement to sell him a 130-square-yard plot at



Bhuvanagiri for ₹75 lakh, under his company's venture. Rajeshwar said he had paid the entire amount in installments, but after receiving the payments, Shankar Babu stopped responding and began acting fraudulently. Later, in 2023, Shankar

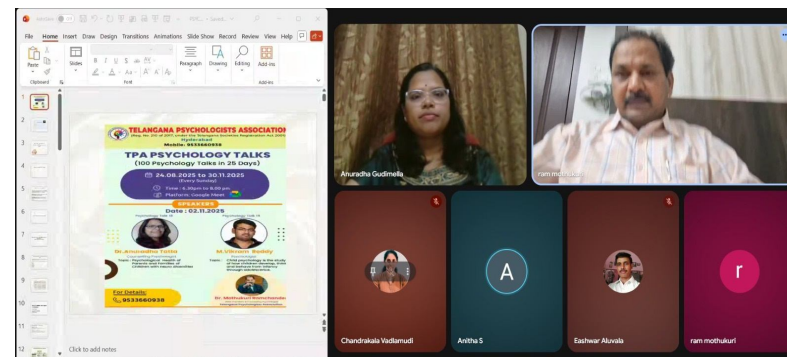
Babu claimed to have registered a 121-square-yard plot near Patel Gudem village, Aleru, and even handed over registration documents. However, Rajeshwar stated that the location of the plot was never disclosed to him. Rajeshwar said he had approached Aleru police in December last year, but no action was taken. Subsequently, he lodged a complaint with the Neredmet Police Station, where a case was registered, yet no progress or action has been initiated so far. Accusing Shankar Babu of targeting poor and middle-class families to earn money through deceit,

Rajeshwar said I bought the plot with the dream of securing my two children's future, but I never imagined I would be cheated like this. He added that Shankar Babu promised him land in the Bhuvanagiri venture but instead registered a plot in a remote, unrelated area. Rajeshwar demanded through the media that Shankar Babu return the ₹75 lakh he paid, along with interest. He urged the government and concerned authorities to take strict action to curb such fraudulent practices in the real estate sector and ensure justice for victims like him.

A protest program was organized at the local Uppal AISF under the auspices of the AISF Medchal Malkajgiri Samiti, protesting the governments negligent attitude in shutting down private colleges, demanding immediate release of pending fee reimbursement and scholarship arrears. On this occasion, MD Anwar said, If the managements of private degree, PG and engineering colleges in Telangana state announce an indefinite strike from November 3 demanding the release of pending fee reimbursement and scholarship arrears, the government is weakening the funds for fee arrears and is conducting vigi-



lance raids. They are blackmailing the managements of private higher colleges, saying that it is not right to make threats in the name of inspections to pay the arrears due to students, inspections should be conducted only after the entire fee arrears are paid, and the government has remembered the inspections today, why did it not come so many days ago? There are 8,000 crores of pending fee reimbursement scholarship dues in the state, and since the Congress government came to

power, students are playing with their studies without releasing the pending fee reimbursement and scholarship dues. CM Revanth Reddy said that if they come to power, they will release the fee dues in one go, but they broke their word after coming to power. Revanth Reddy, as an assembly witness, said that he would release 500 crores of dues every month, but he neglected his promise. If the owners went on strike before the Dussehra festival for the release of dues, they deceived him by



saying that 1200 crores would be released to the owners before the Dussehra and Diwali festivals, but only 300 crores were released. On the one hand, students are facing difficulties as they are unable to get certificates and the owners are unable to run the college and pay salaries to the staff. If the owners announce that they will go on an indefinite bandh from November 3 until the dues are released, He said that it is shameful to threaten in the name of vigilance inspections

without paying dues and that the government should not neglect the release of fee dues and immediately release the pending fee reimbursement and scholarship dues, otherwise, they will protest everywhere under the auspices of AISF and block ministers and MLAs everywhere. AISF District Vice President, Harish District Leaders Arvind, Sandeep, Vikaram, Sai, Srikanth, Vamsi, Akash, and others participated in this program.
