



PM Modi to visit Dehradun for silver jubilee celebrations of Uttarakhand's formation

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Dehradun on Sunday to participate in a programme marking the silver jubilee celebration of the formation of Uttarakhand. The event will take place at around 12.30 p.m. During his visit, the Prime Minister will inaugurate and lay the foundation stones for various development projects worth over Rs 8,140 crore.

As part of the celebrations, Prime Minister Modi will also launch a commemorative postal stamp to mark the occasion and address the gathering. During the programme, he will inaugurate projects worth over Rs 930 crore and lay the foundation stones for new projects amounting to Rs 7,210 crore. These initiatives cover several key sectors, including drinking water, irrigation, technical education, energy, urban development, sports, and skill development.

The Prime Minister will also release a financial assistance package of Rs 62 crore to more than 28,000 farmers, transfer-

ring the amount directly into their bank accounts under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana. Among the projects to be inaugurated are the Dehradun Water Supply Coverage Project for 23 zones under the AMRUT scheme, an

electrical substation in Pithoragarh district, solar power plants on government buildings, and the AstroTurf Hockey Ground at Haldwani Stadium in Nainital.

Prime Minister Modi will also lay the foundation stones for two major hydro-sector projects - the Song Dam Drinking Water Project, which will supply 150 million litres per day (MLD) of drinking water to Dehradun, and the Jamarani Dam Multipurpose Project in Nainital, designed to provide drinking water, support irrigation, and generate electricity. Other projects whose foundation stones will be laid include electrical substations, the establishment of a Women's Sports College in Champawat, and a state-of-the-art dairy plant in Nainital, among others.

Uttarakhand was established on November 9, 2000, as the 27th state of India, after being carved out of the northern region of Uttar Pradesh. Originally named Uttaranchal, the state officially adopted the name Uttarakhand in January 2007. Uttarakhand Foundation Day, also known as Uttarakhand Diwas, celebrates the creation of one of India's most scenic and culturally vibrant states. The day serves as both a reminder of the people's long struggle for statehood and a tribute to the region's rich heritage, resilience, and strong sense of identity. Often referred to as the 'Land of the Gods' (Devbhoomi), Uttarakhand is home to numerous Hindu pilgrimage sites, including Kedarnath, Badrinath, Gangotri, and Yamunotri.

AP cabinet to convene tomorrow to discuss on key issues

In a significant meeting scheduled for tomorrow (Monday) at 11 am, the Andhra Pradesh Cabinet will convene under the leadership of Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu at the AP Secretariat. The agenda includes critical topics such as the upcoming Visakhapatnam Investment Conference and district reorganisation. The investment conference, set to take place on the 14th and 15th of this month, will be a focal point of discussion. Chief Minister Naidu has already assigned responsibilities for the event's arrangements to various ministers and officials. He will seek updates on preparations for this global gathering, which aims to attract representatives from numerous international companies. The Cabinet is expected to approve investments totalling approximately Rs 1 lakh crore during this meet-



ing. Additionally, the Cabinet will assess the impact of the recent Cyclone Montha, which caused significant damage across the state. Discussions will include damage estimates and potential compensation measures for affected communities. A proposal for a Rs 7,500 crore loan from the CRDA NaBFID is also on the agenda for approval. Furthermore, the Cabinet is anticipated to endorse allocated lands for various institutions aimed at promoting state

development. A pivotal decision regarding the reorganisation of districts, as promised by the coalition parties during elections, is also expected. This follows a prior decision made in the Cabinet Sub-Committee meeting, where recommendations on the formation of new districts and revenue divisions were outlined. The proceedings of tomorrow's Cabinet meeting are expected to have far-reaching implications for the state's development and administrative structure.

Central officials to assess Montha Cyclone Damage in affected areas of AP



A delegation of central officials is set to visit cyclone-affected regions on the 10th and 11th of this month, led by Pousami Basu, Joint Secretary of the Union Home Ministry. The group, consisting of eight officials, will be divided into two teams to evaluate the damage across six districts. On the morning of the 10th, the team will convene with state officials at the Disaster Management Authority office in Tadepalli to gather detailed information regarding the impact of the cyclone. Following this meeting, one team will travel to Bapatla and Prakasam districts, while the other team will assess the situation in Krishna, Eluru, East Godavari, and Ambedkar Konaseema districts, focusing on crop and other losses. To ensure effective coordination during the visit, Prakhar Jain, Director of the Disaster Management Authority, has been designated as the nodal officer, with ED Venkata Deepakan serving as the state-level liaison officer.

Mukesh Ambani Offers Prayers at Tirumala Temple

On Sunday morning, Mukesh Ambani, Chairman and Managing Director of Reliance Industries Limited, visited the Sri Venkateswara Swamy Temple in Tirumala, where he offered his prayers. Ambani had the darshan of Lord Venkateswara during the morning Suprabhata Seva and was warmly received by Additional Executive Officer Venkayya Chowdary, who arranged a special darshan for the industrialist. Following his prayers, Vedic scholars extended Veda Ashirvachanam (Vedic blessings) to Ambani at the Ranganayakula Mandapam. As a gesture of divine blessings, the Additional EO presented him with theertha prasadam and a portrait of Lord Venkateswara. This visit marks another significant moment for Ambani, who recently offered prayers at the Badrinath Dham in Uttarakhand in October. Badrinath is a sacred site for Vaishnavites and part of the revered Panch Badri temples, which includes other temples like Yog Dhyani Badri and Adi Badri. Earlier this year, the Ambani family celebrated Navratri with aarti for Goddess Durga, featuring performances by Nita Ambani and other family members, highlighting their devotion and commitment to tradition.



Jubilee Hills By-Election campaign ends, polling on November 11

The campaign for the Jubilee Hills constituency by-election concluded this evening, with polling set to take place in just two days. The Election Commission has mandated that non-residents vacate the constituency after 6 pm and has ordered the closure of all wineries and pubs within the Jubilee Hills area. Voting is scheduled from 7 am to 6 pm on November 11. This by-election has arisen following the passing of BRS MLA Maganti Gopinath, prompting major political parties to invest significant efforts into their campaigns. The ruling Congress party and the opposition BRS view this election as a matter of prestige, intensifying their campaigning strategies. Meanwhile, the BJP is also pushing hard for success. Despite the heightened competition, the outcome remains uncertain, leaving many to speculate on the electorate's sentiments.



TGPSC Group 3 Certificate Verification to begin from today

The Telangana State Public Service Commission (TGPSC) has announced an important update for candidates who have successfully secured positions in the Group 3 merit list. The verification of certificates is set to commence on Monday, November 10, and will continue until November 26. According to TGPSC, the verification process for the selected Group 3 posts will take place at Telugu University, Nampally. Candidates are advised to consult the commission's official website for comprehensive details regarding the verification process. It is essential for candidates attending the certificate verification to bring along two sets of photocopies, along with their original certificates. This recruitment initiative targets a total of 1,388 Group 3 positions. The written examinations took place on November 17 and 18, 2024, with approximately 267,000 candidates participating across the state. After nearly a year of waiting, the results were announced, and the general ranking list was released on March 14. With the merit list recently published, all candidates listed must attend the certificate verification starting today.



BBC in UK Empire Features Indentured Indian History

Patricia Sudaishna Poinen will be featured in the BBCs Empire series with historian David Olusoga, exploring the continuing legacy of empire in Britain. The programme airs on 7th November 2025 at 9:00 PM, with further episodes scheduled for 14th and 21st November 2025. Directed by Francis Welch

In this series, Pat shares her familys story, focusing on the journey of Indian indentureship and its lasting impact across generations. Her personal narrative connects the broader history of migration, resilience, and cultural continuity that began during the 19th century.

Pats family history was researched and documented by Shamshu Deen, a noted genealogist and researcher from Trinidad and Tobago.

Between 1845 and 1917, approximately 147,592 Indians were registered and transported to Trinidad as indentured labourers. They travelled aboard ships from India, primarily from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Tamil Nadu, to work on sugar plantations under British colonial rule.

Pat has previously collaborated with the Discovery Museum in Newcastle upon Tyne as part of the AHRC Exchange Project, where she presented an exhibition on her familys journey. The museums archives include records of ships such as the Jumna (1867) and the Syria (1868), both used during the indentured period to transport Indians from India to Trinidad and Tobago. Notably, these vessels were built in Newcastle upon Tyne, linking British maritime history to the indentured experience. The Ganges 1&2 were built on the Tyne for the Nourse line.

Pat continues to research and share her familys remarkable history, contributing to conversations on identity, diaspora, and cultural memory. Her work inspires reflection and recognition of the shared histories that connect communities across the world.

She remains active in projects across Northumbria, the UK, and internationally, ensuring the stories of the indentured Indian community are remembered and celebrated

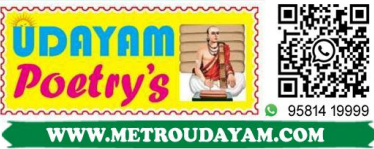

Years roll by, but some-



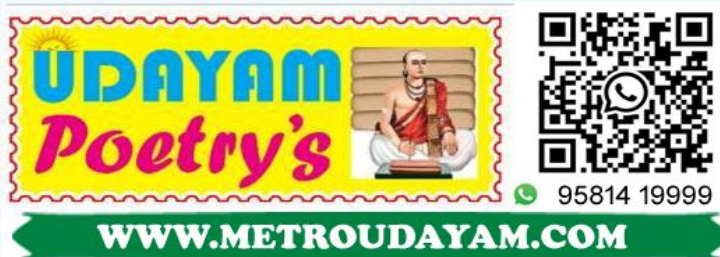
how, that bond only deepens. It stays as fresh as dew on an early morning

A Family's Guard Against Rising Crime

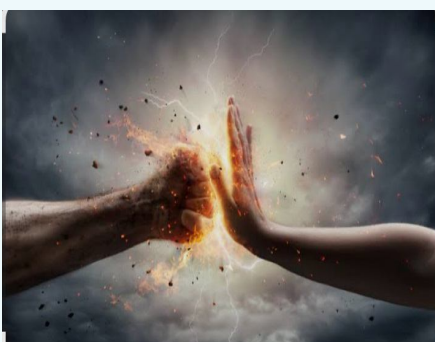
In a world where shadows of crime grow long, The family stands as the first, bright song. With open hearts they teach what right and wrong, And nurture minds where kindness can belong.

They model honesty, a simple creed, And show that truth is stronger than a need. Together they confront the lure of gangs, With empathy they break the chains of wrongs.

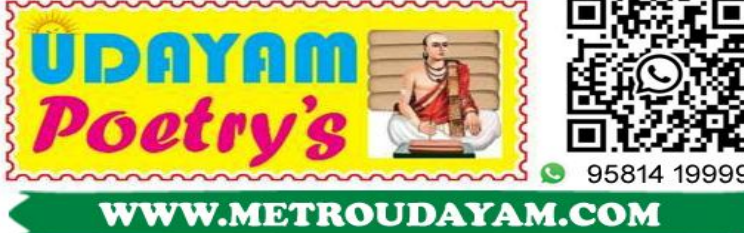


They notice signs, a quiet, hidden plea, And intervene with care, a safe decree. By fostering hope, they build a shield, Against the darkness that crime would yield.

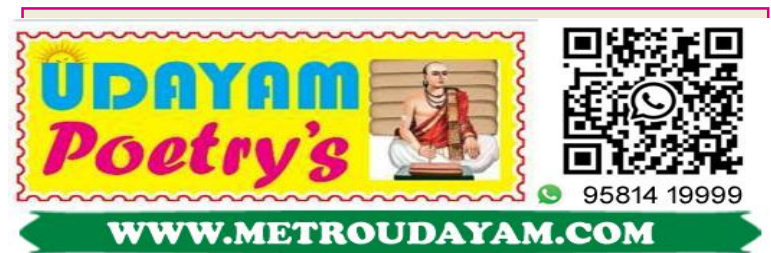

शासक को कभी भी किसी बद किरदार व्यक्ति को, लोगों पर नाहक अत्याचार करने वाले जालिम (अत्याचारी) व्यक्ति को, तलवे चाटने वाले चापलूस व्यक्ति को और अधर्मी व्यक्ति को अपने मंत्री मंडल में स्थान नहीं देना चाहिए। और ऐसे व्यक्ति को अपने खास मुआविन (मददगार), अपना साथी, सहयोगी नहीं बनाना चाहिए। अगर ऐसे लोग शासन में आते हैं तो अपने पद का उपयोग करते हुये सरकारी खजाने लूटने, लोगों पर जुल्मो सितम करने और अपने आपको मालदार बनाने के व्यतिरिक्त दूसरा कोई काम नहीं करते।

शासक और उनके वजीरों (मंत्रियों) द्वारा जनता दरबार लगाकर उनकी शिकवे शिकायतों को सुनकर उन्हें न्याय देना चाहिए। ऐसा करने से शासक और प्रजा को किसी और के बीच के माध्यमों के बगैर समझ मिलने का अवसर मिलता है। ऐसा करने से लोग भी उनकी अपनी तकलीफें बता पाएंगे और शासन उन कष्टों से छुटकारा दिलाने का प्रयास करते रहेगा। और जनता दरबार लोगों को खासकर बलहीन वर्ग को बलवान वर्ग से न्याय दिलाने का सक्षम माध्यम बन जायेगा।

इमाम अली इब्न अबू तालिब अलैहिस्सलाम फरमाते हैं के, "(ऐ मालिक! उपरोक्त कही गई बात पर अमल इसलिए करना) क्योंकि मैंने पैगंबर साहब मोहम्मद (स्व.) को कई मौकों (अवसरों) पर फरमाते सुना है कि "उस कौम (जाती) में पाकीज़गी (पवित्रता) कभी नहीं आ सकती जिसमें कमजोरों को खुलकर ताकतवरों से हक (बलहीनों को सीधे बलवान लोगों से न्याय) नहीं दिलाया जाता।" (अब्बास बुक एजेन्सी, लखनऊ द्वारा प्रकाशित हिंदी पुस्तक नहजुल बलागह, पत्र क्रमांक 53, पुष्ट क्रमांक 657)।

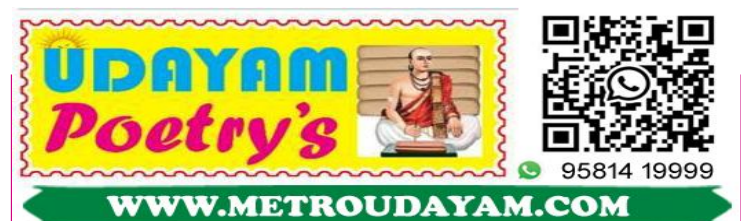

निखूवत याने अहंकार, तकबुर या गर्व एक लानत भरी (धिक्कारित) बीमारी है। जो भी इस बीमारी का शिकार होता है वह कभी सत्य और धर्म के निकट नहीं रह सकता। परमात्मा भी कभी अहंकार करने वाल को पसंद नहीं करता। पवित्र कुरआन के अध्याय क्रमांक 16, सुराह अन नहल, आयत क्रमांक 23 के मुताबिक अल्लाह (ईश्वर) कभी तकबुर करने वालों को पसंद नहीं करता। और घमंड करने वाले लोग नरक द्वार में धंस कर हमेशा नरक में रहेंगे।

और यह नरक सबसे बुरा ठिकाना होगा। पवित्र कुरआन में कह गया है की, "जब उन (घमंडियों) से कहा जायेगा कि जहन्नुम (नरक) के दरवाज़ों में धंसो और हमेशा उसी में रहो। तकबुर करने वालों का क्या बुरा ठिकाना है।" (पवित्र कुरआन के अध्याय क्रमांक 39, सुराह आज जुमर, आयत क्रमांक 72)।

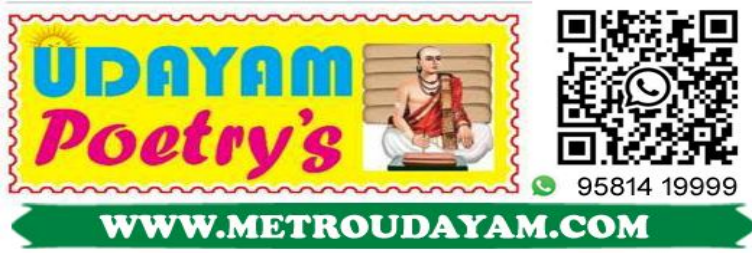

By upholding the regulations set by the district education board, she fosters an environment where teachers can teach and students can learn without disruption. Her open-door policy encourages parents, guardians, and community members to participate actively in school affairs, thereby bridging the gap between home and school. Under her guidance, the school emphasizes the sarvangin vikas -- the all-round development of each child

-- recognizing that academic excellence is only one facet of a student's personality.

The teaching staff at Jila Parishad Secondary High School is a dedicated ensemble of shikshikaye and shikshak who bring both experience and enthusiasm to the classroom. They employ a blend of traditional teaching methods and innovative techniques to cater to varied learning styles. Regular assessments are conducted at the end of every lesson, ensuring that students grasp concepts before moving forward. For subjects that pose a challenge, teachers organize remedial classes, often in small groups, allowing personalized attention. This targeted approach has resulted in a noticeable improvement in the academic performance of students who were previously lagging.

Beyond textbooks, the school places a strong emphasis on extracurricular activities. Recognizing that "khel-kud, upnyas, and pratiyogitaon are vital for building confidence, teamwork, and leadership, the institution schedules regular sports events, debates, essay-writing competitions, and cultural programs. Students participate in district-level tournaments, often returning with medals that bring pride to their families. The annual school day, a kaleidoscope of dance, drama, and music, showcases the hidden talents of the pupils and reinforces a sense of belonging within the school community.

The school provides ramps, handrails, and specially designed seating arrangements to ensure physical accessibility. Assistive devices, such as hearing aids and braille books, are made available wherever needed. This inclusive environment nurtures empathy among peers and instills in all students the values of compassion and equality.

Regular katha-kahaniyon sessions, where teachers narrate stories from Indian epics and folklore, impart ethical lessons in an engaging manner. Looking ahead, the administration envisions expanding the school's facilities to include a computer lab and a sci-

ence laboratory, which will further enrich the learning experience. Plans are also underway to introduce vocational training courses, such as basic computer literacy and tailoring, to equip students with practical skills that can be applied beyond academia. The ultimate goal remains unchanged: to produce well-rounded individuals who are academically proficient, morally upright, socially responsible, and ready to contribute positively to society.

Based on credible information, the team maintained close surveillance and identified a group involved in child begging inside trains. During the enquiry, it was revealed that the traffickers had brought the children from Math Village, Kharaara Mandal, Raipur District, Chhattisgarh, to Visakhapatnam by luring them with money. The children were forced to beg in trains such as the Janmabhoomi Express and Ratnachal Express, earning nearly ₹2000 per day for the traffickers. The rescued children were produced before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC), which ordered that they be placed in Government Childrens Homes for care and protection. A case was registered at GRP/Visakhapatnam under Case No. 00(110)/25, dated 08.11.2025, U/s 143 BNS (Trafficking of Persons), and was later transferred to Kharaara PS/Raipur for further investigation. This successful operation once again underscores the RPF/Waltairs strong commitment to combating human trafficking and protecting vulnerable children from exploitation.
