



## 227 specialists posted to strengthen secondary hosps across AP

Vijayawada: To address the shortage of specialist doctors in secondary-level hospitals that form a critical part of the government healthcare network, the State health department has deployed 227 postgraduate doctors across 142 secondary hospitals in the State.

According to officials, the postings were finalized through counselling across 12 specialties, including gynecology, general medicine, general surgery, anaesthesia, pediatrics, orthopedics, radiology, ophthalmology, dermatology, ENT, and pathology. Secondary health director Kevin Chakradhar Babu and public health director Dr. Padmavati briefed health minister Y Satyakumar Yadav on the hospital-wise and subject-wise distribution of newly posted specialists.

Of the total appointments, 155 doctors have been assigned to 100 Community Health Centers (CHCs), 60 to 33 area hospitals, 10 to seven district hospitals, and two to two MCH hospitals. The Gudur Area Hospital has



received the highest allocation, with four specialists, including a pediatrician, radiologist, dermatologist, and pathologist. Minister expressed satisfaction over the recruitment drive, saying the appointments mark a major step toward improving specialist availability and service quality in government hospitals. Out of 257 in-service PHC doctors who completed their postgraduate studies in 2022-23, 227 have been posted to secondary hospitals, while the remaining 30 doctors have been designated as tutors in Directorate of Medical Education (DME) institutions due to the absence of suitable vacancies.

## Govt to celebrate National Education Day today

Vijayawada: The State government will celebrate Minority Welfare Day and National Education Day on Tuesday, marking the birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, India's first Education Minister and prominent freedom fighter.

Law and Minority Welfare Minister NMD Farooq held a comprehensive review meeting with officials at his camp office in Tadepalli on Sunday to finalise arrangements for the state and district-level celebrations.

Minister Farooq announced that the State-level event will be held at Kshetryaya Kalakshetram here with Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu as chief guest while Minority Welfare Day will be celebrated simultaneously in all 26 district headquarters across the State. He highlighted that Maulana Azad's vision and contributions laid the foundation for India's



modern education system. To honour his legacy, the government will present lifetime achievement awards, best teacher awards, and special recognition to students who have excelled academically. Additionally, awards for contributions to the promotion of the Urdu language will also be conferred.

The review meeting was attended by Minority Finance Corporation MD Yakub Bhasha, Christian Finance Corporation MD A. Shekhar, Urdu Academy Director Ghaus Peer, Waqf Board CEO Mohammed Ali, and Minority Commission Secretary Nizamuddin, among others.

## Azharuddin takes charge as Telangana Cabinet minister

Mohammed Azharuddin on Monday took charge as Telangana's Minister for Minorities Welfare and Public Enterprises. The former Indian cricket captain, who was sworn in as the minister on October 31, took charge at Dr B. R. Ambedkar Secretariat.

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, state Congress President Mahesh Kumar Goud, ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy, Vakati Srihari, Ponnam Prabhakar, government advisor Mohammed Ali Shabbir and other leaders congratulated Azharuddin.

Talking to media persons, Azharuddin said that during his cricketing days, he never thought that he would become a minister. "I had thought I would become a cricket coach, but life took a new turn and I came into pol-



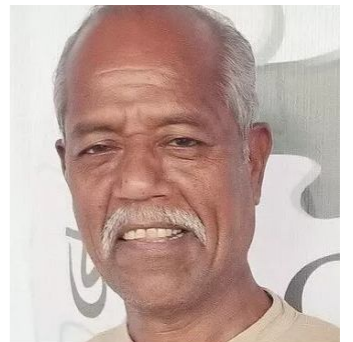
itics," he said. The former cricketer said that by the grace of Almighty Allah and with the blessings of his grandparents, parents and his other family members, he has reached this position. Thanking the central leadership of the Congress and Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, for inducting him in the Cabinet, he said he would efficiently and honestly discharge his responsibilities. He gave the assurance that he would try to resolve the pending issues related to minorities welfare.

The former MP recalled that he was asked to contest for Parliament from Moradabad Lok Sabha constituency in UP three months after he entered politics. "I can never forget the love and support I received from people of Moradabad," he said. Azharuddin said he contested for the Lok Sabha from Sawai Madhopur in 2014, and although the result was negative, he received good support from people. Azharuddin, 62, is the first Muslim face in the Revanth Reddy-led Cabinet.

The state Cabinet in August this year decided to nominate Azharuddin as a Member of the Legislative Council (MLC) under the Governor's quota. He was inducted into the Cabinet ahead of the November 11 by-election to the Jubilee Hills Assembly constituency. The former MP, who had unsuccessfully contested from his home constituency in 2023, was keen to contest again, but the Congress leadership decided to field Naveen Yadav and promised a Cabinet berth to Azharuddin. All key Muslim candidates of the Congress party, including Azharuddin, had suffered defeat in the 2023 Assembly elections. Azharuddin is currently the Working President of the state Congress and a member of its Political Affairs Committee.

## Telangana Mourns Poet Ande Sri: Creator of State Song Passes Away at 64

Poet and writer Ande Sri (64) died on Sunday night. He had serious health problems at his home in Hyderabad. His family took him to Gandhi Hospital, but he passed away despite treatment. Ande Sri was a key figure in the Telangana movement. He became a famous poet without formal schooling. The Telangana government made his song "Jaya Jayahe Telangana" the state song. Former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhara Rao expressed shock over Ande Sri's death. He offered condolences to the family and prayed for his soul. KT Rama Rao also expressed grief, saying Ande Sri's passing is a big loss to Telangana's literary community.



## Statue of Unity illuminated in grand celebration of Sardar Patel's birth anniversary

Ekta Nagar, home to the world's tallest statue, the 182-metre Statue of Unity, transformed into a panorama of lights during the Bharat Parv celebrations marking the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel.

The region's major attractions, including the Jungle Safari, Cactus Garden, Butterfly Garden, Circuit House, Ekta Mall, and administrative buildings, glittered with colourful illuminations that drew thousands of visitors, as shared by officials on Monday. The illuminations began on Sunday night and will continue for around ten days.

In Indian tradition, light symbolises the removal of darkness and the presence of spiritual energy. Reflecting this belief, Ekta Nagar shimmered like a bride, its landscape bathed in vibrant hues and artistic lighting displays that showcased



India's unity in diversity. From the towering statue to the Sardar Sarovar Dam, Tricolour laser lights illuminated the night sky, turning the area into a living canvas of patriotism and culture. Local artisans

and designers contributed to the dazzling setup, blending modern lighting technologies with traditional motifs.

The installations, featuring intricate floral patterns, golden embellishments, and classical forms, spanned over seven kilometres from Ekta Dwar to the Statue of Unity. Tourists enthusiastically captured the scenes in countless selfies and photographs, turning the illumination into a social media sensation. The celebrations also highlighted India's cultural richness, with folk art, music, handicrafts, and traditional cuisine from various states creating a festive atmosphere along the Narmada River. 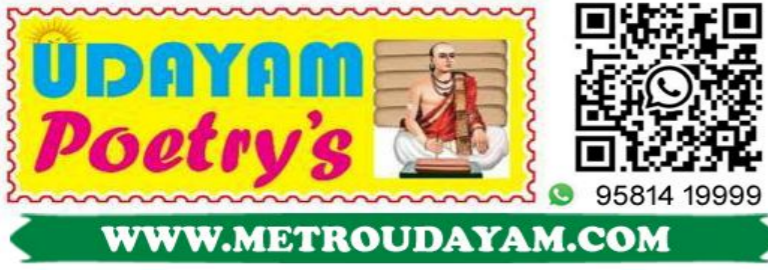

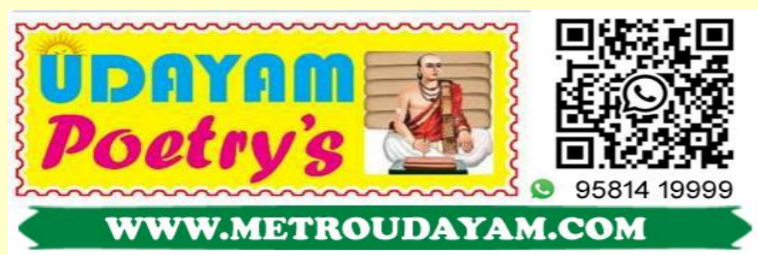

Each ripple like a message from beyond

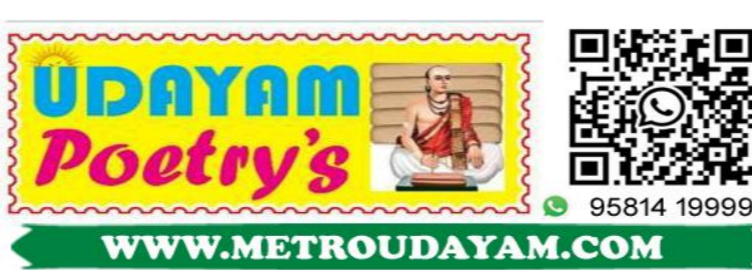
Evening descended,? And the night Aarti began

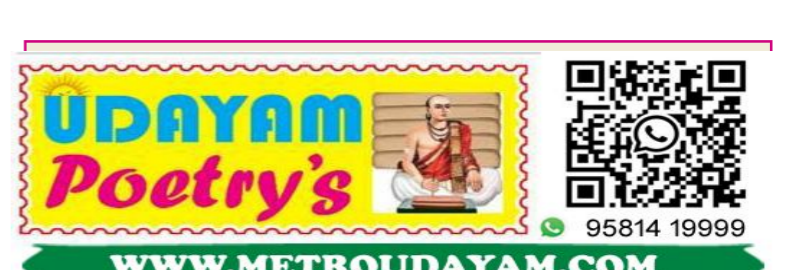

A child who once hesitated to raise a hand now presents ideas with assurance, knowing that the classroom is a safe space for trial and error. Parents report that their children, once resigned to the margins of school life, now speak eagerly about projects, friendships, and future aspirations. This transformation is the essence of our schools mission: to provide an education that transcends physical boundaries and empowers every learner to pursue their goals with dignity.

In conclusion, our schools distinctive commitment lies in the seamless integration of rights, support, and inclusive practices for students with disabilities. 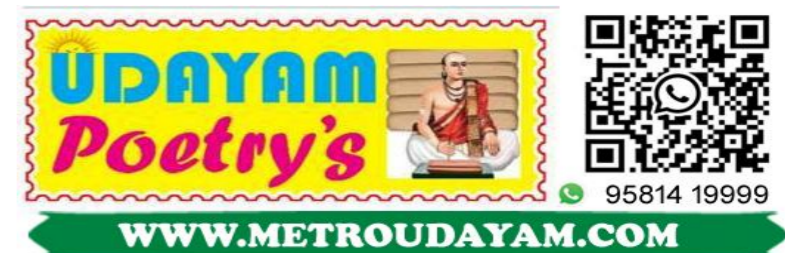

Visakhapatnam: At Seethampeta, near the Vijaya Ganapathi Temple, construction work is being carried out in violation of the approved plan, with an additional floor being built illegally. Constructing extra floors without approval has become a common practice in the city. The main reason behind this is the collusion between certain Secretariat staff and Town Planning officials. As a result, the GVMC (Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation) is losing out on its rightful revenue. Currently, a similar situation has come to light at a building near Vijaya Ganapathi Temple in Zone 3, Seethampeta, where an additional floor is being constructed without permission. Local residents have reportedly lodged complaints about this. However, they allege that the local Secretariat Planning Secretary and the Town Planning staff at the zonal office have shown their influence in the matter, allowing the construction to continue unchecked. Instead of taking strict action against such violations, some officials are allegedly turning a blind eye after receiving bribes. This not only encourages illegal constructions but also deprives GVMC of revenue through TDR (Transferable Development Rights) charges and other fees. Locals claim that these officials are collecting lakhs of rupees from the builders and letting them go unpunished. They demand immediate action against the unauthorized additional floor and a thorough inquiry into the corruption allegations against the concerned officials.
