



Piyush Goyal, Saudi Investment Minister discuss ways to deepen economic, trade ties

New Delhi: Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Wednesday met Saudi Arabia's Investment Minister Khalid Al Falih and discussed ways to further deepen economic and trade ties between the two nations.

The discussions centred around advancing trade and investment in tech, energy, infrastructure and startups, among other sectors.

"It was a pleasure to meet Saudi Arabia's Minister of Investment, @Khalid_AIFalih, along with his delegation. We discussed ways to further deepen India-Saudi Arabia economic ties, advancing trade and investment in tech, energy, infrastructure, and startups among other sectors," Goyal



said in a post on X social media platform.

Commerce Minister further said that "our partnership continues to grow stronger, built on mutual

trust and shared prosperity".

Bilateral trade between the two countries reached \$41.88 billion in 2024-25, with chemicals and petrochemicals contributing 10

per cent, which is nearly \$4.5 billion.

Last month, Goyal attended the 7th edition of Future Investment Initiative (FII) meet in Riyadh, where he met several dignitaries from the host country, including Saudi Arabian Energy Minister Prince Abdul Aziz Bin Salman Al-Saud, Commerce Minister Majid bin Abdullah AlKassabi, and Investment Minister Khalid Al Falih.

He addressed the 7th Edition of FII in one of the plenary sessions titled "The Coming Investment Mandate". He also co-chaired a conclave session on the theme "From Risk to Opportunity: Strategies for Emerging Economies in the New Industrial Policy Era" along with

the Saudi Investment Minister.

This was followed by a bilateral meeting where the two ministers deliberated expansion of investment across diverse sectors to foster economic growth and further enhance strategic partnership between the two countries. Saudi Arabia is one of India's most important strategic partners. The level of cooperation between the two countries can also be witnessed with the establishment of India-Saudi Arabia Strategic Partnership Council (SPC).

India and Saudi Arabia have also decided to enhance bilateral cooperation in the chemicals and petrochemicals sector, promoting investments and exploring new areas of collaboration.

Delhi HC Directs Delhi University To Respond To Pleas In PM Modi Degree Disclosure Case

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday instructed Delhi University (DU) to file its response to petitions seeking the condonation of delay in filing appeals related to the disclosure of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's bachelor's degree details. A Bench comprising Chief Justice Devendra Kumar Upadhyaya and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela gave the university three weeks to submit its objections.

The appeals challenge an August 25 order by a single judge that had set aside a Central Information Commission (CIC) directive to disclose Modi's degree records. The judge had ruled that holding public office does not make all aspects of an individual's personal information open to public scrutiny, stating that the Right to Information (RTI) Act promotes transparency in governance but is "not meant to fuel sensationalism."

The court also noted that educational qualifications are not a statutory requirement for occupying public office. The matter will next be heard on January 16, 2026.

The appeals were filed by RTI activist Neeraj, AAP leader Sanjay Singh, and advocate Mohd Irshad, contesting the single judge's decision. They argue that public access to the Prime Minister's academic records is a matter of



transparency and accountability.

Previously, the CIC, acting on an RTI request in 2016, had allowed the inspection of DU's 1978 BA exam records — the year in which Modi reportedly graduated. However, DU sought to block this disclosure, maintaining that the university had no issue showing records to the court but objected to public access.

The single judge had called the CIC's earlier decision "thoroughly misconceived," adding that if educational qualifications were legally required for public office, the situation might have been different.

Bihar Exit Polls 2025 Predict Decisive NDA Victory; Tejashwi Yadav Rejects Projections, Alleges Bias

Exit poll results for the 2025 Bihar Assembly elections have forecast a dominant win for the National Democratic Alliance (NDA), led by the BJP and JD(U), with several pollsters projecting the alliance to secure between 130 and 209 seats — comfortably crossing the majority mark of 122 in the 243-member assembly. The opposition Mahagathbandhan, led by Tejashwi Yadav's RJD along with the Congress and Left parties, is expected to trail behind with 70–102 seats. Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraj Party, once seen as a potential game-changer, appears to have made little impact, with most predictions giving it 0–5 seats. The exit poll projections, released after the conclusion of the second and final phase of voting, saw a record voter turnout of 66.91%, the highest ever in Bihar's electoral history. While the NDA is celebrating the early trends, the Mahagathbandhan has dismissed the results, calling them politically influenced. Tejashwi Yadav alleged that the polls were conducted under



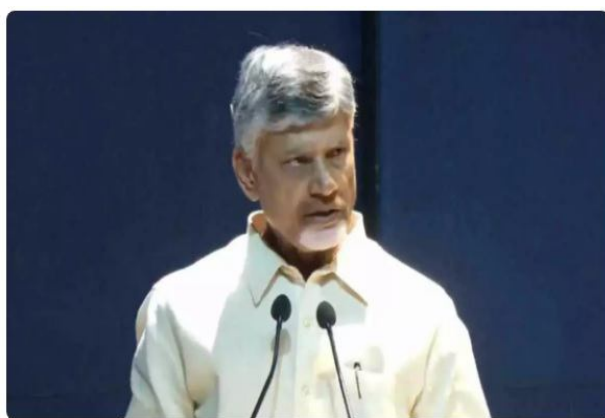
the "direction of BJP leadership" and expressed confidence that his alliance would register a clear victory when the official results are announced on November 14. JD(U) and BJP leaders, meanwhile, attributed their projected success to Nitish Kumar's development work and the increased participation of women voters, who recorded a turnout of 71.6% compared to 62.8% among men. Despite past inaccuracies in exit polls—such as in 2020 when most pollsters wrongly predicted a Mahagathbandhan win—the current predictions suggest that the NDA is poised to retain power in Bihar. The final results will be declared on November 14 under tight security across all 38 districts of the state.

Preparations underway for the CII summit in Vizag, here is CM Naidu's schedule

- The CM will engage with representatives from national and international organisations attending the summit.

- He is set to participate in the 'India-Europe Business Roundtable



Meeting' at the Novotel Hotel, followed by the inaugural session on 'Partners in Progress: Sustainable Growth.'

- Additional meetings will be held with delegates from Taiwan, Italy, Sweden, and the Netherlands, as well as participation in a programme discussing the 'Vizag Economic Region.'

- The day will conclude with a final networking dinner.

November 14 (Friday):

- The CII Partnership Conference kicks off, featuring Vice President

C.P. Radhakrishnan and Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal as notable attendees.

- Highlights include the inauguration of the AP Pavilion and Naidu's special speech during the 'AI for Vikasit Bharat' session.

- Key announcements are expected, including the launch of Drone City and Space City in Andhra Pradesh, as well as an agreement for direct flight services to Singapore.

- The CM will also deliver a keynote address at the 'AP Reimagining Public Finance Summit' and lay the foundation stone for Lulu Mall in Visakhapatnam, followed by an interview with Business Today and a gala dinner.

November 15 (Saturday):

- Naidu plans further meetings with representatives from various countries, including Bahrain, New Zealand, Japan, Canada, and Mexico.

- Foundation stone laying ceremonies for major projects such as Google, Sri City, Raymond, and Indosol are scheduled.

Playing against India in India is never easy: Ganguly feels upcoming series will be tough for SA

New Delhi: Former India captain Sourav Ganguly believes that the upcoming two-Test series will pose a tough challenge for reigning World Test Champions South Africa, noting that "playing against India in India is never easy, as they are a very strong side in subcontinent conditions." The two teams are set to face each other in a multi-format series, which will see Gill and Co. host the Proteas for two Tests and three ODIs. Then, Surykumar Yadav-led side will engage in five T20Is against the Proteas men. The first Test will be played in Kolkata's iconic Eden Gardens, home of Ganguly, who is also the President of the Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB). "The first Test starts in Kolkata in a few days, and it's going to be a tough tour for South Africa. Playing against India in India is never easy. India is a very strong side in the subcontinent, and they are a strong team even overseas these days. I'm really looking forward to the Test at Eden Gardens. South Africa is a good side, so it should be a high-quality contest," Ganguly said on JioStar.

DRM WALTAIR DIVISION REVIEWS RAILWAY OPERATIONS AT NMDC BACHELI AND KIRANDUL SIDINGS TO BOOST PRODUCTIVITY

Divisional Railway Manager (DRM), Waltair Division, Shri Lalit Bohra, accompanied by senior NMDC officials, conducted inspection of NMDC Bachel and Kirandul sidings today i.e. on 12th November 2025 to review railway operations and strengthen coordination with NMDC projects aimed at enhancing productivity.

Discussions were held between DRM and senior NMDC officials focused on improving freight loading operations. These discussions are expected to significantly increase rake loading capacity, boost traffic for both Railways and NMDC, and generate additional revenue for



both organizations. Even when winter bites the air, the villagers of Khede rise before sunrise, load their two-wheelers with fresh vegetables, fish and a few homemade goods, and set off for the nearby city. Along the frost-lined roads they meet other early risers—some gathering dry leaves and twigs, lighting small fires to ward off the cold, others already sipping tea from steaming cups. In the city market the villagers spread their produce on simple mats, their voices soft yet confident as they describe the flavor of the just-picked greens or the freshness of the fish. The transaction is not about profit; it is about sustaining a tradition that links the rural heart to the urban pulse.

These sellers do not dream of wealth; they cherish the simple joy of being useful and sharing what they have. Their hope is that the act of giving—whether a basket of tomatoes or a kind word—creates ripples of happiness. As the sun climbs, the two-wheelers return home, laden not only with earnings but with stories, laughter, and the reassurance that their small community thrives on mutual respect and love. In this quiet exchange, the cold of winter is replaced by the warmth of human connection, and every day becomes a celebration of togetherness.

Born in a modest village in Nalgonda in 1945, he grew up listening to the rhythms of rural life and later moved to Hyderabad to pursue literature. His verses, simple yet vivid, capture the struggles and joys of the common people, earning him a place in the hearts of Telanganas residents.

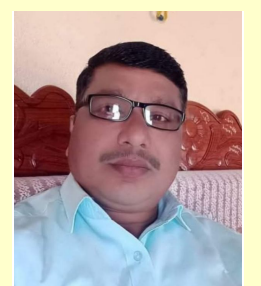
Andhesri passed away recently, and his final journey became a moment of great significance for the state. Unlike many poets whose cremation passes unnoticed, Chief Minister Shri Revanth Reddy personally attended the last rites. He carried the sacred Khandeshwari on his shoulder, a gesture that symbolised the states respect for its cultural custodians. No chief minister in recent memory had shouldered the ceremonial lamp for a poet, making the act unprecedented.

The ceremony

drew crowds from every district—artists, students, farmers—all paying tribute. It highlighted the deep bond between Telanganas political leadership and its literary heritage. By participating, Revanth Reddy reinforced the message that the government values artists as pillars of society. 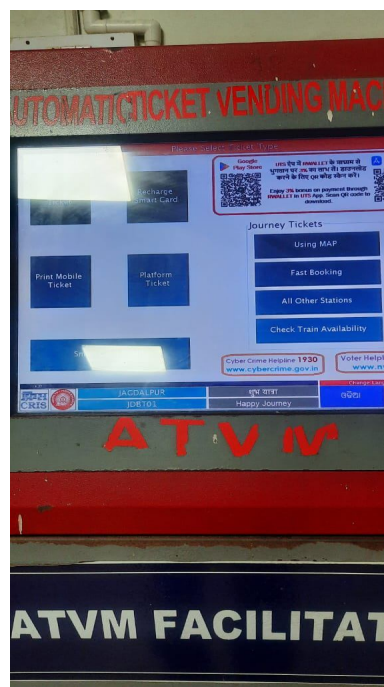

India beat SL by 10 wkts



New Delhi: India emerged victorious over Sri Lanka by 10 wickets after former union sports minister Anurag Thakur on Tuesday declared open the first-ever Women's T20 World Cup - Cricket for the Blind 2025 at the Modern School Ground here. The ceremony commenced with the national anthem, presented in sign language by specially-abled students from the Delhi branch of Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled. Speaking at the inauguration, Thakur said, "I wish all the teams the best of luck for the World Cup. You may give your best and perform well. We are going to watch you on television." Post the inauguration, India locked horns with Sri Lanka and began their campaign on a winning note. Opting to bat first, Sri Lanka were restricted to just 41 runs in 13.3 overs, as India's bowlers and fielders delivered a spectacular performance. India's sharp fielding led to seven run outs, while Deepika TC, Ganga Kadam, and Jamuna Rani Tudu claimed a wicket each. In reply, India chased down the modest target in emphatic fashion, reaching 43 without loss in just three overs.

We couldn't sleep, everyone was dancing and partying all night, says Radha Yadav on ODI WC celebrations

It's exactly a week since India won its first-ever Women's ODI World Cup with a 52-run win over South Africa at the DY Patil Stadium in Navi Mumbai and Radha Yadav, the left-arm spin bowling all-rounder, said the side celebrated the historic triumph with an unforgettable and sleepless night of dancing and partying in the hotel.

After finishing as runners-up in the 2005 and 2017 editions of the World Cup, India finally emerged triumphant in the 2025 edition of the mega event at home, with the effects of this epochal victory set to bring systematic changes for further advancement of women's cricket in the country. "We have been working very hard for many years and God has now given us this reward. So I am feeling very good. We couldn't sleep. We were together all night. Everyone was dancing and partying."

"We had dinner and actually, we couldn't sleep. But when we came out, the way people were looking at us, you could sense the difference. So I think they were also very happy and on seeing them happy, we were also full of joy," recalled Radha in an exclusive conversation with IANS on Sunday.

When asked if the World Cup-winning feeling had finally sunk in, the Vadodara-based Radha revealed her measured



approach to processing the gigantic victory, saying her balanced composure had come after years of mental conditioning developed through experiencing losses. "If I say personally, I try to treat wins and losses in the same way. Obviously, it feels very good to win a trophy. But I think I will realize after a long time that we won the World Cup, and what we have done for this generation. But for now, I think I'll stay more in the present."

"I have practiced a lot of this thing mentally, and because we have seen a lot of losses for so long, we couldn't take it. I mean, I personally couldn't take it because I am very emotional about my sport. So I have worked very hard to stay in the present." "Winning is a byproduct. You can't do anything about it and the

result. But what you can do is to do your process and routine right - so you can do those things and I look at it from that perspective," she said.

Recalling the crucial catch by skipper Harmanpreet Kaur to dismiss Nadine de Klerk that sealed India's victory, Radha revealed the tension in her mind and how that pivotal moment kick-started the frenetic, joyful scenes in the stadium bathed in a sea of blue.

"I was saying, 'please, please, please, le lo, le lo, le lo (take it, take it, take it)', and then as soon as she took the catch, we all ran to the ground. It was very, very special. The way the crowd supported us all the time, it was raining heavily, but people were still there."

"The support was massive. There was an aarti of God going on in the ground and I have never felt a more special moment in my life than that - people praying to God for us. So I think it was very special for us and for me personally."

Radha further remarked on the presence of stalwarts like Mithali Raj, Jhulan Goswami, Anjum Chopra and Reema Malhotra in the winning celebrations and holding the trophy aloft added special significance to the win.

"So far, wherever we have played, we haven't seen so many legends there. But at this time, everyone was in Mumbai - all

those who have done so much for India and contributed so much. This was not just ours - this was also for all the ex-women cricketers who have played without fame, without money, only with passion."

"So I think all of this goes to them too, as they have also have a contribution. If they hadn't played this sport, I'm not sure if we would have been able to play this sport because there would have been no platform. So I think all the credit goes to them too. For the coming generation, there will be a lot of motivation for them that yes, we also have to lift the cup."

Adding a personal dimension to the triumph, her father Omprakash Yadav was also present in the winning celebrations and even held the trophy. "It was very special, because it was also his dream that we win the World Cup. So it was a very cute moment," said Radha.

Looking ahead, she expressed confidence in the ODI World Cup having a far-reaching impact in the Indian women's cricketing ecosystem. "I think this will have a big impact on all the girls and boys too. It's not only in cricket, but in every sport. They will want to make their country proud. They will want to get so much love and support. I think a lot of people will be inspired and we will like that a lot."
