



Justice Vikram Nath nominated as Executive Chairman of NALSA by President Murmu

After Justice Surya Kant assumed office as the 53rd Chief Justice of India (CJI), the Centre notified the nomination of Supreme Court judge Justice Vikram Nath as the new Executive Chairman of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA). "In exercise of the powers conferred under Clause (b) of sub-section (2) of Section 3 of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, the President is pleased to nominate Hon'ble Mr. Justice Vikram Nath, Judge, Supreme Court of India, as Executive Chairman, National Legal Services Authority, with effect from 24.11.2025," said a notification issued by the Union Ministry of Law and Justice.

Justice Vikram Nath has taken over as the head of NALSA, succeeding Justice Surya Kant.

Justice Kant, who assumed the role on May 14, 2025, vacated the position on Monday following his swearing-in as the CJI by President Droupadi Murmu.

CJI Kant has begun his 14-month



tenure in the country's highest judicial office, succeeding Justice Bhushan R. Gavai, who demitted the CJI's office on Sunday on attaining the age of 65 years.

Upholding established convention, then CJI Gavai had recommended

Justice Kant, the senior-most judge of the Supreme Court, as his successor.

NALSA, established under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, plays a vital role in ensuring access to justice for marginalised and underprivileged citizens.

Its mandate flows from Article 39A of the Constitution, a Directive Principle of State Policy, which obligates the State to ensure that the legal system promotes justice on the basis of equal opportunity and to provide free legal aid so that no citizen is denied justice due to economic or other disabilities.

Article 39A provides that "the State shall secure that the operation of the legal system promotes justice, on a basis of equal opportunity, and shall, in particular, provide free legal aid, by suitable legislation or schemes or in any other way, to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities."

Indian Navy commissions INS Mahe: Silent hunter ready to neutralise sub-surface threats

The Indian Navy commissioned INS Mahe, the first of the indigenously-designed and built Mahe-class Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC), during a ceremony held at the Naval Dockyard in Mumbai on Monday.

The event, hosted by Vice Admiral Krishna Swaminathan, Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Western Naval Command, was presided over by Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi, with senior naval officers, representatives from Cochin Shipyard Ltd, Kochi, and distinguished guests in attendance.

This landmark moment reflects unprecedented synergy, mutual trust and seamless jointness shaping today's Indian Armed Forces - a powerful symbol of how our services stand together, think together and move together towards a future-ready, fully integrated force.

The ship takes her name from the historic coastal town of Mahe on the Malabar Coast. The town's maritime heritage and tranquil estuary mirror the



ship's balance of elegance and strength.

The ship's crest features the Urumi, the flexible sword of Kalaripayattu, rising from stylised blue waves - a symbol of agility, precision, and lethal grace. Her mascot, the Cheetah, embodies speed and focus, while the motto "Silent Hunters" reflects the ship's stealth, vigilance, and unyielding readiness.

Designed and constructed by Cochin Shipyard Limited, Kochi, INS Mahe is the lead ship of eight vessels in her class.

Drawing on the expertise of BEL, L&T Defence, Mahindra

Defence Systems, NPOL, and more than 20 MSMEs, the project reinforces India's expanding ecosystem of naval design, equipment, and system integration.

INS Mahe stands as a shining symbol of Aatmanirbhar Bharat. With over 80 per cent indigenous content, the ship underscores the Indian Navy's sustained efforts to promote indigenisation through homegrown solutions and innovative technologies.

The commissioning of INS Mahe adds significant punch to the Indian Navy's ASW capabilities, particularly in countering

threats in the littorals. The ship's combat suite blends multiple systems into a compact yet potent network.

She is specially designed to undertake anti-submarine operations in coastal and shallow waters. Fitted with advanced weapons, sensors, and communication systems enabling it to detect, track, and neutralise sub-surface threats with precision, the ship can sustain prolonged operations in shallow waters and features technologically advanced machinery and control systems.

The Mahe-class will form the first line of coastal defence, integrating seamlessly with larger surface combatants, submarines, and aviation assets to maintain constant vigilance over India's maritime areas of operation.

INS Mahe reaffirms the Indian Navy's status as Combat Ready, Cohesive, and Aatmanirbhar, safeguarding seas for a Viksit Samridha Bharat.

Australia-Canada-India pact to help fight climate change, boost supply chain resilience

The Australia-Canada-India Technology and Innovation Partnership (ACITI), signed on the sidelines of the G20 summit in Johannesburg, is seen by analysts as a strategic blueprint for navigating the complex challenges of climate change, technological sovereignty, and strengthening supply chain resilience.

As the world grapples with supply disruptions, environmental imperatives, and the tectonic shifts brought about by artificial intelligence, the ACITI partnership stands out as a model for like-minded democracies to collaborate on the frontlines of green energy innovation, digital transformation, and critical resource security, according to an article in One World Outlook.

The triad of countries brings complementary strengths to this alliance. Australia and



Canada are custodians of abundant critical minerals essential for the batteries, electric vehicles, and digital infrastructure underpinning the green economy. India, meanwhile, represents a manufacturing powerhouse with a massive domestic market and grow-

ing expertise in AI and digital public infrastructure (DPI). Together, they form a synergistic ecosystem to accelerate clean energy technologies, diversify supply chains, and shape globally trusted standards, the article points out.

Supply chain diversification is at the heart of this partnership. After the disruption following the COVID-19 pandemic and rising geopolitical tensions impacting the Indo-Pacific and beyond, it is clear that relying on concentrated sources for minerals or technology inputs poses systemic risks. ACITI's focus on securing resilient value chains for lithium, cobalt, rare earths, and other critical materials not only cushions against shocks but also promotes responsible sourcing and circular economy practices aligned with sustainability goals, the article observes.

Green energy innovation is another linchpin of the partnership. The three nations will collaborate on research, development, and deployment of renewable energy technologies — including hydrogen, energy storage, and advanced clean-tech systems. As Australia and Canada push ambitious net-zero targets, India's vast energy demand and manufacturing capacity offer opportunities for scalable impact. This trilateral cooperation could set new global benchmarks for accelerating the energy transition while maintaining industrial competitiveness, the article further states.

Besides, the article lauds the ACITI partnership as positive development that provides a platform to promote responsible AI development and public-interest digital implementations.

ly responded and stopped a passenger train on noticing technical brake binding during the month of September.

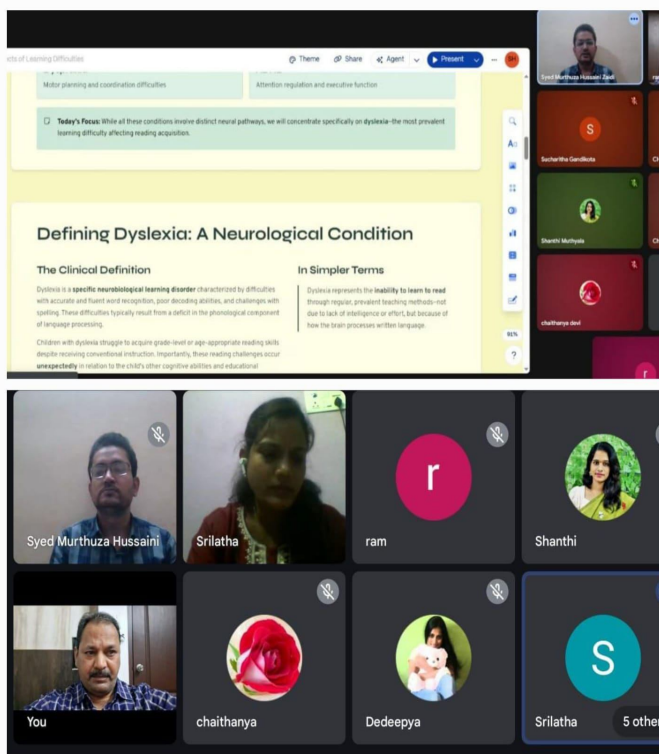

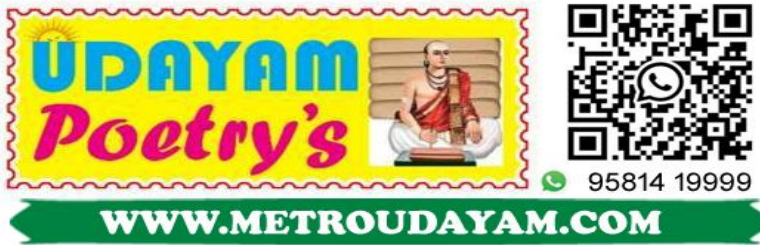


Ashwini Vaishnav for fulfilling this long-standing regional demand.

In addition, since 2014, 1460 flyovers and road under-bridges have been constructed in the state. To enhance passenger convenience, 154 lifts and 156 escalators have been installed at various stations, and Wi-Fi facilities have been provided at 771 stations.

Currently, 34 Vande Bharat Express and 26 Amrit Bharat Express trains are operating in Uttar Pradesh.

Gangaputra net throwing competitions to celebrate World Fisheries Day

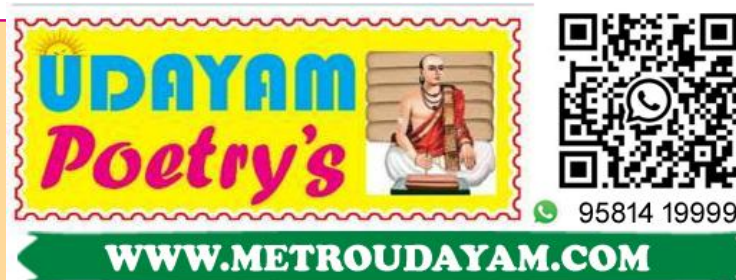
Hyderabad, November:24, Metrodayam

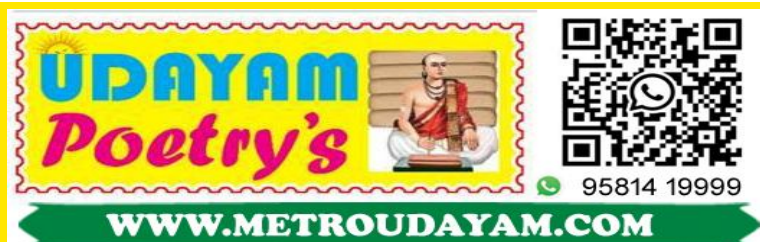

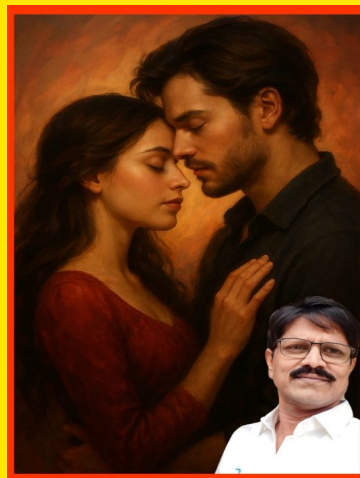

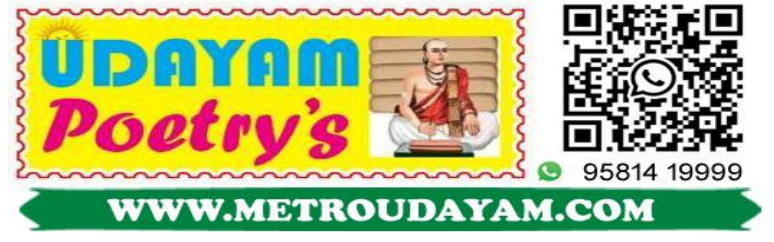
