



Telangana Rising Global Summit: Modi, Rahul Gandhi among key invitees

Hyderabad: TheTelangana government is gearing up to host the prestigious Telangana Rising Global Summit on December 8 and 9 at Bharat Future City, with invitations extended to national and international leaders, policy-makers, and industry icons. Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy will personally invite Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, and AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge to the landmark event. The summit is envisioned as a platform to showcase Telangana's growth trajectory, attract global investments, and foster dialogue on innovation, governance, and sustainable development.

A Broad Spectrum of Invitees drawn up with a list of participants, including Union Ministers, Chief Ministers of all states, eminent industrialists, economists, sportspersons, media personalities, diplomats, and experts from diverse fields. State ministers and senior officials will extend invitations befitting the stature of the guests, ensuring wide representation across sectors. To streamline the process, an invitation committee has been constituted under the leadership of Special Chief Secretary Sabyasachi Ghosh. The committee will oversee the entire exercise—from finalising invitees to coordinating their arrival, hospitality, and logistical support. A dedicated website will be



launched to manage registrations and provide real-time updates. chief Minister A Revanth Reddy will personally monitor the progress through a dashboard system, ensuring transparency and efficiency. "We have already sent invitations to 4,500 representatives from various sectors, of which 1,000 have confirmed their participation," said Jayesh Ranjan, Special Chief Secretary to the government. The Telangana Rising Global Summit is expected to serve as a flagship event for the state, positioning Hyderabad and Telangana as hubs of innovation and investment. With Bharat Future City as the venue, the summit will highlight Telangana's infrastructure capabilities and its readiness to host large-scale

international gatherings. Officials emphasised that the summit will not only showcase Telangana's achievements but also provide a forum for policy discussions, business collaborations, and cultural exchange. The presence of top national leaders alongside global stakeholders is expected to amplify the state's visibility on the international stage. By bringing together political leaders, industry captains, and thought leaders, the summit aims to generate actionable insights and partnerships that can accelerate Telangana's growth. The government hopes the event will reinforce the state's image as a progressive, investment-friendly destination, while also promoting inclusive development.

SC issues notices on plea seeking provisional SIR for CAA-eligible migrants

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Monday issued notices to the Centre, the Election Commission of India (ECI) and the West Bengal government on a plea seeking provisional Special Interim Revision (SIR) for Hindus, Buddhists and Christians who migrated to the state from Bangladesh before 2014. The bench of Chief Justice of India Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi took note of the petition filed by NGO Atmadeep and sought responses from the authorities concerned. The matter will be heard next on December 9. The petition contends that despite applying for Indian citizenship before 2014, many migrants -- who fled Bangladesh due to religious persecution -- have not received any relief or progress on their applications. According to the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA), such persecuted minorities are eligible for Indian citizenship. The CAA's provisions apply to Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains, Parsis and Christians from Afghanistan, Bangladesh and Pakistan who entered India on or before December 31, 2014, and were exempted under the Passport (Entry into India) Act, 1920 or the Foreigners Act, 1946. The 2019



amendment introduced a Section allowing these groups to apply for registration or naturalisation as Indian citizens. The petition notes that several applications for naturalisation from eligible migrants remain pending due to administrative delays. It further highlighted that many others are still awaiting an opportunity to apply for citizenship under Section 6B through the online mechanism introduced by the Citizenship (Amendment Rules), 2024. The NGO also points out that a significant number of these migrants have been living in India for years, and their names already feature on the 2025 electoral rolls. It argues that to prevent disenfranchisement during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR), these individuals should be granted provisional voter enrollment. The plea urges the Supreme Court to issue directions ensuring protection for such applicants until their citizenship process is completed.

Priyanka Gandhi Vadra Says Real 'Drama' Is Blocking Debate on Public Issues in Parliament

New Delhi:Congress general secretary and MP Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Monday criticised Prime Minister Narendra Modi, asserting that raising public-interest issues in Parliament is not "drama," but preventing discussions on them is. Her remarks came shortly after the Prime Minister accused the opposition of using Parliament to vent frustration after electoral losses, urging that the Winter Session be utilised for constructive and result-oriented debate rather than political theatrics. Responding to his comments ahead of the sixth session of the 18th Lok Sabha and the 269th Rajya



Sabha, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said Parliament exists to address urgent public concerns such as the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of voter lists and severe air pollution. She argued that the real issue is the refusal to allow democratic debate on matters that directly affect citizens, questioning why crucial topics are being sidelined. Meanwhile, sources said parties in the INDIA bloc have decided to make the SIR controversy their top agenda in both Houses, with a consensus that it will be taken up first for debate during the ongoing Winter Session.

TDP seeks immediate start of voter list revision in AP

Amaravati: TDP Parliamentary Party Leader Lavu Srikrishna Devaraya said in Lok Sabha that the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls must begin immediately in Andhra Pradesh. His remarks came after an all-party meeting held in New Delhi on Sunday under the chairmanship of Union Ministers Rajnath Singh and Kiren Rijiju, ahead of Parliament winter session. Speaking to reporters after the meeting, Srikrishna Devaraya said TDP welcomed the move to regularise voter lists but stressed that the SIR process should be launched at once in the State. He also urged the Centre to strengthen voter-identification mechanisms on



the lines of Aadhaar system to ensure accuracy and transparency. Devaraya said he had requested the Speaker to admit seven issues for discussion during the winter session. These include use and allocation of Krishna River water, economic implications of GST revisions and losses suffered by Andhra Pradesh due to the recent cyclone. He said the State requires clarity on

Krishna water-sharing arrangements and a detailed review of the fiscal fallout from GST adjustments. He also sought a debate on farm-sector distress, highlighting challenges faced by cotton, corn, banana and aqua farmers. He noted that operational issues at Cotton Corporation of India continue to hurt growers, while banana and corn farmers need a better support-price regime. Aqua farmers, he said, are struggling due to pricing pressures created by US tax structures. Devaraya reminded that Andhra Pradesh secured significant investment commitments at CII Partnership Summit held in Visakhapatnam on November 14-15.

Lok Sabha pays tribute to Dharmendra, four other former members

New Delhi: The Winter Session of Parliament opened on a turbulent note on Monday as the Lok Sabha was forced to adjourn till noon barely minutes after it assembled at 11 a.m., drowned out by unrelenting opposition protests. As soon as the House met, Speaker Om Birla led members in paying rich tributes to five former parliamentarians who passed away recently. Among them were Col. Sonaram Choudhary, the sitting Congress MP from Barmer in Rajasthan; legendary actor and former BJP MP from Bikaner, Dharmendra; Prof. Vijay Kumar Malhotra (South Delhi); Prakash Jaiswal; and Ravi Kumar Naik (Panaji, Goa). Describing Dharmendra as an evergreen icon of Indian cinema who later served the nation in Parliament, the Speaker said the veteran star would always



be remembered for generations. The Speaker described Dharmendra as an iconic celluloid figure who brought laurels to the country through his cinematic contributions and later served the people as a parliamentarian. The House also rose to congratulate Indian sportspersons and teams for their

outstanding achievements on the global stage. Turning to the conduct of the House, Speaker Birla made a strong appeal for decorum. "This is the temple of the world's largest democracy. It is not meant for placards and banners. You have been elected to raise public issues through discussion, not disruption," he said, expressing pain that Question Hour -- the most vital segment for government accountability -- was being deliberately derailed in a "planned manner" session after session. Despite the plea, opposition members continued shouting slogans and flashing placards, demanding discussion on the ongoing SIR (Special Intensive Revision) in 12 states and union territories, making it impossible to transact any business. In the fleeting calm before the storm, as Question Hour began, BJP

member Anurag Sharma from Jhansi-Lalitpur managed to raise detailed supplementaries on the Ken-Betwa River Linking Project. He demanded inclusion of additional areas of Lalitpur in the project's benefits, sought the latest status of the Environmental Impact Assessment report, its findings on biodiversity, forest cover and water resources, and pressed for information on mitigation measures, compensatory afforestation, soil and water conservation, rehabilitation of mined sites, and monitoring mechanisms in Jhansi and Lalitpur districts. Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change Bhupender Yadav responded briefly, advising the member to take up state-specific issues with the Uttar Pradesh government.

Foundation Stone Laid for 123-Crore Jurala High-Level Bridge Connecting Kottapally and Atmakur



Gadwal: In a significant infrastructural milestone for the region, the foundation stone for the ₹123-crore Jurala High-Level Bridge across the Krishna River—from Kottapally village in Gadwal mandal to Atmakur in Wanaparthy district—was formally laid today.

As part of his tour of Atmakur mandal in the erstwhile Mahbubnagar district, Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy arrived as the chief guest for the groundbreaking ceremony. He was accompanied by Deputy Chief Minister Damodar Raja Narasimha, Minister Komatireddy Venkata Reddy, District Minister Jupally Krishna Rao, Minister V. Srinivas Goud, along with several MLAs from the erstwhile Mahbubnagar district.

Gadwal MLA Bandla Krishna Mohan Reddy warmly welcomed the Chief Minister by presenting him with a shawl and bouquet, extending a respectful and grand felicitation on behalf of the constituency.

Speaking on the occasion, MLA Krishna Mohan Reddy expressed heartfelt gratitude to the Chief Minister and the state ministers for initiating the construction of the much-awaited high-level bridge. He conveyed thanks on behalf of the people of Gadwal constituency, noting that the project would significantly improve connectivity and boost regional development.

60 kg gold to adorn Yadagirigutta temple's majestic Gopuram

Hyderabad: The gold-plating work on the Vimana Gopuram in Yadagirigutta is yet to be completed. The authorities, who had initially aimed to finish it earlier this year, have postponed the deadline, with officials now stating that the work will be completed by February or March, ahead of the annual Brahmotsavam. The Yadagirigutta temple authorities are taking up gold plating works of Vimana Gopuram of Sri Laskshmi Narsimha Swamy with over 60 kgs of gold worth Rs 21 crore secured from the donations by the devotees. The works were started in November 2024 with a Chennai based company fixing the gold plates. The officials had planned to complete the gold plating works before February.

A senior official informed that the works were going on every day and under CCTV surveillance. The works are taken up as per the aspirations and senti-



ments of the devotees. The gold plating will cover 10,500 sq. ft. of copper sheets on the main Vimana Gopuram of the temple, which rises nearly 48 feet in height. "Once completed, this will be the tallest gold-plated Vimana Gopuram, surpassing the Gopuram of Lord Sri Venkateshwara Swamy in Tirumala. The Tirumala Gopuram has three storeys, whereas the Yadagirigutta Temple's Gopuram has five storeys and stands 48 feet tall," said a senior official, adding that the work is

expected to be completed and fully in place by February–March.

However, several works in the temple are likely to take time as many works were said to be pending. The Nityannadana satram taken up with a cost of Rs 11 crore through donations was yet to be completed. Presently, the Annaprashadam is provided in the Deeksha Mandalam arena. The official said that out of the 60 kg of gold, 25 kg of gold is stored at the temple and 35 kg of gold donated

were being used. The state government was bearing a total of Rs 8 crore for the preparation and fixing charges of gold plating. These works will be completed by the upcoming Brahmotsavam. Proposals have also been made for the construction of a Vedapathashala on 17 acres at a cost of Rs 43.79 crore. In addition, the government has decided to acquire 101 acres of land to set up a hostel. A dormitory hall has been set up on the hill for the accommodation of devotees, the official added.

In Andhra, a kg of banana is cheaper than a matchbox: Jagan Mohan Reddy

A kilogram of bananas is sold at 50 paise in Andhra Pradesh, cheaper than a matchbox, YSR Congress Party President and former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy said on Monday. Jagan Mohan Reddy took to X to highlight the plight of banana farmers in the state. "Hello India, Look towards Andhra Pradesh! One kilogram of bananas is being sold for just Rs 0.50! Yes, you heard it right, fifty paise. This is the plight of banana farmers in AP. Cheaper than a matchbox, cheaper than a single biscuit. This is a cruel blow to farmers who invest lakhs of rupees and months of hard work, only to receive pain in return," he wrote. "Not only bananas, from onions to tomatoes, no crop is receiving remunerative prices. Neither free crop insurance nor input subsidies during calamities, nor the promised cultivation support. Everything proved to be a farce," he added. Jagan Mohan Reddy claimed that during his YSRCP's tenure, the price of bananas was maintained at an average of Rs 25,000 per tonne and special trains were arranged from the state to New



Delhi to ensure farmers never incurred losses. "That commitment saved thousands of families, and cold storages were constructed across the state to protect farmers from distress sales. But today, Chandrababu has abandoned farmers to their fate, watching silently as agriculture crumbles. If food is worth Rs 0.50 today, what is the value of the hands that grow it?" he said, attacking Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu. The YSRCP chief posted photographs of the protest by banana farmers and the party leaders. Meanwhile, YSRCP Rajya Sabha member Pili Subhash Chandra Bose has urged the Union Agriculture Ministry to intervene immediately and provide relief to banana farmers of Rayalaseema, stating that market failures are

destroying the livelihoods of thousands of small and marginal farmers. He appealed to the Centre to take urgent steps to protect farmers from ruin. Raising the issue during Zero Hour in the Rajya Sabha, he highlighted the alarming collapse of banana prices in the region, which has pushed farmers into deep distress. He said that despite record cultivation and high yields in recent seasons, the sudden crash in market prices has caused unprecedented losses. In Pulivendula, one of the biggest banana-producing zones, prices fell sharply from Rs 22,000 per tonne to Rs 8,000 per tonne within a month, marking a 60 per cent collapse. Many farmers have been forced to throw away ripe fruit as they were unable to sell their produce. Pointing to severe drought and erratic rainfall in the 2025 Kharif season, Bose noted that cultivation fell drastically to only 19 to 35 per cent of normal in districts such as YSR Kadapa, Kurnool, and Anantapur. He said the situation has devastated farmers who invested lakhs of rupees expecting a stable income.

KIUG 2025: Chandigarh University's Tanya Choudhary breaks meet record to clinch hammer throw gold

Chandigarh University's Tanya Choudhary broke her own meet and All India University (AIU) record to clinch the women's hammer throw gold medal while Jain University's Keerthana and Shivaji University's Rushiprasad Desai were crowned the fastest women and men athletes in the Khelo India University Games (KIUG) Rajasthan 2025 at the Sawai Mansingh Stadium in Jaipur on Monday. The fifth edition of KIUG 2025 is being held across seven cities in Rajasthan. A whopping 4448 athletes from 222 Universities are competing in 23 medal disciplines. The Games are being held under the aegis of the Sports Authority of India (SAI) in collaboration with the Rajasthan State Sports Council and are being hosted by Poornima University. Hangzhou Asian Games participant Tanya Choudhary hurled the hammer to 64.29m, improving her own All India University record to complete a hat-trick of KIUG medals. Tanya also held the earlier KIUG meet record of 60.61m. Haqikat Kaur Grewa of Panjab University took the silver with an effort of 51.90m, while



Punjabi University's Aman Deep Kaur's throw of 45.06m was enough for her to take the bronze. "I was targeting the national record, but things didn't go as planned. But I am still happy to win my third consecutive Khelo India University Games gold," Grewa told SAI Media. Chandigarh University also bagged a gold medal in women's shot put with Shiksha clearing a distance of 15 metres. Chandigarh University are now fourth in the overall standing with 13 gold. Guru Nanak Dev University continue to lead the standings with 30 gold, 10 silver, and 12 bronze. In the evening session, Keerthana won Jain University's first gold medal outside

the swimming pool when she sprinted to women's 100m gold with a time of 11.94s. Teena Pareek of Lovely Professional University (12.18s) and Samriti Jamwal of Himachal Pradesh University (12.21s) took home silver and bronze, respectively. Rushiprasad Desai of Shivaji University clinched the men's 100m gold with a time of 10.53s, with Laukik Melge of Savitribai Phule Pune University (10.59s) and Jai Bhoir of Somaiya Vidyavihar (10.86s) winning the silver and bronze medals respectively. Earlier, Busra Khan, representing Rabindranath Tagore, was the first gold medallist in track and field events, winning the women's 5000m, clocking 18:15.27. Pawara Rink Dhany of Kavayitri Bahinabai University took the silver, clocking 18.20.52. In men's 5000m, Trilok Kumar of Lalit Narayan Mithila University clinched the gold after clocking 15:06.16, while Gaurav Yadav of Deen Dayal Upadhyay University took the silver with 15:49.23. At the Poornima University football

ground, Guru Nanak University set up a summit clash against Chaudhary Bansilal University, Bhiwani, in the women's category. In the semifinals, Guru Nanak Dev University defeated Lovely Professional University 2-1, while Chaudhary Bansilal University got the better of Guru Jambheshwar University 1-0.

He can't go bang-bang straight away: Gavaskar breaks down Kohli's masterclass vs SA

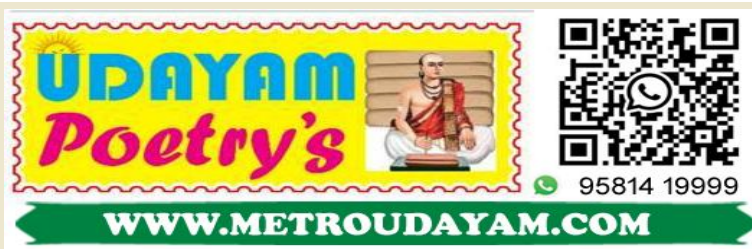


New Delhi: Legendary India batter Sunil Gavaskar has lauded Virat Kohli's disciplined and calculated approach after the talismanic batter struck a match-winning century against South Africa in the first ODI in Ranchi. Kohli was at his brilliant best as he blasted 135 from just 120 deliveries, his 52nd ODI century, on Sunday and in the process help India to a 17-run triumph and a 1-0 series lead in the three-game ODI series against the Proteas.

Reflecting on Kohli's technique and temperament, Gavaskar said the India talisman succeeds because he understands his own game better than anyone else. "He is the type of batter who can't go bang-bang straight away. Some batters can, but Kohli knows his game inside out, and he knows that's not his strength. His strength is striking the ball through the covers, playing the straight drive and the flick. Yes, he'll occasionally play the bottom-hand flick for six Over square-leg or mid-wicket, but otherwise he plays in the V. That's the safest way to bat, especially when the pitch may keep low or the ball may move around," Gavaskar said on JioStar. He also highlighted Kohli's exceptional running between the wickets, which he believes remains a defining feature of the former captain's batting. "The running between the wickets is crucial, singles are the lifeblood of batting in any format. You keep taking singles and your innings keeps flowing. Even if the crowd wants quicker scoring, he bats as the team needs," Gavaskar noted.

Kohli also shared a 136-run stand with former skipper Rohit Sharma (57). This was the 20th stand of 100 runs or more between the two. Gavaskar also lauded Rohit's 57-run innings, during which he shattered the former Pakistan cricketer Shahid Afridi's world record for most sixes in ODIs by hitting three maximums. "He batted beautifully. He gave one opportunity to Tony de Zorzi, could have been a different situation, but he capitalised well after that. He loves those cover drives and flicks, comes down the wicket when he wants to, and puts bowlers under pressure.

One particular shot summed up his innings for me: third man was up, point was up, and he just guided the ball delicately past short third man for four. It caught everyone off guard. He was reading the game superbly. He's a fantastic batter. I love watching him, even though I never got him out," he said. Notably, Kohli, playing his 306th ODI, and Rohit, playing in his 277th one-day international, combined for their 392nd international match together across formats, surpassing the legendary duo of Sachin Tendulkar and Rahul Dravid, who appeared in a whopping 391 games between 1996 and 2012.

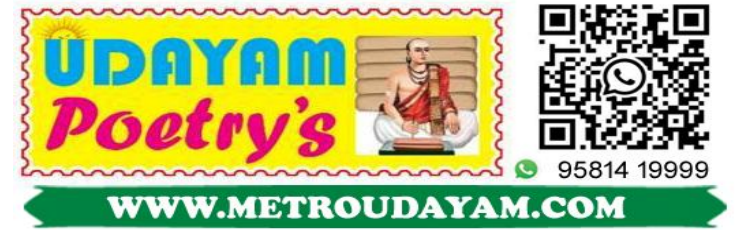
