



## Andhra CM Chandrababu Naidu meets Singapore President in Zurich

Amaravati: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu met Singapore President Tharmar Shanmugaratnam on Monday soon after his arrival in Zurich to participate in the World Economic Forum.

The Chief Minister posted on social media platform X that he was delighted to meet the Singapore President.

He also met the World Bank Group President Ajay Banga in Zurich.

Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, who is leading a delegation of Ministers and officials, also met the Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma. The Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister said on X that his Assamese counterpart Sarma made history by becoming the first Chief Minister from Assam to participate in the World Economic Forum annual meeting in Davos, Switzerland.

Chandrababu Naidu congratulated CM Sarma and wished him success. Earlier, Indian Ambassador to Switzerland, Mridul Kumar, welcomed Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu at



the Zurich airport.

Civil Aviation Minister K. Ram Mohan Naidu accompanied the Chief Minister.

"Landed in Zurich for the Annual Meeting of the World Economic Forum at Davos-Klosters. Held under the theme 'A Spirit of Dialogue', the meeting is another proud opportunity to represent my state, Andhra Pradesh, and my people on a global platform that brings together leaders from business, government, international organisations, civil society, and academia to shape the future," CM Chandrababu

Naidu said on X while thanking Ambassador Mridul Kumar for his warm welcome.

According to an official statement here, a large number of Telugu people, NRIs, and Telugu Desam Party (TDP) activists from more than 20 European countries welcomed the Chief Minister. Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and the state Ministers accompanying will participate in the four-day World Economic Forum summit with the aim of attracting investments. Nearly 3,000 delegates from about 130 countries are

expected to attend the World Economic Forum summit.

Seven Chief Ministers from India are attending the event.

With a large number of representatives from prominent companies attending, the Andhra Pradesh government has prepared PowerPoint presentations to fully explain the investment opportunities in the state.

Plans are in place to attract investments in sectors such as green energy, green ammonia, AI, quantum computing, and biotechnology.

The TDP-led coalition government in Andhra Pradesh will also focus on investments in sectors such as tourism, hospitality, education, and healthcare. The Chief Minister's team will explain the measures taken and policies implemented by the Andhra Pradesh government in various sectors to national and international companies.

The state government will bring to the attention of industrialists the fact that a Quantum Valley is being established in Amaravati. Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu's team will prominently

mention the measures being taken by the state government to train AI experts.

The Andhra Pradesh government will announce that it is conducting an advanced quantum skilling course to train one lakh quantum experts.

Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu will inform industrialists that 50,000 people have already registered for training in the advanced quantum skilling course.

The Chief Minister will specifically mention the Kakinada Green Ammonia-Green Hydrogen production plant.

The Andhra Pradesh government was able to attract investments worth nearly Rs 2.36 lakh crore through the agreements and consultations held at last year's World Economic Forum.

Team Andhra Pradesh will provide details of the Visakhapatnam investment summit to the industrialists.

Andhra Pradesh Ministers Nara Lokesh, TG Bharat, and senior officials from various departments are accompanying the Chief Minister.

## YSRCP leaders stage protest at DGP office over party activist's murder

Amaravati: YSR Congress Party leaders staged a dharna in front of the DGP's office after police refused to grant them an appointment to submit a complaint regarding the brutal murder of the party's Dalit activist Manda Salman.

YSRCP leaders said they were denied permission to meet Director General of Police (DGP) Harish Kumar Gupta, forcing them to protest outside the office, after which an Additional DGP finally received their representation.

Former minister Merugu Nagarjuna stated that Salman's killing was a "government-sponsored murder" and demanded a CBI probe.

He said police not only failed to register a proper FIR on the murder but also shockingly booked a case against Salman himself.

He added that leaders were initially not even allowed to see Salman's body and that police responded only after YSRCP president and former Chief Minister Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy said he would personally come and perform the burial.

He questioned what was happening in the state, stating that even serious crimes against women and children were not being registered and that the Constitution had been replaced by a 'Red Book rule'.

Former MLA Kasu Mahesh Reddy said Andhra Pradesh had descended into lawlessness, where even after the murder of a Dalit activist, police failed to act against the attackers and instead filed cases against the deceased. He said Salman's family was obstructed from performing the last rites according to religious customs and that authorities went to the extent of demanding Aadhaar cards even



for burial. He announced that YSRCP would approach the High Court through a PIL and continue its struggle until justice is delivered to Salman's family. Former minister T.J.R. Sudhakar Babu said YSRCP leaders were humiliated at the DGP office and questioned whether the DGP was working for the people or acting as an agent of Chandrababu Naidu. He recalled rampant attacks on Dalits, demanded Rs 1 crore compensation to Salman's family and called for action against MLA Yarapathineni Srinivas Rao.

Former minister Vidadala Rajini accused police of abandoning their constitutional duty and serving Chandrababu Naidu and Nara Lokesh. She said that SCs, STs, BCs, and minorities have no protection, that TDP goons are committing murders, and that even common citizens cannot enter police stations without political clearance.

MLC Mondithoka Arun Kumar said the killing of a Dalit activist exposed the government's true face and called upon Dalits to unite against what he termed "barbaric rule".

Former minister Ambati Rambabu said police conduct in the case was deeply controversial, that repeated attempts to submit a complaint were ignored, and that the protest was forced upon them. He demanded a high-level inquiry and immediate relief for Salman's family.

## 'AWARE' services introduced in health dept to ensure early action

Amaravati: The Andhra Pradesh Health Department will now utilise the services of AWARE (Advance Warning Advisory for Resilient Ecosystem) wing of the Real Time Governance Society (RTGS) to monitor seasonal diseases in real time and prevent their spread, Medical and Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav announced on Sunday. He stated that as per the directions of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, the department is taking concrete steps to effectively use technology to curb disease outbreaks across the State.

Through the AWARE platform at RTGS, the intensity and possible spread of diseases will be identified at an early stage, enabling swift and preventive action. The Minister explained that historical data from the past five to six years will be analysed village- and secretariat-wise to track cases of communicable diseases such as dengue, malaria, typhoid and others. This data-driven approach will help identify vulnerable regions well in



advance. Climate change patterns and their impact on seasonal diseases will also be assessed, allowing authorities to issue early advisories and take precautionary measures. Officials from the Directorate of Secondary Health and the Directorate of Medical Education have been sensitised on how to effectively use RTGS services.

The AWARE wing, which continuously tracks weather changes, will alert both the government machinery and the public.

Based on data analysis, it will forecast the likelihood of specific diseases in particular regions, facilitating timely inter-

ventions.

Disease cases will be mapped secretariat-wise, considering geographical conditions through Geographic Information System (GIS).

By linking historical case data, officials will gain a comprehensive understanding of regional health conditions.

Minister Satya Kumar also said that detailed data related to immunisation, maternal and child health, caesarean deliveries and infants receiving vaccinations is being compiled village- and secretariat-wise. During cyclones, the AWARE platform will be especially useful in identifying high-risk pregnant women and shifting them to safer locations.

Additionally, the AWARE platform under RTGS is being integrated with several other departments, including Agriculture, Fisheries, Environment and Pollution Control, Water and Reservoir Management, satellite-based monitoring systems, Disaster Management and other key sectors, to ensure coordinated and effective governance.

# “Driver Drishti” Initiative Paves Way for Safer Roads Through Better Vision

## INTRODUCTION OF REGULAR SERVICE OF WEEKLY AMRIT BHARAT EXPRESS TRAINS

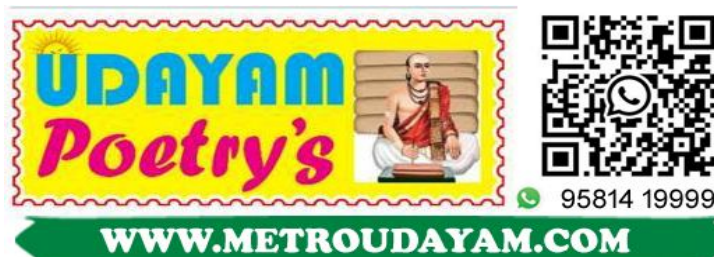


## Nupur Sanon's Wedding Dupatta Spoke Volumes About Love, Culture, and Belonging

Nurture the roots that give your soul its space.

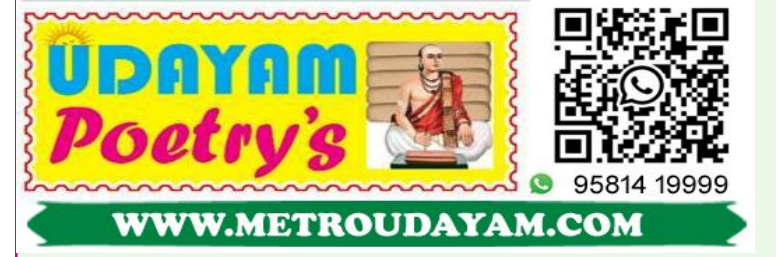
A loving hand, a listening ear, a gentle word,

## Law & order deteriorating in State, flays YSRCP

Visakhapatnam: Law and order have been deteriorating in Andhra Pradesh, pointed out YSRCP MLC Botcha Satyanarayana. Addressing the media in Visakhapatnam on Sunday, he said that the state was peaceful during YS Jagan Mohan Reddy's regime. Condemning the murder of YSRCP Dalit activist Manda Salman, Satyanarayana termed it as a heinous and undemocratic act. No section is happy under the coalition rule. Farmers, students

and women face several difficulties across the state," he mentioned. Satyanarayana criticised the coalition government for wiping away the festive mood from the people by hiking tariffs and burdening the common man. The MLC stated that ahead of the festival, liquor rates were increased, stamp duty was hiked. "There is no minimum support price for farmers for any crop and fee reimbursement dues have been mounting," he expressed concern. Underlining that the state government owes about Rs.5,600

crore towards fee reimbursement, Satyanarayana pointed out that farmers continue to suffer due to shortage of urea. What kind of assurance did the TDP give before elections and what sort of administration is implemented in the state now? With such atrocious governance, what kind of message does the state government intend to convey to the youth?" the MLC questioned. Even if the government failures were pointed out, Satyanarayana criticised that coalition leaders were not willing



to condemn them because they remain to be facts. Former IT Minister Gudivada Amarnath, YSRCP district president KK Raju, among others, were present.

**Transport Department stated that strict measures have been taken to prevent private buses from collecting excess fares.**



They said that for the past 8 days, along with RTGS monitoring, specially formed Fare Monitoring Teams have been continuously inspecting bus fares on all online booking platforms (Abhibus, Redbus and other apps). Whenever excess fares are detected, they are immediately coordinating with the concerned private bus owners and taking steps to reduce the fares at once.

For the convenience of passengers, a statewide 24x7 helpline number – 92816 07001 has been set up. They stated that officials will respond immediately to complaints regarding bus fares or other issues and provide instant solutions. Bus owners have been instructed to clearly display this helpline number in every private bus.

They also said that special teams have been formed with Motor Vehicle Inspectors to conduct field-level inspections. In the inspections conducted yesterday and today, one private bus collecting excess fares and another private bus operating without tax and permit were seized. Additionally, cases were registered against 42 other buses collecting excess fares, and a total fine of ₹22,000 was imposed.

Similarly, Transport Department officials stated that they created awareness on road safety and traffic rules among people who came to the RTA office for LLR, DL, and other services. As per the orders of the Transport Commissioner, they warned that strict legal action will be taken against private buses if they collect excess fares.

The officials stated that the main objective of the Andhra Pradesh Government is to provide safe, comfortable, and secure travel to the public, and that all necessary measures are being taken to ensure the welfare of passengers during the festival season.

## Union Minister calls for translation of lab discoveries into clinical practice

He added that institutions such as Regional Cancer Centres, medical colleges and community hospitals are now equipped to deliver state-of-the-art and complex treatments with compassion, sensitivity and high professional competence. Emphasising the role of radiation biology, the Union Minister said research in the field is central to modern cancer treatment. A deeper under-

standing of the body's response to radiation, minimising side effects and scientifically optimising radiation doses to improve patients' quality of life form the backbone of effective cancer therapy. Research in both basic and clinical radiation sciences, he added, directly strengthens the nation's healthcare mission.

Shekhawat described radiation as one of the most powerful tools in both diagnosis and treatment.

However, he said its true potential can only be realised through a comprehensive understanding of its cellular and systemic effects, ensuring safe, balanced and effective application.

Addressing young scientists, researchers and students, the Union Minister said their curiosity, dedication and collaborative spirit will shape the future of the field and elevate India's scientific identity globally.

He noted that modern science increasingly rewards those who transcend disciplinary boundaries -- physicists exploring biology, doctors embracing data and informatics, and biologists engaging closely with clinical realities.

He concluded by expressing confidence that such interdisciplinary approaches will drive innovation and lead to more patient-centric, impactful healthcare solutions in the years ahead.

## KTR blasts Revanth Reddy over flagpole remarks

Hyderabad: BRS party working president KTR launched a scathing attack on Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy. Questioning, "Are you a Chief Minister or a gang leader?", he lashed out, saying it is shameful that someone holding a constitutional position responsible for maintaining law and order is speaking in a way that encourages anti-social activities and crimes. ments. He criticised that Revanth Reddy, who has earned widespread public disapproval with his utterly failed governance in just two years, has completely lost his mind, and this was evident from Sunday's meeting.

He demanded, on behalf of the BRS party, that the police department and the DGP, who are quick to respond and make arrests even for a small post on social media, should take immediate action against the Chief Minister for these serious and violence-inciting remarks. KTR said that the real conspiracy behind the Congress Chief Minister singing the tune of the Telugu Desam Party has become clear to Telangana society today. He alleged that for the past two years, Revanth Reddy has been trampling on Telangana's water rights, causing irreparable damage to the state, acting on the orders of his former boss, and that his true nature has been exposed by his statement on Sunday. He criticised that realising the

Congress party is a sinking ship, Revanth Reddy is preparing to jump ship at any moment. KTR warned that unable to confront the BRS party politically, Revanth Reddy is making secret deals with the BJP on one hand, and on the other hand, he is plotting to bring back the TDP, which has been rejected by the people of Telangana, onto this land. He asserted that the four crore people of Telangana will definitely thwart this plan. He stated that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy will have to pay a heavy price for his covert politics that have pushed Telangana's interests, from water to funds and appointments, into the abyss, and for the betrayal he has committed against the state.
