



Telangana CM proposes WEF follow-up meet in Hyderabad



Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has proposed to host a follow-up meeting of the World Economic Forum (WEF) every July in Hyderabad. Hyderabad City GuideThe proposal received unanimous support from global business leaders and policy makers during the 'Join The Rise' event held in Davos, according to the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) here. Stating that one year is a very long time for follow-ups in modern business cycles and making investment decisions, the Chief Minister proposed to the WEF to organise another follow-up forum every year, in July or August, in Hyderabad. He added that the recent Telangana Rising Global Summit was very successful, attracting investments worth over Rs 5.75 lakh crore. "Normally, we come to Davos to sign MoUs, but this year, after the Global Business Summit's success, we are now focusing on presenting our vision and policies." Referring to the massive success of Telangana Rising Global Summit -- held at Bharat Future City -- in December 2025, the CM said Telangana now decided to talk to the WEF about hosting the follow-up Forum in Hyderabad. The event, which showcased the growth framework and the vision for 2047, saw the launch of Telangana AI Innovation Hub (TAIH) and Telangana Next-Gen Life Sciences Policy 2026-2030. The delegation, including ministers D. Sridhar Babu and Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, explained about the state's game-changer projects -- roads, Metro rail expansion, rejuvenation of river, lake and water bodies. They also mentioned the plans for new economic zones, building a new city, and a new manufacturing zone to become a China +1 alternative option. They explained that Telangana has unmatched investment potential and sought the support of global companies in technology, knowledge, experience and expertise. The Chief Minister informed the high-profile attendees that Hyderabad had grown into a global hub for Global Capability Centres (GCCs). He added that Hyderabad is being developed as India's first city to be operational 24 hours -- with a focus on the night-time economy on both sides of the River Musi. "We are building a new city -- totally smart, designed for the future, and India's answer to the best in the world. It is called Bharat Future City. In over 30,000 acres, with more than 50 per cent of the area left open as Green cover." Popular actor Chiranjeevi, who was also in attendance, stood as a special attraction during the dinner event.

CM Chandrababu Naidu continues Davos engagements on third day

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu continued his packed schedule at the World Economic Forum (WEF) in Davos, Switzerland, for the third consecutive day, holding high-level meetings with global industrialists and participating in key international sessions.

The Chief Minister held face-to-face discussions with leading business leaders and CEOs, focusing on investment opportunities and development plans in Andhra Pradesh. He also addressed a special session on industrial progress at the WEF Congress Centre, highlighting the state's vision for growth on a global platform.

As part of his engagements, Mr Naidu met Horisys Chairman Frank Richter and held discussions with Tamara Hospitality founder Srishti Shibulal, its Chief Operating Officer Kushbhu Awasthi, Kalibo AI Academy Chief Executive Officer Raj Vattikutty, and Scott Sandschafer. He also participated in several international discussions during the day.

The Chief Minister attended a session titled "Healing Planet Through Regenerative Food



Systems", organised by AP CNF, and took part in another discussion, "Trillion Dollar Pivot -- Rewriting Market Signals for Nature Positive Growth", which focused on sustainable development.

Mr Naidu delivered the keynote address at a Bloomberg-organised session titled "Trillions of Dollars -- AI Movement Transforming Global Economy", where he shared his views on artificial intelligence-driven economic transformation. He also participat-

ed in the "Building India Infrastructure" programme at the AP Lounge along with Union Ministers.

In addition, the Chief Minister attended a session on climate change and renewable development titled "Financing Regeneration -- Mobilising Capital". Throughout the third day of his Davos visit, Mr Naidu remained focused on attracting international investments and strengthening Andhra Pradesh's global economic partnerships.

YS Jagan announces he will do padayatra next year

YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) chief and former Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy has announced that he will begin his next padayatra after a year and a half. Heads of global election bodies convene in plenary at IICDEM-2026 in Delhi

New Delhi: Heads of 42 election management bodies from around the world participated in a high-level plenary session on Wednesday as part of the ongoing India International Conference on Democracy and Election Management (IICDEM) 2026 at Bharat Mandapam.

The priorities emphasise innovation in electoral practices, capacity building for election bodies, and fostering partnerships to tackle contemporary challenges.

Representatives from participating countries and election management bodies reciprocated by offering their perspectives on shared global concerns, including the impact of digital tools on electoral transparency, safeguarding voter rights in diverse contexts, and adapting to geopolitical shifts that influence democratic stability. The plenary highlighted India's growing role in leading global

dialogues on these matters, drawing on its vast experience in managing large-scale, diverse elections.

Organised by the India International Institute of Democracy and Election Management under the Election Commission of India, the conference continues to feature plenary and thematic sessions over the three-day event.

With participation from over 70 countries in various capacities, IICDEM-2026 stands as the largest such gathering hosted by India, promoting best practices, technological advancements, and mutual learning among electoral stakeholders worldwide.

The outcomes are expected to contribute to enhanced global standards and cooperation in safeguarding democratic processes.

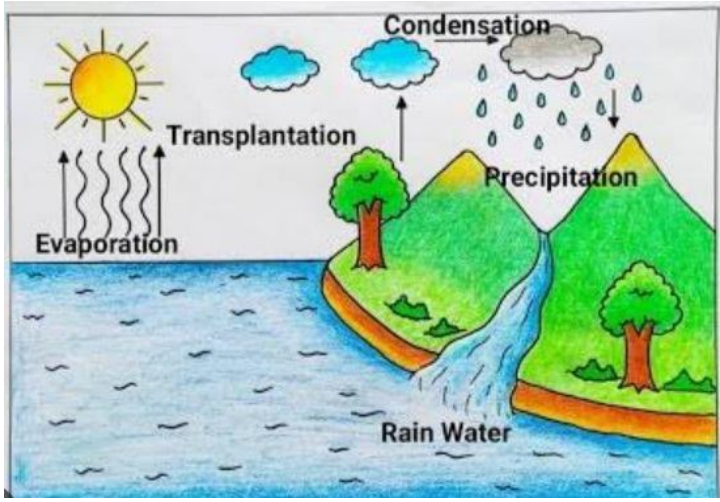
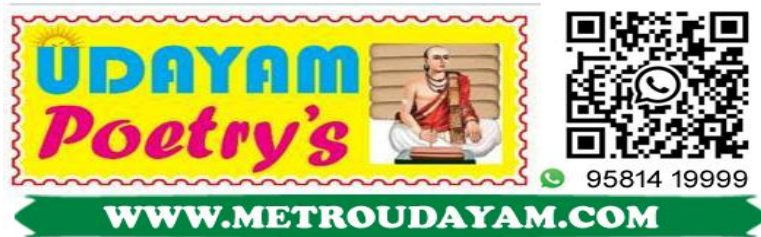

A dance of life, where all does begin.

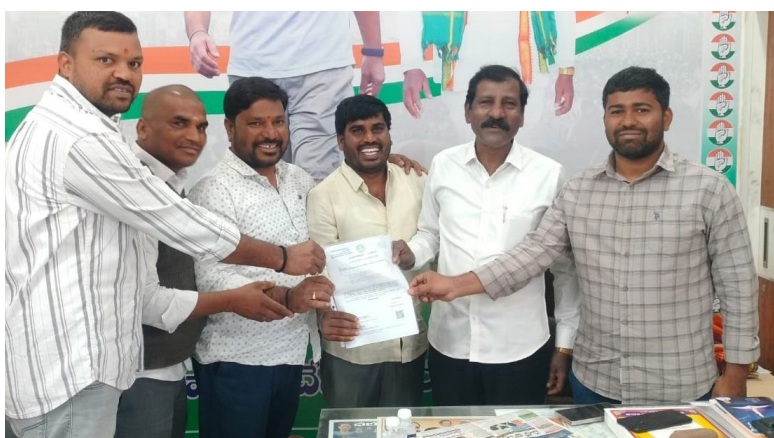
So let us cherish, this precious flow,

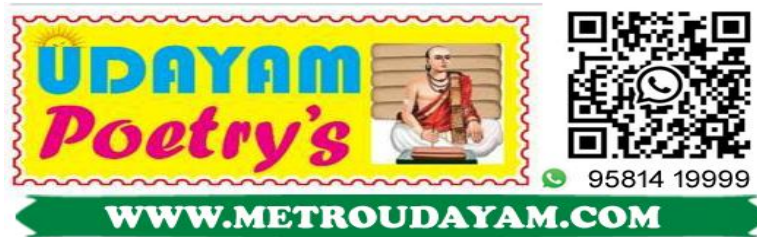


Bheem Bharat hands over an LOC for a Rs. 3 lakh proposal

Think a while is everything to be treated as useless?



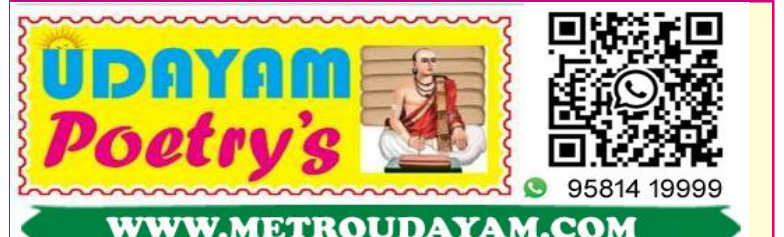

जब भी हम सच्चे धर्म के धर्म सिद्धांत और धर्मदेशों को पढ़ते हैं तो हमें कहीं भी मानव से मानव का किसी तरह का भेदभाव नजर नहीं आता। लेकिन पाश्चांडियों द्वारा विकृत किये गये धर्मदेशों में भेदभाव नजर आयेगा। और ऐसे ही विकृत सिद्धांतों को धर्म मानने वाले धर्म का विशेष करते नजर आयेगे।



सच्चा धर्म कभी भी अमानवीय कृत्यों का समर्थन नहीं करता। लेकिन व्यक्ति धर्म के नाम पर धर्म विशेषी काम करते रहता है। उसके धर्म विशेषी कार्य को सच्चे धर्म के कसौटी पर परखने की भी समझ ना रखने वाले लोग धोका खाकर धर्म के विशेष में खड़े हो जाते हैं।
