



India-EU Partnership Can Help Steady A Turbulent Global Order, Says PM Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said deeper cooperation between India and the European Union could play a stabilising role in an increasingly unsettled global environment, as the two sides announced the conclusion of a landmark Free Trade Agreement. Speaking at a joint press conference in New Delhi with European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen and European Council President Antonio Costa, the Prime Minister described January 27 as a historic moment that marks the beginning of a new phase of co-development between India and the EU. He said two major global powers were taking their



partnership forward into a new era built on shared goals and mutual growth. PM Modi noted that the agreement under discussion is among the largest free trade deals ever envisaged, covering all 27 mem-

ber states of the European Union. He said the FTA would boost investment, encourage new innovation-driven partnerships and strengthen global supply chains, adding that it goes beyond trade to serve as a

framework for shared prosperity.

The Prime Minister also highlighted progress on a new migration and mobility framework and said India and the EU had further reinforced their strategic relationship through a fresh defence and security agreement.

Emphasising the broader relationship, he said India-EU ties have advanced significantly in recent years, grounded in common democratic values, economic complementarity and strong people-to-people links. He added that nearly eight lakh Indians living across Europe play a key role in deepening bilateral engagement and strengthening the partnership.

Ex-Congress Leader Claims Rahul Gandhi Ordered Attacks On His Home After 'Darpok' Remark



Former Congress leader Shakeel Ahmad has claimed that Rahul Gandhi instructed party leaders to target his residences in Bihar after he publicly described the Leader of the Opposition as a 'darpok' (coward) and an insecure politician. Ahmad, a three-time MLA and two-term MP from Bihar, said he has been receiving threats since making his comments, which he insists were meant as constructive criticism of the party's leadership. Ahmad alleged that he was warned by party colleagues that directions had been issued to attack his homes in Patna and Madhubani on January 27, allegedly under the guise of burning his effigy. He also shared a screenshot of a WhatsApp message on social media, which he claimed urged Congress workers at the district and local levels to protest against him for his remarks on Rahul Gandhi. The controversy began after Ahmad, who quit the Congress following its poor performance in the Bihar elections last year, accused Rahul Gandhi of being dictatorial and promoting only those younger leaders who praise him, while sidelining senior leaders with public influence. Ahmad said his criticism stemmed from concern for the party's future and not personal animosity. He further accused Bihar Congress in-charge Krishna Allavaru of orchestrating the alleged threats and claimed that Allavaru mistreated him on Rahul Gandhi's instructions. The Congress leadership hit back strongly, with party leader Manickam Tagore branding Ahmad a "betrayal" and likening him to Jaichand, a historical figure associated with treachery. Responding to Tagore's remarks, Ahmad alleged that the attack on him was carried out under Rahul Gandhi's direction, dismissing it as an attempt to silence dissent within the party.

Anam inaugurates Temple Caravan Vehicle

Nellore : Endowments Minister Anam Ramanarayana Reddy has said that Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu is keen on developing temple tourism in the State. He inaugurated Temple Caravan Vehicle with facilities



designed by tourism department here on Monday. The Minister has said that the CM has appointed a 4-member sub-committee with Deputy Chief Minister K Pawan Kalyan, Tourism Minister Kandula Durgesh, R&B Minister BC Janardhan Reddy and himself to discuss the development of temple tourism and setting up Tourism Circuit and to give suggestions to the government. He said that it was proposed to arrange TCV in every district under Public Private Partnership model headed by tourism department. He said that one YV Srinivasa Reddy of Nellore city came forward to take up this project.

Bank Staff Strike for Five-Day Week in Vijayawada



Bank employees staged a one-day strike on Tuesday demanding the immediate implementation of a five-day work week, alleging that the government had failed to honour its promise made during the 12th wage revision. As part of the protest, employees gathered at Dharna Chowk in Vijayawada, where they raised slogans and called for swift action from the authorities. The protesters said bank staff play a vital role in implementing government welfare schemes and argued that their demands were both reasonable and long overdue.

'A journey that grounded me, connected me', Lokesh on 3-years of 'Yuva Galam' padayatra

Amaravati: Andhra Pradesh Minister and TDP General Secretary Nara Lokesh said on Tuesday that his 'Yuva Galam' padayatra was a journey that grounded him and connected him to the struggles of various sections of people.

On the third anniversary of his walkathon, the Minister for Human Resources Development and Information Technology took to X to share his thoughts.

Lokesh, who is the son of Chief Minister and Telugu Desam Party (TDP) President N. Chandrababu Naidu stated that his politics was shaped in the shadow of people's struggles and their aspirations.

"A journey that grounded me and connected me deeply to the struggles of farmers, women, youth, workers, teachers, students, entrepreneurs, weavers, senior citizens and the underprivileged across Andhra Pradesh. I thank every mother and sister for their blessings, and every citizen who spoke to me with honesty, hope and courage. My politics was shaped in the shadow of your struggles and aspirations," he said.

"I say this with conviction: every policy we draft, every decision we take, carries your



voices and your lives at its core. Three years on, I reiterate my vow - to be your soldier, your warrior, and to always stand on your side," Lokesh added. Meanwhile, addressing the workshop of the TDP parliamentary committees on Tuesday, Lokesh called for providing more opportunities to the youth in the party. He stated that the party should evolve with the changing times and provide opportunities to the young faces at all levels.

Lokesh said 83 per cent of the members in parliamentary committees have been

appointed for the first time. He said those who work with commitment have been accommodated in these panels.

He said Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu was running the government with a focus on both development and welfare. He asked the party cadres to take the government's schemes to the people.

It was on January 27, 2023, that Lokesh launched 'Yuva Galam (voice of youth)' padayatra, which covered over 3,000 kms and traversed nearly 100 Assembly constituencies.

The TDP termed it a defining moment in Andhra Pradesh's political and civic history and said it transformed public engagement, deepened democratic outreach, and strengthened people-centric governance.

The journey began from Kuppam in Chittoor district with blessings and public fervour, attracting thousands of supporters as Lokesh commenced the march with a simple yet profound pledge -- to walk alongside the people, listen to their struggles, and make their voices the foundation of policy and governance, said the TDP.

"Over 226 days, the Yuvagalam

Padayatra covered more than 3,100 kilometres, reaching 97 Assembly constituencies and interacting with citizens in every district -- from rural hamlets to urban centres. The effort yielded remarkable political resonance, with alliance candidates winning in 90 of the 97 constituencies where the Padayatra had traversed -- a strong indicator of the movement's deep connection with public sentiment," it said.

Throughout the journey, Lokesh walked an average of 10-12 kilometres daily, meeting farmers, workers, students, women's groups, entrepreneurs, and senior citizens -- listening earnestly to their challenges on employment, education, infrastructure, farming distress, water scarcity, and youth opportunities. Despite political and logistical challenges, including temporary interruptions, the Padayatra persevered and reaffirmed a clear message: effective leadership must originate from the ground, in constant dialogue with the people. It set a new standard for public engagement in Andhra Pradesh politics, revitalising community participation and inspiring youth leadership across the state.

The OC JAC (Other Castes Joint Action Committee) leaders have made it clear that they will not tolerate the false propaganda and conspiracies surrounding EWS (Economically Weaker Sections) reservations. They alleged that due to vote bank politics, the OC community is facing severe injustice in municipal ward reservations. National President Poladi Ramarao, National Chairman Nalla Sanjeev Reddy, State President Gopu Jaipal Reddy, and Working President Tadisetti Pashupati participated in the OC JAC state meeting held at the Basheerbagh Press Club on Tuesday and addressed the gathering. They stated that due to the lack of political reservations, OCs are being deprived of welfare schemes and political positions. They expressed



anguish that in the recent local elections, even in general constituencies, OC candidates could not stand against the financial and physical power of their opponents. They alleged that decisions have been made to suppress the OC community in the ward reservations for the upcoming municipal elections. They warned that if the unscientific reservations are not revised immediately, the government will have to face consequences in the municipal elections. They also demanded the establish-

ment of a special national commission for the effective implementation of the 10 percent EWS reservations, which are in effect constitutionally. They requested the governments to increase the age limit for EWS students in education and employment, fill the backlog posts immediately, and increase the income limit for the EWS certificate. They called for the success of the national-level mega protest of the OC (Other Castes) community to be held at Jantar Mantar in Delhi on February 23rd to

achieve these demands. The event was attended by the national president and national chairman of the Joint Action Committee (JAC), Poladi Ramarao and Nalla Sanjeev Reddy, state president Gopu Jaipal Reddy, working president Tadi Shetty Pashupati, along with leaders Danekula Rambabu, Lenkalapalli Somayya Gupta, Kolpur Ramesh, Nacham Prabhakar Mahesh, and the state and various district presidents and secretaries of the OC JAC. -----

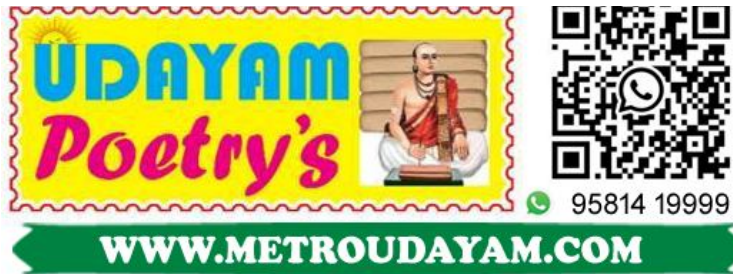
Secretariat Sports Meet – 2026 Grandly Inaugurated

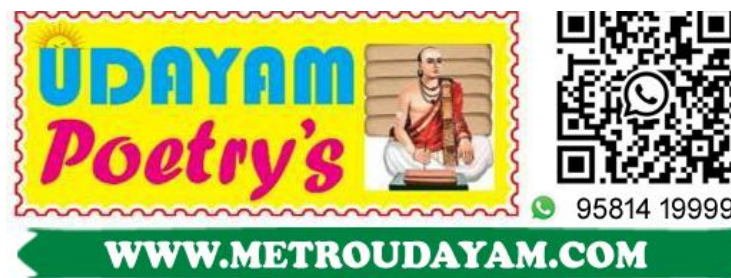

Rare brain surgery successfully performed at Nellore Narayana Hospital

Nellore: Doctor sat Narayana Hospital successfully performed brain surgery on an 11-year-old boy, Revanth from Vijayawada, who was suffering from a severe neurological disease, Rasmussen's Encephalitis.

Briefing the media here on Saturday, senior consultant neurosurgeon Dr NA Saikiran and head of neurology department Dr NS Sampath Kumar said, the boy was suffering from Rasmussen's Encephalitis, experiencing 10 to 20 seizures a day. “We removed the affected part of the brain through an advanced surgical procedure, ‘Vertical Hemispherectomy’ to prevent the spread of seizures. After the surgery, the boy is normal and free from seizures,” they added.

They said that the hospital has state-of-the-art equipment necessary for the surgery, including 32-channel video EEG, 3 Tesla MRI, Neuro Physiological Monitor, 400wt Lamp, 3 High-end Operative Microscopes, and a Neuro Navigation System. The hospital is providing these expensive treatments free of charge through insurance, EHS, and Aarogyasri schemes, with the support of Narayana Hospital management and the government.

Additional Medical Superintendent Dr Ravulapalli Harish, Neuro Anesthetist Dr Brunda, and Hospital AGM AC Shekhar Reddy were present.

TDP Begins Training for Parliamentary Committees at NTR Bhavan



Training sessions for the Telugu Desam Party's parliamentary committees commenced on Tuesday at the party's central office, NTR Bhavan, in Hyderabad.

Aus Open: Yuki-Goransson bow out in men's doubles third round, Indian challenge ends

Melbourne: India's top-ranked men's doubles tennis player Yuki Bhambri and his Swedish partner Andre Goransson crashed out of the Australian Open after losing to the Brazilian pair of Orlando Luz and Rafael Matos in the third round here on Monday.

Luz and Matos won the first set despite winning a lower number of points than Bhambri/Goransson by raising their game during crucial points in the set. The Brazilians edged Bhambri-Goransson in the short rallies (19-16), committing fewer errors (-3) to secure the 7-6 (9-7), 6-3 win.

Despite showing resilience in the opening-set tiebreak—saving three set points from 3-6 and even earning one at 7-6. Just when the momentum seemed to be swinging their way, they dropped the next three points to surrender the set.

Momentum slipped away in the second set after a crucial turning point. Serving at 3-2 with a break and holding two game points at 40-15, Goransson hit back-to-back double faults, handing the break back to the Brazilians. From there, Luz and Matos tightened their grip on the match, seeing out a straight-sets victory.

With Bhambri's men's doubles loss, India's campaign at the season's first ended, as he was the only Indian left in contention after Paris 2024 Olympian Sriram Balaji's run in the men's doubles ended after he and Austrian partner Neil Oberleitner went down 7-5, 6-1 to fourth seeds Marcelo Arevalo of El Salvador and Croatia's Mate Pavic in the second round on Saturday.

This was Bhambri's third round of the men's doubles at Melbourne Park for the first time since 2014, when he partnered New Zealand's Michael Venus. His best showing at a Grand Slam came last year, when the pair made a run to the semi-finals at the US Open.

Bhambri also partnered with the 2018 Wimbledon champion, Nicole Melichar-Martinez of America, in the mixed doubles event, but the duo lost to sixth-seeded Zhang Shuai of China and Germany's Tim Putz in the opening round in straight sets.

India's oil & gas sector offers investment opportunities worth 500 billion dollars: PM Modi

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said that India's energy sector offers investment opportunities worth 500 billion dollars as he urged global oil and gas majors to "Make in India, Innovate in India, Scale with India, Invest in India."

Addressing the India Energy Week 2026, via video conferencing, being attended by representatives from nearly 125 countries in Goa, PM Modi said that the country's energy sector has vast investment opportunities across different areas of the energy value chain.

He highlighted that India has significantly opened up its exploration sector and referred to the deep-sea exploration initiative known as the Samudra Manthan Mission. By the end of this decade, India aims to raise investments in the oil and gas sector to 100 billion dollars, with a target of expanding the scope of exploration to one million square km. More than 170 exploration blocks have already been awarded, and the Andaman and Nicobar basin "is emerging as the next hydrocar-



bon hope," PM Modi said.

Sense of pride from the announcement to effective implementation of UCC – CM Dhami Underlining that several reforms have been undertaken in the exploration sector, including reducing the no-go areas, the Prime Minister added that suggestions received during previous editions of India Energy Week have been incorporated

into changes in Acts and Rules. He affirmed that companies investing in the exploration sector are certain to see increased profitability. PM Modi further stated that India possesses a very large refining capacity and currently ranks second in the world, and is poised to become the number one country globally in refining capacity. The country's present refining capacity stands at around 260 million metric tonnes

(MMT) per annum, and continuous efforts are underway to raise it beyond 300 MMT per annum, he added.

Highlighting that LNG demand in India is continuously rising, and the country has set a target to meet 15 per cent of its total energy demand through LNG, the Prime Minister emphasised the need to work across the entire LNG value chain and noted that India is undertaking large-scale efforts in transportation. India is working to build the vessels required for LNG transportation domestically, supported by a recently launched ship-building program worth Rs 70,000 crore. Numerous investment opportunities have also been created in constructing LNG terminals at Indian ports, as well as in regasification projects, he added. The Prime Minister stressed that India requires a vast pipeline network for LNG transportation, where significant investments have already been made, but large-scale opportunities still remain. He pointed out that city gas distribution networks have already reached many Indian cities and are rapidly expanding

to others, making this sector highly attractive for investment.

PM Modi observed that with India's large population and steadily growing economy, the demand for petrochemical products will continue to rise, necessitating extensive energy infrastructure. He affirmed that investment in this area will yield substantial growth and added that there are also abundant opportunities in downstream activities for investors.

"Today's India is riding on the Reforms Express and undertaking rapid reforms across every sector", PM Modi remarked.

He emphasised that reforms are being carried out to strengthen domestic hydrocarbons while creating a transparent and investor-friendly environment for global collaborations. India is developing an energy sector ecosystem capable of meeting local demand and, through affordable refining and transportation solutions, making exports highly competitive for the world, he added.

Disabled Army Veteran Alleges Harassment At Karnataka Toll Plaza; NHAI Issues Clarification



A disabled Army veteran who lost both legs during service has alleged harassment by toll plaza staff in Karnataka, prompting a response from the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI). The issue came into focus after a video of the former commando in a wheelchair went viral on social media, sparking widespread debate.

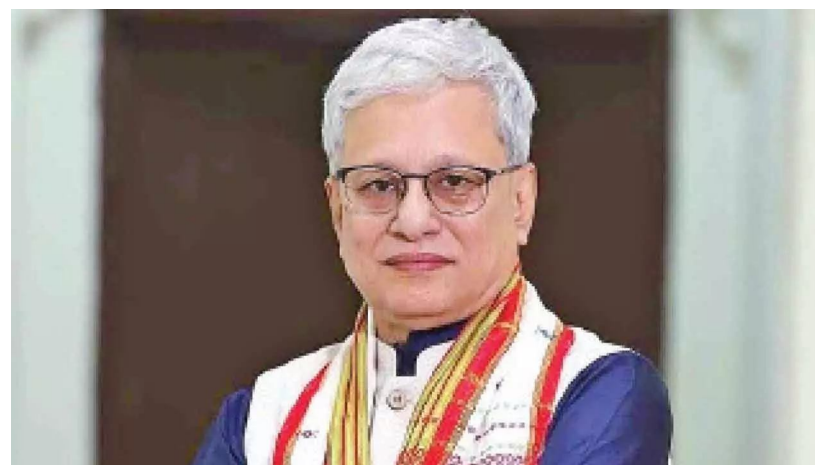
The ex-serviceman, Shyamaraj, who was part of the elite 21 Para unit and sustained his injuries during Operation Parakram, said he was stopped at the Sasthan toll plaza near Udupi and asked to pay the toll fee despite claiming eligibility for exemption. In the video, he questioned why his sacrifice was being disregarded and said that toll staff refused to honour his request even after he produced documents related to his military service. Shyamaraj alleged that while other toll plazas had allowed him to pass without payment, two employees at this particular toll gate insisted on charging him. He also sought clarification from Union Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari over what he described as unfair treatment. The toll plaza staff, however, denied any wrongdoing and maintained that they acted strictly according to existing rules.

Responding to the controversy, the NHAI issued a statement clarifying that toll fee exemptions are available only to serving Army personnel travelling on official duty. It added that there is no provision under current rules for toll exemption for ex-Army personnel, and that the documents submitted in this case did not meet the prescribed criteria for exemption.

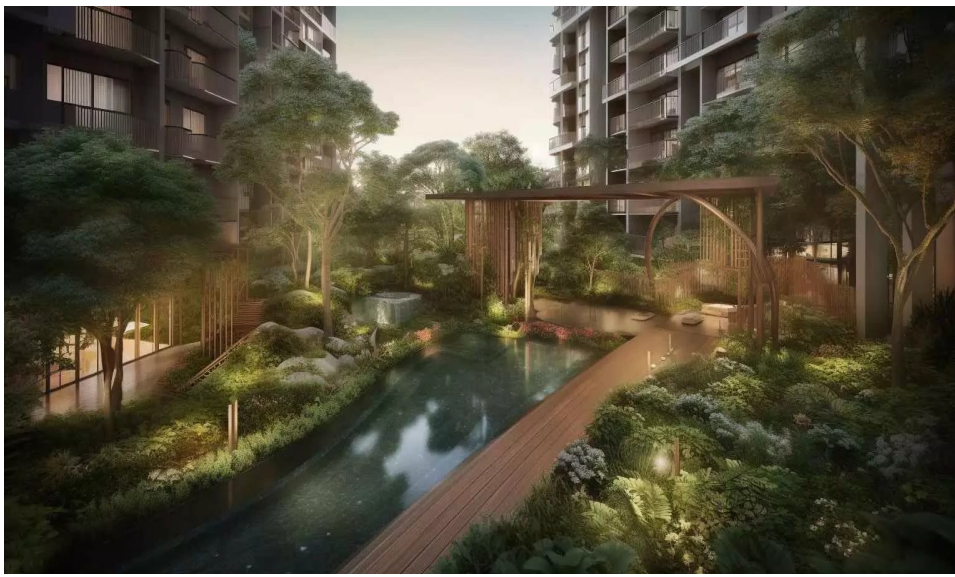

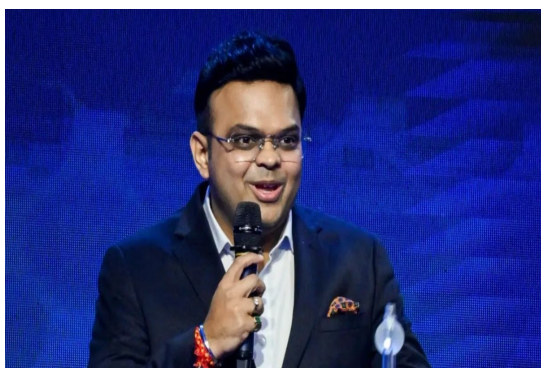

ICC Clarifies Reasons Behind T20 World Cup Accreditation Denial for Bangladesh Journalists



Bangladesh Cricket and the International Cricket Council (ICC)'s relationship took another hit after more than a hundred journalists from the country were ICC accreditation denial for T20 World Cup 2026. The decision by the game's governing body comes after Bangladesh was officially replaced by Scotland for the biennial tournament, following their refusal to travel to India for their group games. Bangladesh cited security reasons for wanting to play all their games in a neutral venue like Sri Lanka, however the ICC rejected the threats via their independent unit. NDTV also interviewed Rana Abbas, the Sports Editor of Bangladesh media publication Aajker Patrika over the accreditation fiasco. Abbas called the move "extremely sad". "This sort of thing has never happened before in Bangladesh. Bangladeshi journalists have been reporting ICC events since before Bangladesh played in their first World Cup in 1999... Even India-Pakistan matches have been covered by Bangladeshi journalists when they were hosted in India. Never have all correspondents been turned down like this before. I can't recall any incident like this at any ICC event," he told NDTV. "I would say this is extremely sad. Journalists from countries that don't even participate in global sporting events are still usually looked after – FIFA is one example that springs to mind. I feel this whole debacle could set a really nasty precedent and may even impact journalists attending matches in Sri Lanka."

India, EU FTA brings big relief on car tariffs as import duties reduced to 10 pc from 110 pc

New Delhi: India and the European Union on Tuesday concluded a long-awaited Free Trade Agreement (FTA), bringing tariffs on European cars entering India to 10 per cent from the current high level of 110 per cent.

This lower duty will apply under an annual quota of 250,000 vehicles. At present, India charges a 70 per cent duty on imported passenger cars priced below \$40,000, while vehicles costing more than \$40,000 attract an effective customs duty of 110 per cent. The move opens up new opportunities for European carmakers in the Indian market, which is currently the world's third-largest by sales. With India's car market expected to grow to around six million units a year by 2030, several European companies are preparing fresh investments.



Renault is returning to India with a new business strategy, aiming to expand beyond Europe where Chinese carmakers are gaining ground. Meanwhile, Volkswagen Group is also finalising its next phase of investment in India through its Skoda brand.

Beyond automobiles, the trade agreement will lower or remove tariffs on more than 90 per cent of European goods exported to India.

This includes major reductions in duties on machinery, which currently face tariffs of up to 44 per cent, chemicals with duties

of around 22 per cent, and pharmaceuticals taxed at about 11 per cent. Most of these charges will be gradually phased out.

The deal will also bring changes in other sectors. Import duties on European beer will be reduced to 50 per cent, while tariffs on chemicals, aircraft and spacecraft will be eliminated for almost all products.

According to the European Union, the agreement could help double EU exports to India by 2032 and lead to annual duty savings of up to four billion euros on European goods.

In addition to the trade pact, leaders at the India-EU Summit also launched a new EU-India Security and Defence Partnership, signaling deeper cooperation beyond economics.

IND vs NZ: Shreyas to continue as Varma's replacement for remaining two T20Is

Mumbai: Shreyas Iyer, a temporary pick for the ongoing T20 series against New Zealand due to Tilak Varma's fitness problems, has been kept in the squad for the remaining matches.

he will accompany the team to Visakhapatnam and later to Thiruvananthapuram for the final two games of the five-match series.

Iyer was named as a replacement for Tilak for the first three matches, but the youngster won't be returning for this series now. The 23-year-old needed surgery in Rajkot earlier this month during a Vijay Hazare match. He is currently at the Centre of Excellence in Bengaluru, has begun rehab, and will join the squad in



Mumbai for the T20 World Cup, starting on February 7, once he is fully fit.

"India batter Tilak Varma has resumed physical training and is making steady progress with his rehabilitation at the BCCI

Centre of Excellence. However, he will require additional time to regain full match fitness and will not be available for the final two T20Is of the ongoing five-match T20I series," the BCCI said in a statement.

"Tilak will link up with the squad in

Mumbai once he has regained full match fitness on 3rd February, ahead of India's warm-up match for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2026. The Men's Selection Committee has recommended

that Shreyas Iyer will continue as Tilak Varma's replacement for the remaining matches," the statement further read.

Iyer, the vice-captain in ODIs, has not secured a spot in the playing XI for the current series, which India won by taking an unassailable 3-0 lead on Sunday. He has not appeared in a T20I since December 2023.

Zero tolerance for crimes against women: Majhi

Cuttack: Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Monday asserted that the State government has zero tolerance for crimes against women and that all accused have been arrested and put behind bars. "Regardless of political affiliation, caste, religion, or colour, for me, a person who commits violence against women has only one identity and one address -- jail," he said.

The Chief Minister said that women are half of the population and the State cannot progress unless there is welfare of women. "Our government has also given high priority to women's safety along with their dignity," he said. The Chief Minister pointed out that the rate of conviction in crimes against women was 9.2 per cent in 2022 and it further decreased to 6.9 per cent in 2023.

"However, today, it is a matter of some satisfaction for me that in the first six months of 2025, the conviction rate has reached 41 per cent. In June, it was more than 62 per cent," he said.

The State Election Commission (SEC) is set to announce the election schedule for seven municipal corporations and 116 municipalities in Telangana on Tuesday evening.

In line with the state government's directive to complete the election process before February 15, district collectors have indicated that February 11 would be a suitable date for polling. If polling is held on that day, counting of votes is expected to be completed by February 13.

Anticipating the release of the election schedule, ministers, MLAs and other public representatives across the state have already completed inaugurations and foundation stone-laying ceremonies for development works. The distribution of sarees and

interest-free loans has also been concluded.

"Digital India has expanded a new economy. In many fields such as animation and digital media, India is becoming a global hub," PM Modi noted.

"India's creator economy is growing at a very fast pace, and in this too, youth are getting new opportunities," PM Modi explained.

The Prime Minister also highlighted that unprecedented investments in modern infrastructure over the past few years have significantly boosted employment in sectors linked to construction and development.

"Large-scale infrastructure projects have generated jobs across various levels, contributing to overall economic growth," Prime Minister added.

Prime Minister Modi further pointed out that India's start-up ecosystem is expanding at a fast pace.

"At present, there are around two lakh registered start-ups in the country, employing more than 21 lakh youth," PM Modi said.

"This growth reflects the rising entrepreneurial spirit among young Indians and the supportive policy environment created by the government," the Prime Minister added.

Colombo: Sri Lanka's women's team is set to travel to the West Indies for a six-match white-ball tour spanning late February to early March. The itinerary features three One-Day Internationals and three T20 Internationals, scheduled between February 20 and March 3. All fixtures will take place at the Grenada National Stadium in Grenada. The ODI leg begins on February 20, with the remaining matches on February 22 and 25. Attention then shifts to the T20Is, starting on February 28, followed by games on March 1 and 3.

The T20I contests carry added significance,



as both sides step up their preparations for the 2026 Women's T20 World Cup, to be held in the UK later this year.

The West Indies and Sri Lanka are grouped together in Group 2, alongside England, New Zealand, and two teams yet to qualify.

"The Sri Lanka National Women's Team will tour the West Indies during February–March 2026 to play a three-match ODI series and a three-match T20I series. The tour will begin with the ODI series, followed by the T20I series, which will be played in Grenada," the SLC said in their official statement.

Sri Lanka will be eager to end a T20I series drought that stretches back to their Asia Cup success in 2024. Meanwhile, the West Indies enter the series with

strong home form, having secured T20I series victories against Bangladesh and South Africa in their most recent outings.

The two teams last met in the Caribbean in 2024, when Sri Lanka dominated the ODI series with a 3–0 sweep, while West Indies responded by winning the T20I series 2–1.

Sri Lanka are currently the sixth-ranked ODI team in the Women's Rankings, with the West Indies in ninth. In the T20I Rankings, the Windies occupy sixth place, while the Lankans are placed seventh.

Gukesh bounces back, beats Fedoseev



Wijk Aan Zee (The Netherlands): World Champion D Gukesh bounced back after two back-to-back losses and put it across Vladimir Fedoseev of Slovenia in the eighth round of the Tata Steel Masters here Monday. Gukesh won handsomely with black pieces which should do a world of good to his confidence. The Indian ace had been playing well till the first rest day and then lost two games in a row and finally pulled one back. It was a picturesque finish when Gukesh put his rook en prise and finished the game in 41 moves. On a day when Arjun Erigaisi survived a difficult position against compatriot Aravindh Chithambaram and settled for a draw, R Praggnanandhaa escaped in a pawn down endgame to hold youngster Yagiz Kaan Erdogmus of Turkey. Meanwhile, local favourite Anish Giri threw the tournament open with a fine victory against overnight leader Nodirbek Abdusattorov of Uzbekistan. Abdusattorov remained in sole lead on 5.5 points despite the loss as his nearest rival and compatriot Javokhir Sindarov was held to a draw by Vincent Keymer of Germany. With just five rounds to come now, Abdusattorov on 5.5 is still at the top pursued closely by Sindarov a half point behind.

Close behind now and hoping for a few victories is Gukesh on four points with Giri, Fedoseev, Keymer and Matthias Bluebaum of Germany all having still chances to topple the players ahead of them. Erigaisi is next in contention on 3.5 points after drawing Chithambaram while Praggnanandhaa still needs to win his first game, a rare sight in any tournament that he played in the last few years.

Surya is a big player who has done well for India consistently, says Rohit

Rohit Sharma, who led India to 2024 Men's T20 World Cup triumph, praised current skipper Suryakumar Yadav's impact on the national side, calling him a big player who has done consistently well for the team.

Suryakumar reached his first fifty in the format after 468 days and 23 innings by hitting an unbeaten 82, laced with nine fours and four sixes in India's seven-wicket win over New Zealand in Raipur.

With the Men's T20 World Cup set to begin on February 7, Suryakumar returning back to form after a horrid 2025 augurs well for India in their quest to defend the title on home soil.

"A captain in form makes a big difference. But I see it differently. It's not just about the captain. If a key player like Surya is out of form, you lose out on one of your 7-8 batters. That weakens the whole lineup. Surya is a big player who has done well for India consistently. If his performance drops, it hurts the team."

"This isn't about the individual; it's about the batting order. Surya bats at a high strike rate and plays unorthodox shots that disrupt plans of the opposition. He hits balls in unexpected places and plays shots that others can't."



"That puts pressure on the bowler, making them think, 'What do I do now?'. How can I tackle him?' When a player like Surya is in form, it makes the whole team stronger, not just because of his confidence, but because of what he brings to the game," said Rohit on JioHotstar.

Rohit has been teammates with Suryakumar in India T20I team, as well as in IPL and domestic cricket. He explained the innate intelligence Suryakumar has in terms of reading the game.

"Suryakumar Yadav understands the game very well. We played a lot of IPL matches together. Whenever I talked to him about different situations,

his responses always made sense. I judge people like that. I don't expect them to say what I think, but their answer should make sense."

"With Surya, it always does. He has great understanding and knows how to get the best from players around him. In the T20 World Cup, there will be tricky moments where we must be careful. It will be a test, but all these guys have played high-pressure games before. They should be able to handle it," he added.

Rohit further lauded Abhishek Sharma's calculated and impactful batting approach, which has been central to India getting great starts in power-play. "I like how

Abhishek Sharma is batting. He doesn't just swing hard; his approach is smart and calculated. He plays shots all around, from extra cover to mid-wicket."

"He's a 180-degree batter who can clear fine leg if you bowl at his body. He's become a very good player, scoring quickly and consistently. For an opener, impact matters more than just runs."

"Giving your team 50-60 runs in the first few overs does half the job; it lets others build on it. To take on bowlers, you have to do your homework and practice those shots in the nets every day. It's that simple," he concluded.

She's been the best batter, quite fitting she got the first one: Hayley on Sciver-Brunt's WPL ton

New Delhi: Mumbai Indians all-rounder Hayley Matthews commended her teammate Nat Sciver-Brunt after the England captain became the first-ever cricketer to score a century in the Women's Premier League (WPL), achieving the feat on Monday against the Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB). The 131-run stand between Matthews and Sciver laid the platform for MI to finish with a strong total of 199. The Caribbean all-rounder arrived at this year's WPL with the business end of the tournament approaching and is peaking at the right time.

MI delivered a commanding performance. In a crucial match, their senior players stepped up and performed when it mattered most. Sciver-Brunt set a new record with the first WPL century, while Matthews and Shabnim Ismail tore through the RCB top order, taking the first five wickets and securing a 15-run win. RCB struggled early after an aggressive bowling spell, and the chase quickly fell apart in the powerplay as they lost half their team. Richa Ghosh, Nadine de Klerk, and Arundhati Reddy



fought back, with the wicket-keeper-batter scoring 35 runs in the last two overs, but the target was too high to reach.

"It was definitely nice to watch from the other end when she was going four after four after four. I do love batting with her. We flow off each other really well. For her to get the hundred today was quite deserving. With all the innings she has played, not only this year but over the last four years. She has probably been the best batter in this tournament. In my opinion, quite fitting that she was able to get the first one," Matthews said in the post-match press conference.

Matthews herself is finding form at a crucial stage of the tournament. Returning from injury and a period away from the game, the Caribbean all-rounder admitted the early part of the season tested her patience.

"Coming back from injury, being away from the game for a while, I really had to get back into things. In the first three games with the bat, I felt I was in a good place but wasn't getting the results I wanted to. So yeah, it was just about keeping the confidence high, knowing that it will come eventually. Really happy to contribute with the bat today," she said.

The understanding between Matthews and Sciver-Brunt at the crease was evident, with both players complementing each other's strengths and matchups against the RCB bowling attack.

"I think we have a really good relationship at the crease. She flows really well and it helps me flow really well too. We are two really experienced players and I feel we certainly compliment each other at the crease really well. Some of the bowlers who aren't my matchups are hers (to

take down) and some of the bowlers that might be hers, I like to go after. We were able to have some really good conversations and think of exactly what we wanted to do and figure out best plans to maximize," Matthews explained.

Mumbai's approach in the powerplay was measured rather than explosive, shaped by their reading of the conditions at the venue.

"If you looked at the first few matches in this venue specifically, the first six to eight overs have been pretty hard to bat and the conditions have been a bit different," Matthews said. "We knew if we gave ourselves a chance to get set and get settled early on, when the wicket gets better, we would be able to accelerate especially keeping wickets in hand with Harry (Harmanpreet Kaur) in the death overs."

She added that avoiding early damage was a key priority. "We didn't want another powerplay where we were two down and had them in really early. It gave me opportunities to get in and get settled with Nat. And then we were both able to get going at the same time."

Once the platform was set, the pair shifted gears with clear intent. "For us, it is more about picking overs we want to go at, or picking areas where we want to score. Focussing a lot on what we can do basis the ball more than thinking about the score we need," Matthews said. "Once we got to that ten-over mark with wickets in hand, we knew it would have been a great opportunity to push the run-rate up some more."

With the ball, MI were just as ruthless. Matthews and Shabnim Ismail ripped through the RCB top order, reducing the chase to rubble inside the powerplay by taking the first five wickets. Although Richa Ghosh, Nadine de Klerk and Arundhati Reddy mounted a late counterattack — Ghosh scoring 35 runs across the final two overs — the target proved too steep.

In a high-stakes contest, Mumbai Indians' experience and composure stood out. At the heart of it was a historic hundred from Sciver-Brunt, fittingly applauded by a teammate who believes no one was more deserving of the moment.
